Brest, France, Feb. 15.—President Wilson sailed for the United States aboard the George Washington at 11:15 this morning. Mr. Wilson is being accompanied by the presidential party who came to Europe with him.

HERE TO CONTRACT FOR ROAD WORK

The commissioners court was in session Saturday to receive bids for building ten miles of road between Ballinger and Rowena, which will be the first strip of the Central Texas Highway built through this county. Up to Friday night no bids had been filed in response to advertisements placed in papers by the court, but two contractors arrived here Saturday to submit their bids in person and figure with the court.

The road work to be contracted for must be done according to plans drawn by an engineer and approved by the state highway department. The contractors will be under bond to do the work as called for in the plans and specifications, and when completed the work will give a sample of what road building is supposed to be in the future. County, state and federal money will pay for the road building.

BOY CARRIED TO THE REFORMATORY

REVOLUTION RAGING IN ROUMANIA

Copenhagen, Feb. 15.—A state of seige has been proclaimed in Buchrest where the Roumanian anti-monarchical revolution centers according to dispatches received here.

A new plot against King Ferdinand and Crown Prince Carol is said to have been discovered, and the royal family has fled to places of safety.

Lisbon, Feb. 15.—A republic has been restored in Northern Portugal and Piava Conceire, the leader of the Monarchists, has been arrested, it is officially announced.

WOMAN PASSES BAD CHECKS AT ABILENE

The sheriff's department brought to Abilene Wednesday night a woman against whom complaint has been filed charging the passing of worthless checks. The alleged imposition on a local merchant was transacted several days ago and the suspect was taken into custody in Pecos county following information given officers there by the sheriff's department of Taylor county.

It is stated that a number of other bad checks have recently been passed in this city and the parties perpetrating the funds are being spotted and will be apprehended shortly. Sheriff Bond is working on a number of cases at the present time.—Abilene Reporter.

WORKERS WALK OUT IN BERLIN

Copenhagen, Feb. 15.—Rioting is raging today among the strikers in Berlin where more than forty thousand warehouse workers are out on a strike. It is reported that other workers are walking out in sympathy with the warehouse strikers. Many lines of business have been forced to close.

TO RID U. S. OF ALIEN ENEMIES

Austin, Feb. 15.—The House passed a resolution today urging Texas Senators and congressmen to support the recommendations of attorney Gregory to give the government authority to deal with and deport all undesirable aliens. The growth of the bolsheviki element in this country makes it important that all aliens of undesirable sentiment be returned to their native lands.

ANGELO PEOPLE AFTER LIGHT PLANT

The citizens of San Angelo held a mass meeting Friday night to discuss plans and take steps for installing a municipal power and water plant for that city. A citizens committee recently made a report, after an investigation, and recommended that no time be lost in making a change in the city's light and water service.

High rates seems to be the principle grievance of the San Angelo water and light consumers. Ballinger people are not complaining about the rates, they seem to be satisfied and willing to pay any old price, if they can get the service. Service to what we want.

Ballinger owns her water system and it is a paying proposition, and no complaint against the rates. Ballinger people also voted for a municipal power plant before the plant was moved away from here and the city put on a high line, but the vote of the people was disregarded by the city officials and the right to string a high line into the city granted to Northern capitalists, without price or consideration. The county granted the company the right to string the line from San Angelo to Winters for the same price the city charged for its franchise.

If Brown county had eradicated the cattle tick when Runnels county did, there would be no ticks in that county now, and the stockmen and farmers would have stopped a loss to livestock will tell you that the tick fering. Runnels county is free from ticks, and any stockman or farmer who has a few head of stock will tell you that the tick is out to stay out. It cost considerable to exterminate the blood sucking pests, but they have been exterminated and the man who attempts to bring ticky cattle into this county finds himself facing the strong arm of the law. One man plead guilty to the charge and "kicked in" to the tune of about \$150 last week. Tick eradication is the same and profitable thing for every county to do. Why feed the ticks when feed is so high?

A SQUARE DEAL

We note from some of our exchanges that they too have been ridden with free advertisement until they have a sore spot on their backs, and give notice that the lid is on.

It seems that everybody that helped in war work drew pay for the job except the newspaper guy. 

HIGHER COURT SAYS CITY DON'T OWE DEBT

Judge A. K. Doss, city attorney, received notice Friday that the case of the Good Roads Machinery Co., vs. the City of Ballinger, which was on appeal in the Court of Civil Appeals, had been passed on by that court and the ruling of the lower court affirmed.

This is a case in which the Good Roads Machinery Co., brought suit against Ballinger to collect a debt—the purchase price of about \$5000 worth of street machinery, which has long since been discarded, the city having worn the machinery out.

The case was tried before Judge Goodwin, who held that the city aldermen contracted the debt and acted without authority and that the debt was illegally by the aldermen purchasing the machinery on a credit without making any provisions to pay for same.

In contesting the case the city entered a general demurrer, admitting all facts set out in the petition of the plaintiff, admitting that the old city council bought the machinery, issued time warrants for same, etc., but placed that they acted without authority in the sight of the law and that the debt was illegal and could not be collected.

The court so ruled. Thus the city has taken advantage of the law in paying for machinery purchased, and used for ten or fifteen years, and a good part of which is now side tracked in the Johnson pasture one mile north of the city.
