## "Mancamp" within city ordinance, will stand

A group of citizens has gathered during the last couple city council meetings to express concern over what is a workforce housing, or "mancamp" that is being located in the Hillcrest Addition in Colorado City. Tuesday night was no different, but this time there were representatives from both sides present.

After conferring in closed session, City Manager David

Hoover announced that the council stands behind a zoning ordinance passed in March 2014 that allows for multi-person and manufactured housing to be put in the Hillcrest area.

Texas Workforce Housing, LLC bought a large majority of the lots in question in the latter part of 2014. The group was formed to provide housing solutions for various industries, ac-

ording to a handout distributed at the meeting.

The letter announced the property owners have a new tenant, Alamo Pressure Pumping LLC, an oilfield fracking company. Alamo owns the quadplexes that have been put in the Hillcrest Addition. The quadplexes will provide housing for the company's employees.

Alex Padua spoke on behalf of

Texas Workforce Housing, LLC. He said Alamo has leased 18 lots and owns the housing placed there. Padua said he believes the housing will generate positive benefits for the city and county.

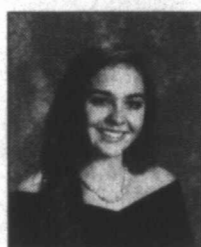
Alvie Stevens, a concerned citizen living very close to one of the mobile homes, said he met a representative of Alamo. Stevens said he was not notified of the plan to allow a mancamp to be

set up in the addition. Because zoning laws determine what is allowed, he city didn't notify those living in the area. All affected residents were notified in March 2014 when the zoning was under consideration.

Stevens and another resident, Owens O'Quinn, stated that their property values have already dropped due to the proximity of

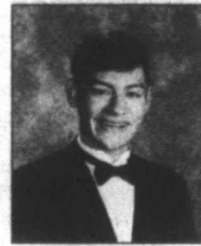
## C-City, W'brook to graduate Friday

## Run for the Wall

### Motorcyclists to once again stop in C-City on yearly trek

It's time again for one of the most patriotic events held in Colorado City! On Saturday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, hundreds of motorcycles will roll into town to take part in the 30<sup>th</sup> annual Run for the Wall (RFTW), C-City style.

What started back in 1987 as a couple of hundred motorcycles converging on Washington, DC over the Memorial Day weekend turned into an event Colorado ISD looks forward to each year. Local citizens, Colorado ISD students, administrators, faculty and civic club members will gather to serve lunch and entertain the riders who are making their way to the Vietnam War Memorial.

The roar of the motorcycles will signal their entry into town between 11 and 11:30 a.m. They will refuel and parade down Hickory Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> on their

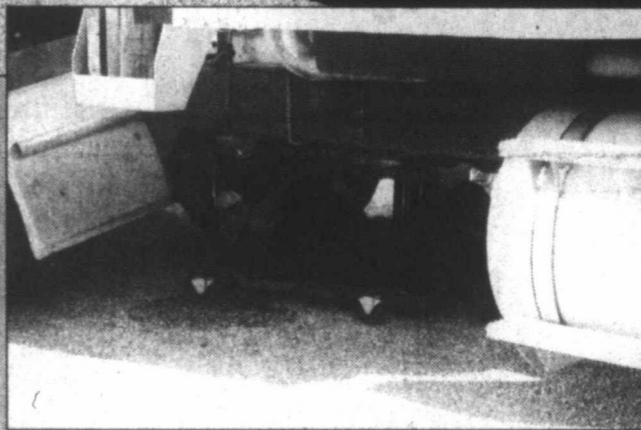
way to the Railhead Building. Citizens are encouraged to line the streets to welcome the riders.

Local veterans, their families and interested community members are invited to join the riders for lunch.

The riders coming in Saturday are riding along the RFTW Southern Route. The ride is dedicated to Prisoners of War and Missing in Action. The motto behind the trip is "We ride for those who can't."

RFTW was started in 1989 as an effort by James Gregory and Bill Evans. They were a couple of Vietnam veterans who traveled across the heartland of America on motorcycles, talking to local radio, TV and newspapers about the fact that there are thousands of men and women still unaccounted for from all wars.

## Commercial vehicle traffic inspected during DPS operation

A two-day operation kicked off Tuesday morning when several units of the Texas Highway Patrol set up a temporary commercial vehicle inspection station at a rest area just east of Loraine on the westbound side of I-20. The responsibility of the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Service is weighing and checking commercial vehicle traffic to ensure the safety of the general public.

By 9 a.m. Tuesday, the inspection point was set up and in operation as commercial vehicles pulled in for the mandatory inspection.

Various units within the agency were working together to inspect commercial vehicles. A DPS Corporal with the K-9 division was part of the group, and he's one of the first stops of the inspection. Sgt. Taylor and Cpl. Bearden were conducting a quick pre-screen of every vehicle that comes through the point.

The dog was looking for drugs and other contraband, while the troopers looked for obvious safety violations. If a truck or other commercial vehicle has had a recent inspection, See DPS, page 5

## Helmers visits Lions Club

Former Navy SEAL Billy Helmers visited Colorado City last week where he talked to students and community members about his recipe for living a successful, fulfilled life. He then served as the guest speaker of a combined meeting of the three local civic clubs, Lions, Kiwanis and Rotary.

Helmers spoke to the crowd about the dark path chosen by his son early in his life. Helmers said his son chose a bad crowd as friends and turned to drugs in his teens. He said it definitely hurt his son's creativity and has been a struggle.

"As adults, we have to do something," Helmers said. "I mean, there are consequences."

The man went on to say he had to kick his son out of his house where they lived in California. Helmers said it was "so hard to do" and many heavy thoughts flooded his mind during those days.

At one point, the son had a

broken jaw, and his parents went to the hospital to make sure he was ok. Helmers said the attending physician was more concerned with the son's toxicology report than his broken jaw.

After leaving home, the son now lives with his uncle in Arizona who is also a recovering addict. Helmers said no wool can be pulled over the uncle's eyes, unlike the naïve eyes of the parents.

Helmers addressed what thousands of parents go through every day. He said there was lots of love in their home as he and his wife raised their kids.

"We were trying to keep it a secret," Helmers said of his son's drug use. "We had a good home with lots of love, but drugs found our kid."

Helmers said his son smoked pot when he was 14 and his family was at a funeral out of town. He said they had an open line of communication, and his son confessed and wanted to talk

about it.

Helmers' reaction was to talk and to begin drug testing him. The testing would ensure his son could say no to his peers, using the drug tests as an excuse not to engage in such behavior. Helmers said it worked for a while, but not for long.

"I could tell he was high," Helmers said, telling the crowd his son had turned to cocaine and Xanax.

He urged parents and other family members to go to counseling or join a support group. Helmers' son is living with his uncle in Arizona and going to school, which shows his desire to do better.

Helmers described drug abuse as an epidemic and urged those attending not to give up, to take the first step and keep going.

"Don't let it go. There has to be consequences. Nip it in the bud," Helmers said.

Besides being a SEAL, Helmers also served in the "Leap Frogs", parachuting into enemy territory. He also forayed into the arena of high-profile private security. Helmers now teaches Navy recruits how to survive becoming a hostage and how to withhold information without getting themselves killed.

Before the meeting adjourned, Helmers said, "People like you guys are the cure."

## City zoning commission to recommend a zoning change for Kelley area

The City Zoning Commission met a week ago Tuesday to consider the rezoning of lots near the old Kelley Elementary School from single-family residential to MX2 — multi-use, multi-family residential and commercial.

Commission members Shorty Brown, Niki Watlington and Wade Sands formed the quorum. Cherry Hoback and Bob Brookshear were absent.

It was brought to the attention of the commission that there is already a restaurant open in the former school building. Rezoning would allow for businesses to come into the area and for the construction of apartments and duplexes.

City Manager David Hoover said the city hopes to be able to utilize the old nursing home building in the future. Those lots are in the area being considered for rezoning.

Sands moved to make a recommendation to the city council

for the rezoning, and Watlington seconded. The measure passed, and the recommendation will be made to the council.

Brenda Hammond, owner of the old elementary school building, said she's interested in renting rooms inside to businesses like retail shops. It's also a good setup for personal storage.

Hammond and her daughter have opened a restaurant, Kelley Café, inside the school's cafeteria which is doing well. The gym on the property is up for sale. Hammond said she's interested in converting the gym into a non-profit community center if it doesn't sell.

The retired teachers said she's taking suggestions if anyone has ideas for the building.

"We're trying to pave the way for an opportunity," Hoover said.

The city council was to hear the recommendation during the meeting Tuesday night.

## Navy SEAL speaks to CHS students

Billy Helmers, nephew of Bobby and Jan Lemons, was the guest speaker at Colorado High School last Friday. He is a former Navy SEAL and spoke to the audience about what it takes to live a

fulfilled life. Helmers said his SEAL class started with 120 students, with only 19 graduating to become part of a SEAL team. He described the long, intense training. He was trained for combat and saw some during his time with SEAL Team 5.

Helmers also joined the "Leap Frogs", a naval parachute group, where he jumped out of planes for three years. After the destruction of the Twin Towers on September 11, 2001, Helmers was deployed to Iraq to do some of the things for which he'd been trained.

He told students that life goes by fast. Helmers felt like he graduated from high school one day and retired from the Navy the next.

Helmers posed several questions to students. "Who are you? What do you want? And how do you get it?" He asked the audience to close their eyes and picture themselves for the weekend, the summer, after high school and after college.

"There are so many choices," Helmers told students.

The military divides people into three categories, Helmers said, sheep, wolves and sheepdogs. He described sheep as productive members of society who won't hurt others on purpose but who also don't often see the bad in people.

Wolves are the takers in society. They're ferocious and often have a pack mentality, like bullies. Sheepdogs live to protect the flock and confront the wolves. They have a deep love for their fellow people and are not afraid to use violence if necessary, Helmers said. He told students it's important to know the difference and to figure it out quickly.

Helmers uses the acronym FACE for the kind of life everyone wants: Fun, Adventurous, Creative and Exciting. Students responded when he asked if everyone wanted some fun out of life. He

told them creativity can give you a fun, adventurous life full of excitement, as long as it's the right kind of fun.

"No two seconds are the same," he said. "Each one is a new opportunity."

Pulling no punches with the audience, Helmers gave them the "how". He said it takes hard work. Life is not easy, and nothing is free.

FACE is an acronym for other words that lead to a fulfilling life: Foundation, Accountability, Character and Education.

Helmers said values are the most important foundation. It's where we all begin, he said. He told students to treat others the way they want to be treated.

"Without a good foundation, it all collapses," Helmers said.

Accountability was described by the former Navy SEAL as duty that binds us to a course of action. He said, "Everyone is more successful with accountability."

Regarding character, Helmers told students to pick the right side and stick with it. Character is defined as honor,

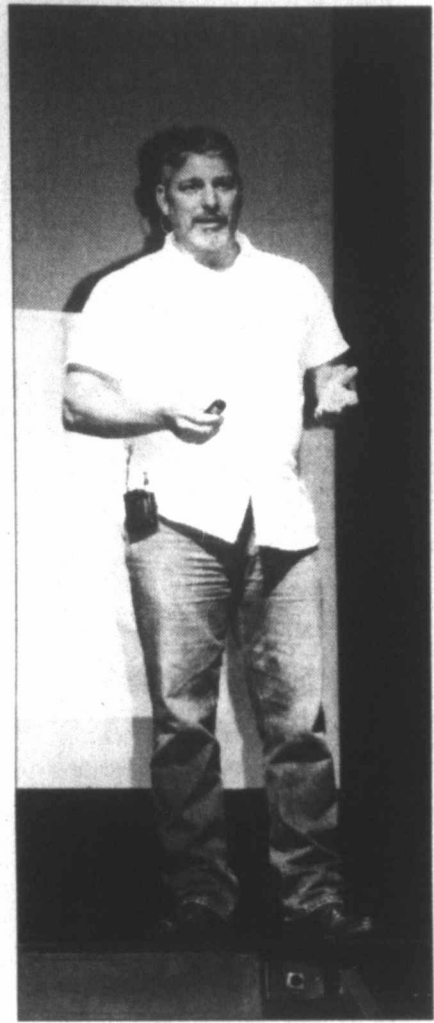
courage and commitment.

Finally, Helmers said, the key to a fulfilled life is education. Helmers told students it's important to be a good person, but it's also important to be flexible and able to adapt to any situation presented to you.

"How you live will show in every

choice in your life," Helmers said.

Before the conclusion of the presentation, Daniel Meguire and Brianna Stephens joined him on stage. They are graduating students who have already signed up for military service. Helmers congratulated them and sent good wishes for their futures.

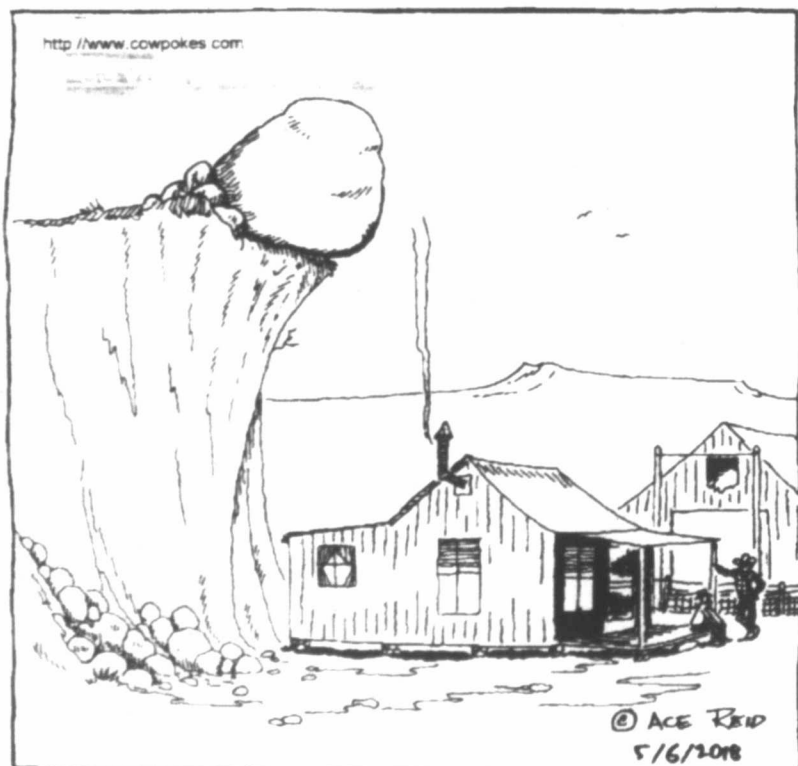

they may have been waved through and allowed to travel on down the highway.

Sgt. Nunez said troopers can usually tell if a vehicle is close to its legal weight with a quick visual check. If things are questionable, the portable scales are used. Other things that are checked include motor carrier safety, registration, and the proper transportation of people, hazardous materials and other property.

Further into the checkpoint, troopers with clipboards were checking paperwork and safety equipment on 18-wheelers and other commercial vehicles, weighing the vehicles and conducting overall inspections. There were even State Troopers on creepers checking the undercarriages of vehicles, including brakes, tires, etc.

If a vehicle is found to have major violation, a citation may be issued and more actions may

result. For instance, if the vehicle has bad brakes, the driver may be required to have the brakes replaced before being allowed to continue traveling.

There are two Commercial Vehicle Enforcement officers here, Trooper Usener and Trooper Gleaton. There are 12 in this area. Temporary checkpoints help DPS keep citizens safe. The only permanent checkpoint in this area is west of Odessa. Permanent inspection areas boost the economy of the county and nearby cities. Drivers are often not allowed to continue until the proper equipment can be obtained, usually in the town nearest the checkpoint.

Every inspection conducted makes the roadways safer for the travel of everyone, thanks to the hard work of the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement officers.

the new workforce housing.

Lee Magnus, an investor with Texas Workforce Housing, L.L.C., also spoke on the matter. He said he shares some of the concerns expressed by citizens and wants to be a good neighbor to all those living in Hillcrest. He said Alamo employees must abide by the city's laws and ordinances, just

like every other citizen.

"We want to benefit the community, not hinder it," Magnus said.

The investor said the housing company is open to landscaping suggestions to help with privacy issues, as well as other ideas. Magnus said there have already been some requests for single-family residences to be moved in, along with the quadplexes.

Hoover said he's been working on the concern for over a month. He and the council stand by the zoning ordinance, as it is legal and has been in place for four years.

The city manager went on to encourage citizens to talk with company representatives to resolve issues and "work out something amicable." Hoover conceded that there's nothing that will make everyone happy. "Try to work together," Hoover said.

Councilman Tim Boyd added that the council wants to do what citizens want, but they also must consider what the city needs. He

said the town is drowning right now, and businesses and further development is welcome and encouraged. Boyd assured citizens that lawbreakers would be swiftly and severely dealt with.

In other business, Marcelo Alvarez and Travis Lynch were sworn in to serve another term on the council. And, Spencer Cannon was sworn in and participated in his first meeting as a councilman.

The city's Economic Development Corporation received approval from the state to form. The first meeting of the EDC is set for Tuesday, May 29th at

6 p.m. at the Bob Reily Early Learning Center.

The council also approved an amendment to the hotel/motel rebate requests. From this point forward, groups requesting funds from hotel/motel rebates must have a representative present at the meeting to make the request in person and answer any questions from the council.

An airport lease between the city and ProAgra, a crop spraying company, was also approved.

Late fees on a farm leased by Tanner Cox were also waived. The request came from his dad, Robert, on behalf of Tanner.

Reggy Spencer said the changes were necessary, as updates had not been made since moving into the new Colorado Elementary and Colorado Middle School campus.

Cost to lease the high school auditorium is \$200, which is the same as renting the kitchen for an event. The Administration Gym rents for \$50 per hour or \$300 per day. The high school gym and The Pit are available for approved tournaments only and cost is \$300 per day or \$500 if you prefer to use the air conditioning at The Pit.

Additionally, a staff member is required to be on duty at functions where school facilities are used. Those renting the facilities must pay \$25 per hour for the staff member. All rental fees must be paid in advance and proof of insurance is required.

Renting facilities is not a money-maker for the district but provides a needed service to the community. All groups wishing

to enter into an agreement for such an activity must have insurance and is required to show proof of the coverage at the time the facility is rented.

The board also approved budget amendments. CFO Shelia Redwine said the CHS Home-making Department had travel money left over that needed to be moved to the Homemaking Supplies fund. The total transferred was \$10,674. Another \$20,400 was also moved for the purchase of new Chromebooks for Colorado Middle School.

Adrian Daniels was hired as a coach and teacher at Colorado High School during the meeting.

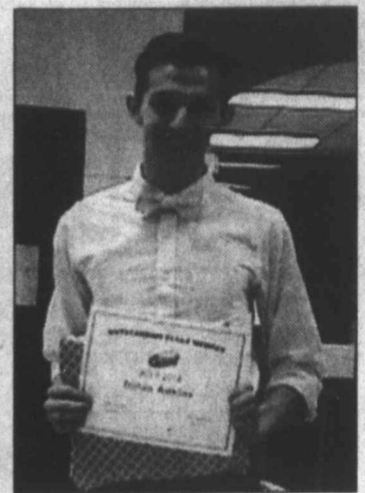

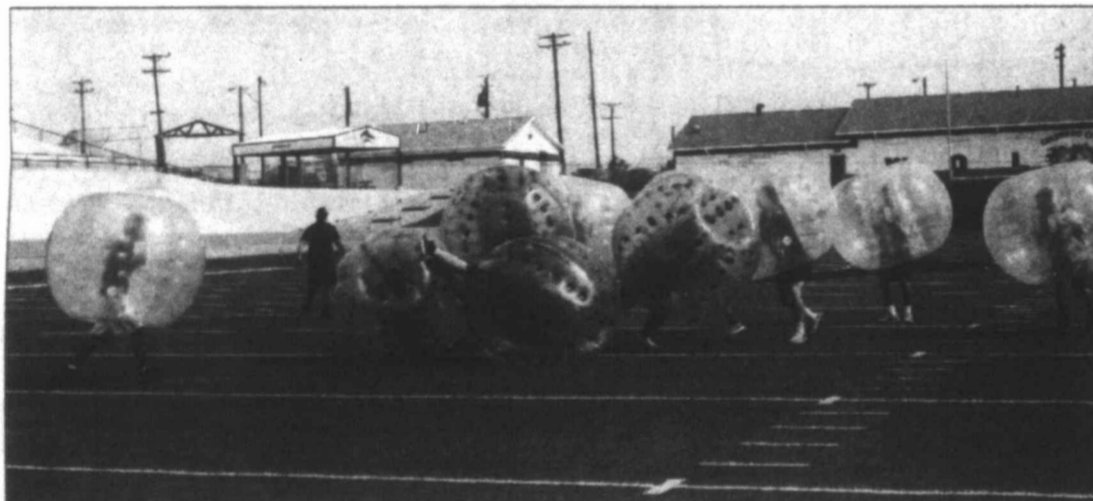

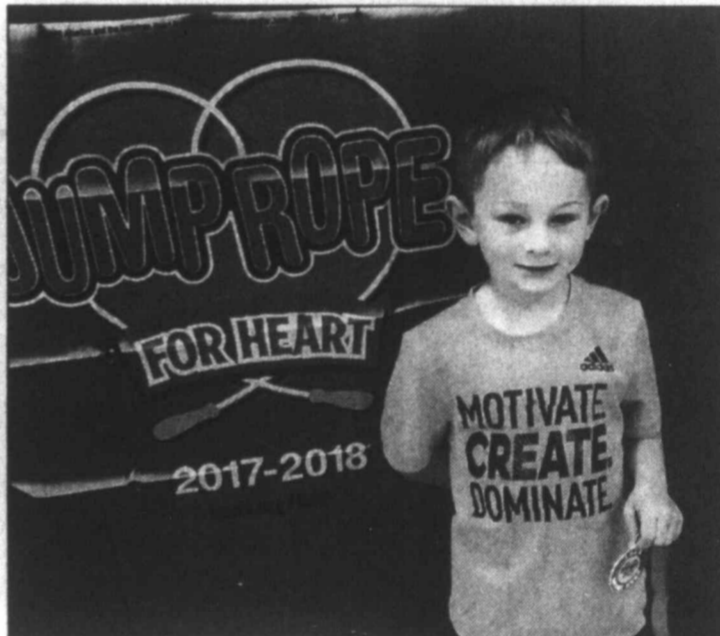
