WE HAVE JUST been made aware of a problem which is being faced by facets of our educational system, dealing with the current "education reform," brought about by H. Ross Perot, the self-styled "know it all" as regards to Texas public schools.

A move is underway to abolish all vocational and cooperative school classes. This would include such courses as vocational agriculture, the home economics program, distributive education and cooperative trades classes.

Perot has decided in his infinite wisdom, that such programs are the "cancer on the face of education." Personally, we think he's just slightly off track. Mr. Perot himself may be the cancer which is about to destroy the school system as we know it.

This sort of thing is what happens anytime there is a movement--in this case a select committee appointed--in the name of reform. It seldom ever fails in such a movement, that the dogooders want to throw the baby out the door with the wash water.

Unless the residents of our state stand firm, a number of programs which have made school considerably more meaningful for millions of students, will be things of the past.

These experts may not realize it, but a large percentage of school children have been kept in school by such programs as vocational agriculture and the trades classes. Not every student who begins in first grade wants, or needs, the college preparatory training which Perot seems to think is all that matters.

Maybe Mr. Perot has never had to try to find a good plumber, or a mechanic (folks in his income category just buy a new car, or a house, evidently, instead of making the necessary repairs, or wondering if we are training people for the various trades in our public schools.

It's a dangerous situation when you allow a man, a committee, or a state legislature, to move onto our public school system with a wrecking crew, complete with demolition equipment, when perhaps only a few minor repairs was what the system needed.

Some of the programs listed have been advised that their area supervisors will not have their jobs by the time another school year rolls around.

This would indicate that the "powers that be," intend to eliminate the programs by cutting of their supervision, allowing them just to die on the vine.

If you agree that vocational classes are important, then it behooves you to contact your elected officials as quickly as possible, before more damage is done to our school system.

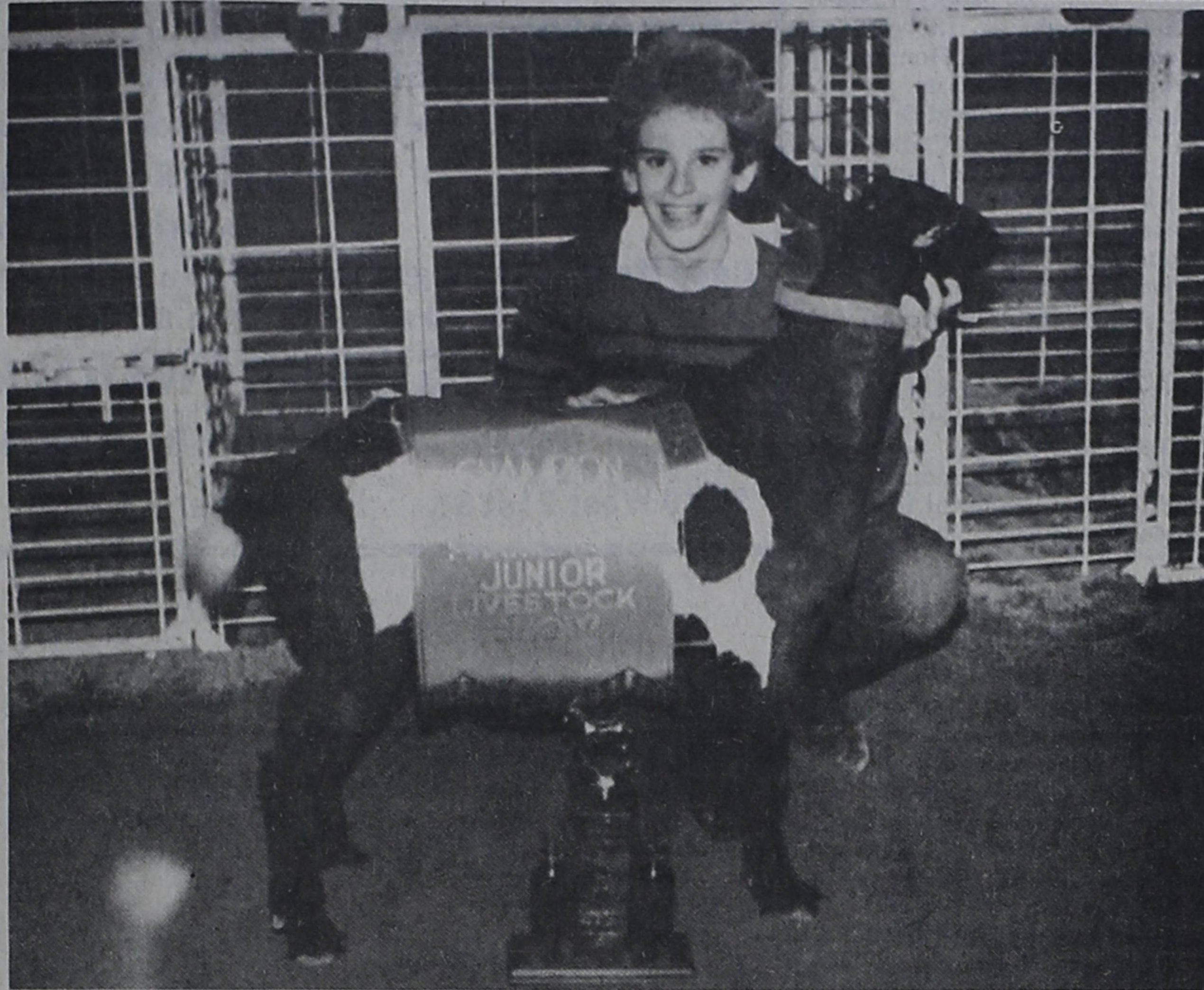
HOW MANY TIMES have we stated "The Community Center-Showbarn really paid for itself, due to the weather at this year's junior livestock show!"

"Siberian Express" Has Area Shivering

An Arctic cold front, called the "Siberian Express" by area weathermen, brought the coldest weather of the season to the Friona area this week, along with snow and icy conditions.

The wind, which gusted up to 40 miles per hour at the arrival of the front about noon Wednesday, dropped the chill factor to more than 30 degrees below zero at the coldest point. Thursday's official "high" was only four degrees, and the low Friday morning was minus one.

Friona was not hit as heavy as parts of the area were. Schools were closed in Amarillo and Canyon on Thursday. College classes at West Texas State University were cancelled Thursday and Friday, along with schools at other Panhandle towns.

Friona schools started at 9:30 Thursday morning, due to the four-inch snowfall which slowed travel considerably. Bus routes were limited to "pavement only" status on Thursday. Buses ran a close to normal schedule Friday. Superintendent Tom Jarboe said Thursday's absentee rate was fairly high--probably about ten per cent.

School went on at its usual schedule on Friday in Friona.

The 38th annual Parmer County Junior Livestock show went on as scheduled, although being kicked off in zero weather and much below zero chill factor. Officials of the show once again hailed the Community Center-Showbarn as the salvation of the show. Temperatures inside the Community Center were comfortable for the opening round of the show on Thursday.

Several other activities were cancelled, or postponed. Included were the reception for Dr. Lee Spring, which was moved forward a week, to February 7, from 7-9 p.m. at Friona State Bank.

The temperature in Friona dropped to a low of one degree on Thursday morning, and the

mercury fell to -1 on Friday morning.

Friona had measured two inches of snow on Sunday, January 27, which amounted to .22 inch of moisture. This quickly melted during the day Sunday and on Monday.

Thursday morning's measurement of four inches of snow melted to .36 inch of moisture, and Friday showed an additional two inches, and .10 moisture. An additional .15 moisture measured Monday morning left the week's total moisture at .73 inch.

Although streets in town have been ice-packed, no accidents have been reported. "We haven't even had a fender-bender," said the police dispatcher at City of Friona Friday morning.

Roberts Back For Commissioner Date

The Parmer County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, January 25, with Judge

Porter Roberts once again presiding, after some months' absence due to illness.

A motion was passed to pay the county's four fire departments their annual fees of \$3,500. The money is intended to help defray the costs incurred by the departments in fighting rural fires each year, but can be used by the various fire departments any way they choose.

A bill from Ellis-Blackwell Funeral Home, for a pauper's funeral and use of their facilities, for two autopsies was approved. Total amount of the bill was \$650.00.

Payment of the Ninth Judicial assessment fee of \$350 was approved. Travel expenses for Judge Gordon H. Green of Muleshoe, amounting to \$37.50, were approved.

Expenses of a court reporter, amounting to \$215.30, were also approved.

Judge Roberts reported that the annual state jail inspection has been made. The jail has not as yet been certified, as the inspector indicated the jail needed painting and more lights.

A discussion on the Parmer County Permanent School fund was tabled until further information can be obtained.

Motion was approved to pay the annual lease fees on a water well at the county barn in Precinct 3.

Approval was given for a right-of-way easement to cross a county road in Precinct 3 with an electric

Lamb, Goat Winners Given

A Bovina FFA member won the third consecutive sheep championship for her family and a Friona 4-H Club member won the second-ever county goat title, at the opening day of the 38th annual Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show Thursday at the Community Center-Showbarn.

Tracy Moore of Bovina showed her Hampshire lamb to Grand Champion honors. Tracy's brother Terry had exhibited the champion sheep here both in 1983 and 1984. Miss Moore's animal had been judged champion of the Hampshire breed.

Shannon Cochran, 13-year-old Friona 4-H club member, nailed down the trophy in the goat show, held for only the second time. Cochran had won a similar award with the goat two weeks ago at the Friona Jr. Livestock Show.

Reserve champion sheep was entered by Denver Riddle of Bovina, the Suffolk breed champion.

Reserve champion goat was exhibited by Greg Salyer, another Friona 4-H Club member. Salyer had had the grand champion goat in the 1984 show.

Winning showmanship honors in the sheep show, in a special competition, were Joanna Clayton of Bovina in the junior division, and Michael Elam of Friona in the senior division.

Showmanship winners in the goat show were Joanna Clayton for the juniors and Kevin Owen of Farwell in the senior division.

Cody Simmons, a Friona 4-H Club youngster, exhibited the breed champion lamb in the fine wool division and Marc Hamil, also of Friona, had the reserve breed champion.

Michael Head of Friona had the breed champion in the fine wool cross division, and Lance Ivy of Lazbuddie had the reserve champ.

Jana Vise of Lazbuddie had the breed champion Southdown lamb, and Jennifer Smith of Friona had the reserve champ.

Jeff Brown, Friona FFA member, won the banner for "other breeds and crosses," and Michael Elam had the reserve.

Sheldon Mason of Lazbuddie had the reserve breed champion Hampshire lamb to Miss Moore's Grand Champion, and his brother Shane Mason had the reserve breed champ to Riddle's show reserve champion.

On Monday, the team hosted Tulia, and after the lead rocked back and forth most of the first half, Friona gained control in the second half for the win.

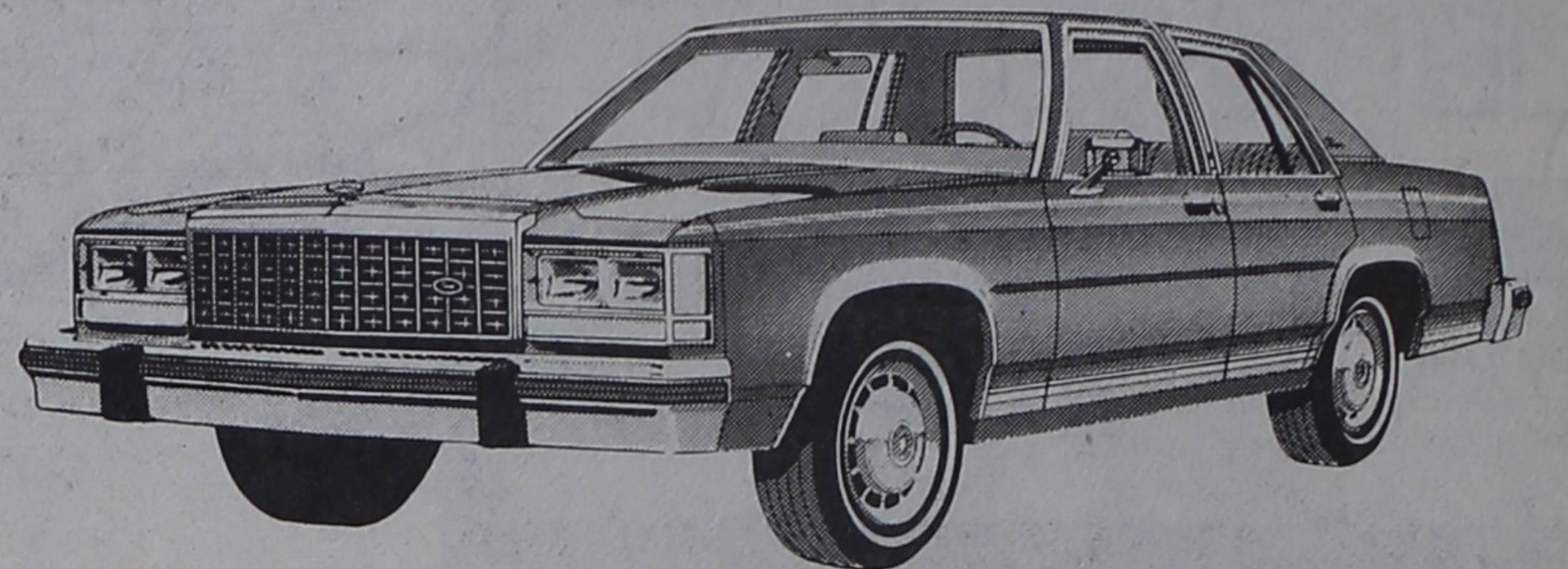
