Mustangs Hold Dist. 4 1-A Title After Win Over Clarendon 43-0

In a battle for sole possession of first place in District 4-1-A, the Wheeler Mustangs continued their season-long dominance with a 43-0 victory over Clarendon.

The Broncos came into the road contest with hopes of forging a tie for the district lead with a victory. However, it was Wheeler (8-0, 3-0) that controlled the game with quarterback Terry Menefield's 1-yard scoring run, Jorge Porras' 18-yard touchdown run and a safety, helping the Mustangs to a 22-0 halftime advantage.

Clarendon (6-2, 2-1) was held to 85 yards of total offense and six first downs, as Wheeler's stifling defense allowed only two pass completions for 20 yards.

Wheeler matches its win total from a year ago when it finished 8-3. Porras finished with 99 yards on 10 carries, part of the Mustangs' 240 rushing yards on the night.

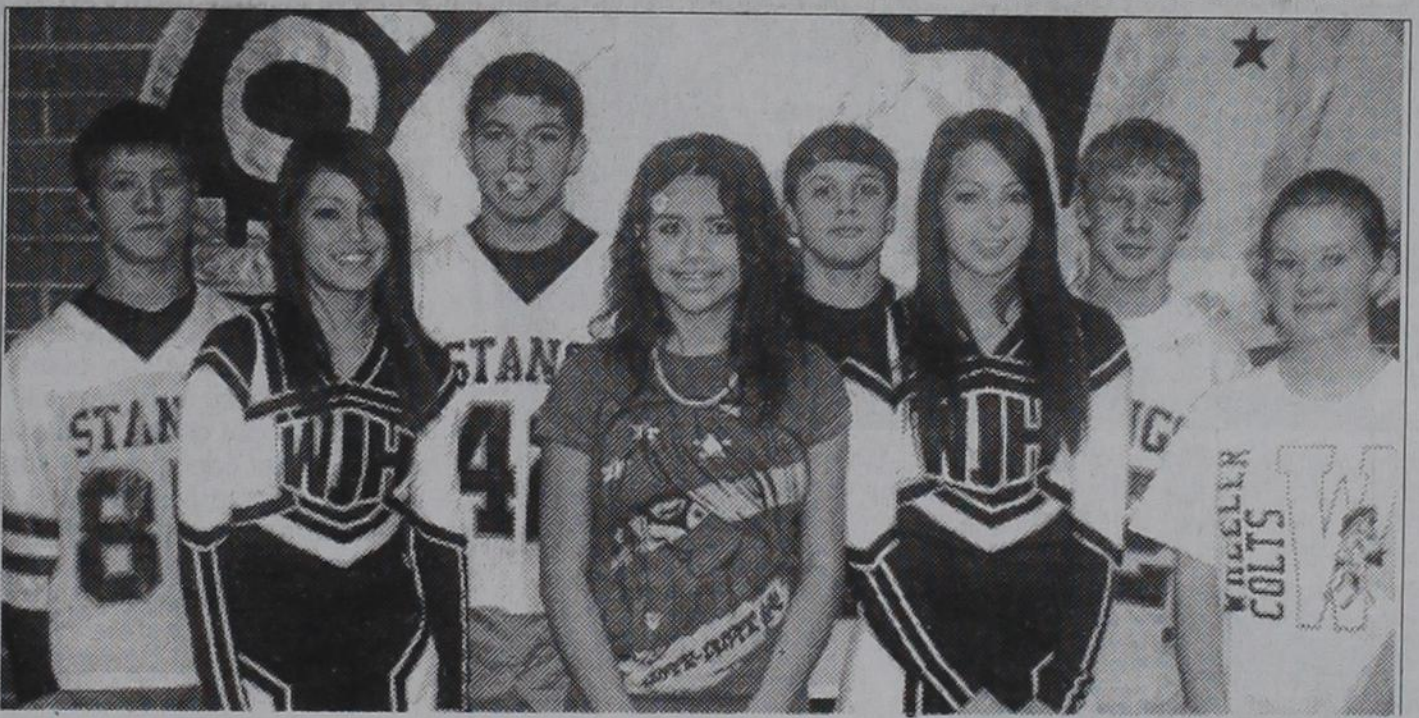

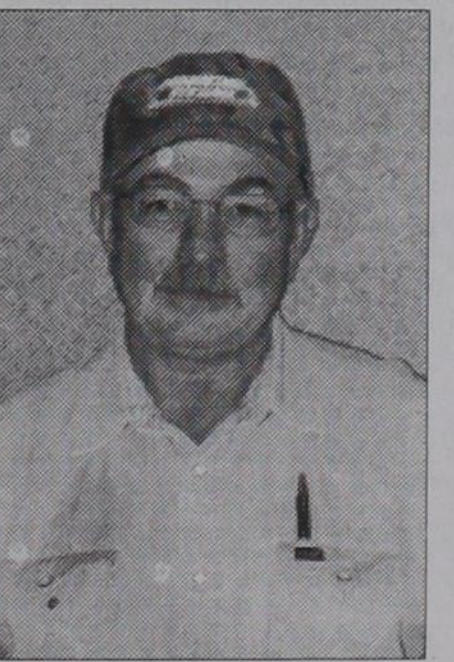

Commissioners' Court Meeting; No Cattle Guards On Co. Roads

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, October 26, 2009, at the commissioner's courtroom of the Wheeler county courthouse. Eighteen items were on the agenda.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The commissioners voted to pay the bills as approved.

Several line items were changed on the budget to make it easier to keep track of different accounts.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The county treasurer's monthly report was approved.

Bob Weatherly and Leo Lee met with the council in an effort to get three cattle guards placed across the county right-of-way.

Weatherly felt that since there were other cattle guards in place it was only fair to approve the placement of these guards. It was also reported that in some instances the guards were difficult to maintain. The court voted against the placing of the guards.

The court voted to purchase three surplus cargo trucks and four fuel pods, which will be used for water tanks. The trucks will be used by the Wheeler, Shamrock

and Mobeetie fire departments. The trucks are \$5000 and \$5500 and the tanks are \$300 each.

The council voted to approve the payment of \$5,750 to the City

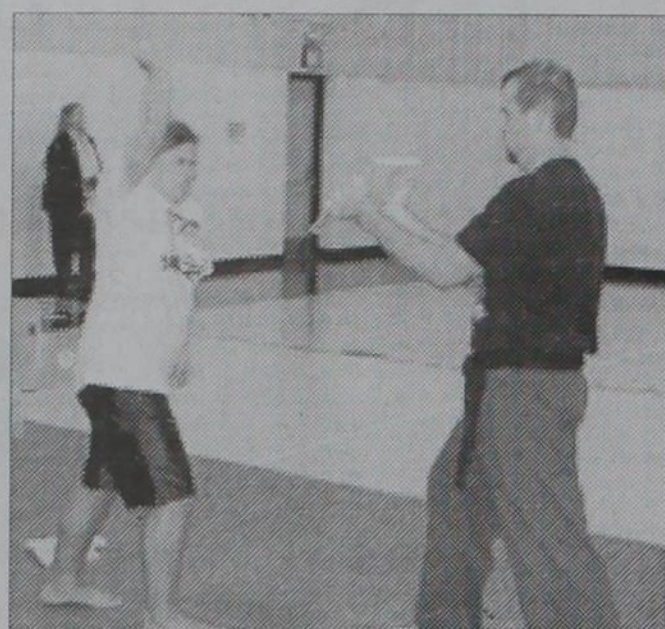

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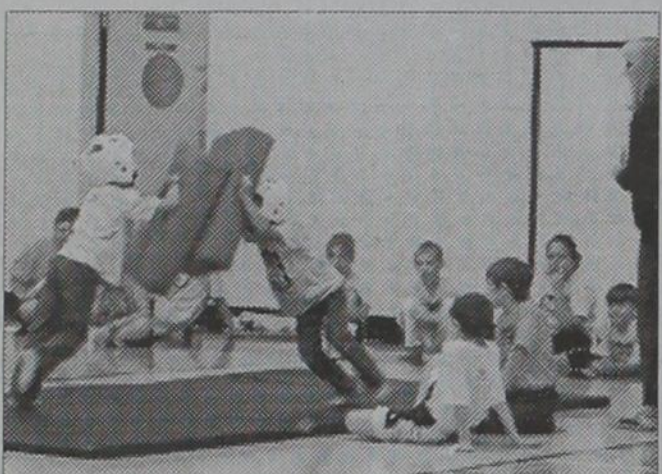

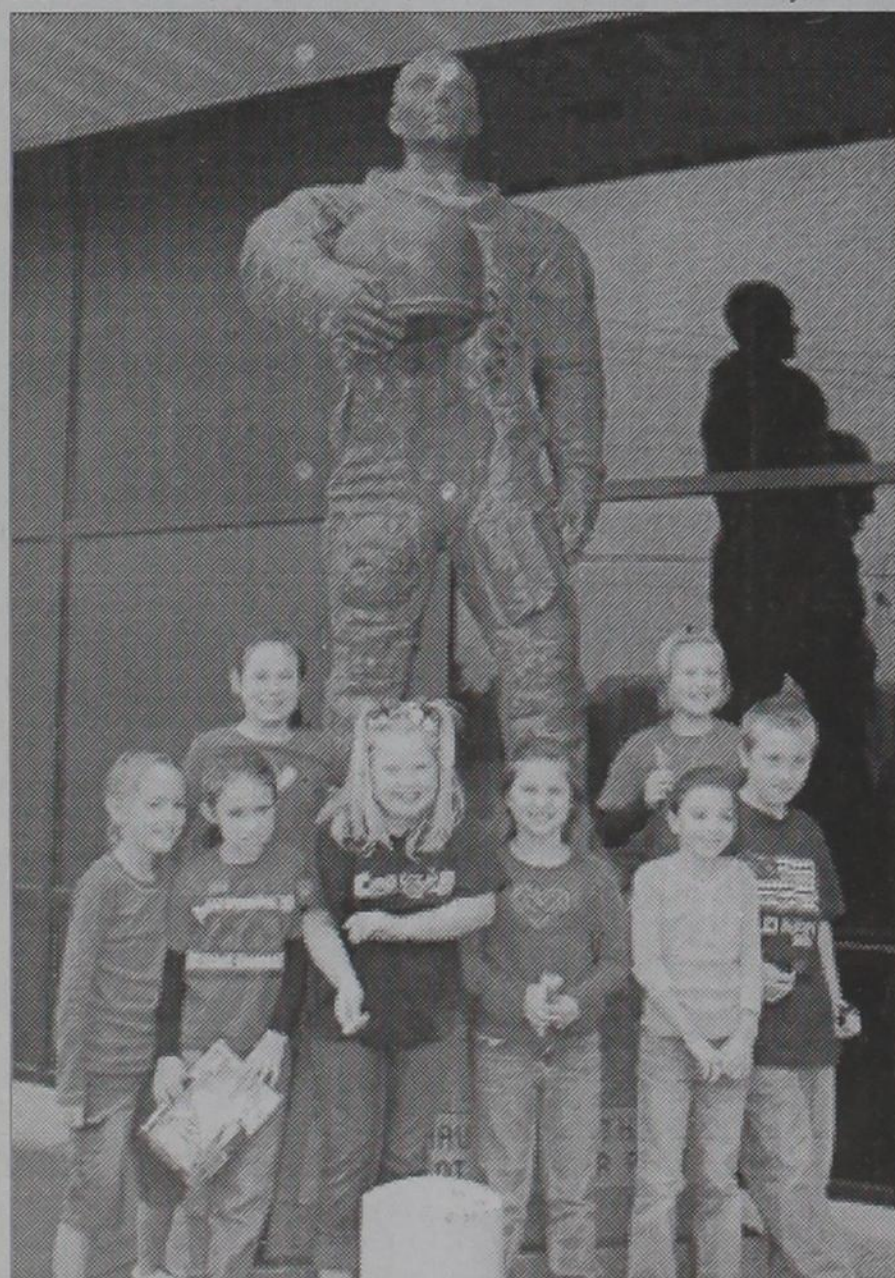

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

MEDICINE SHOWS & THE FLAMING HAND TRICK

The first couple of years after we moved to Wheeler, there was a live "Medicine Show" that would come to town. They'd usually set up on the cotton gin lot where Thriftway grocery store is now. This troupe would consist of several people with a semi-trailer and truck. The side of the trailer had a big door that had hinges on the bottom side. It would be let down, supported by a chain on each end, and this would be used as a small stage. Someone, would come out on this stage and sing a song or two, usually accompanied by a guitar. They'd tell a few jokes, to get the people laughing, and maybe even do a few magic tricks. Most people including me, seemed to like that "magic" part real well.

Then the "main man" would give his "pitch" to sell several different kinds of medicines. These were supposed to have been invented by a "Dr. Tate." One was a laxative called, "Tate Lax" and one was an ointment called, "Tate-O-Rub." There was a tonic that I can't recall the name of, but I heard that it had quite a lot of alcohol in it. It was supposed to perk you up... I guess it did a good job of that, because it seemed to sell extra well! They sold taffy candy that was really good, too. With the invention of TV, they didn't come to Wheeler as often. Whatever the reason, around 1955 or 6, is the last one I recall being here. Most people had sort-of lost interest in the medicine shows. The thing that impressed me most was the taffy candy, and the magic tricks had stayed on my mind.

Along about the second grade, I finally came across a trick I was sure I could do, and it would really impress my friends. As luck would have it, one of my uncles was home on leave from the military and he had some pretty neat tricks to show us nieces and nephews. This one nifty trick got my attention..... He poured some lighter fluid into his cupped hand and lit it. The flame just burned

straight up and didn't even burn his hand. Wow, I thought, this is my chance to shine! Can't wait to get to school and entertain my friends with this!

I managed to get a can of lighter fluid and some matches, without alerting anyone. The next day, I took'em to school and at recess, I gathered up a small audience (out of sight of the teachers, of course) next to the school building. It was this experiment that taught me...under normal conditions, fire burns upward.

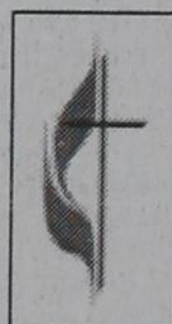
Being long on enthusiasm and short on fire facts, I cupped my hand and poured a lot more lighter fluid than my hand would hold. Overfilled, the rest of it ran to the under side of my hand. Failing to recognize that this was already not normal, I proceeded to the next step and lit it.

Swoosh...wow, there was a lot more fire than I had expected, or wanted! This situation really spawned a lot of desperate huffing and puffing from me! I got it blown out pretty quick and without much damage. Mostly, it just burned the hair off the back of my hand and turned it a little red. No one at home would ever notice, and I sure wasn't going to tell. Telling, could result in more than just the back of my hand being red.

Despite my amateurish performance, all my friends still seemed to enjoy it. This had been a "once-in-a-lifetime" trick that they probably wouldn't get to see again.....ever! At least not by me....

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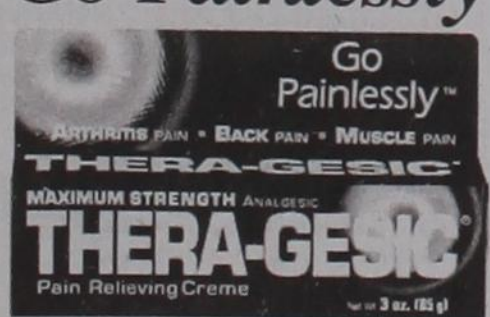
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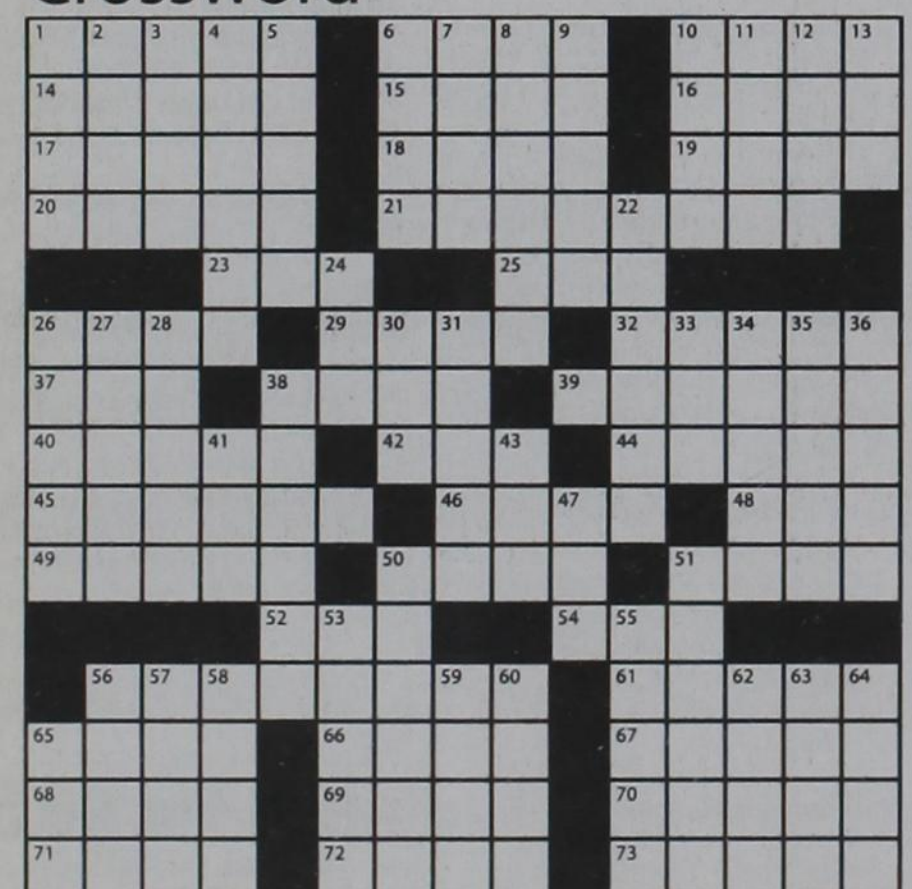

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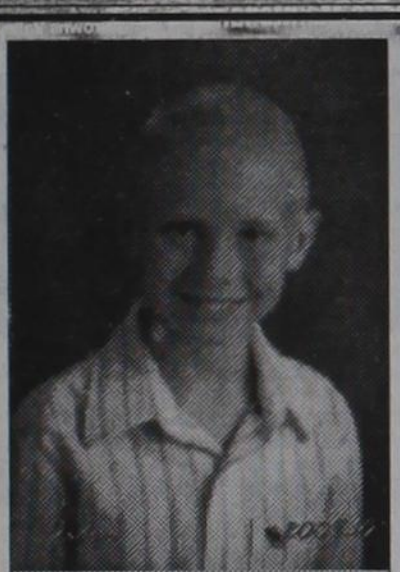

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Parkview Artery Flu in Wheeler

The Flu is definitely in Wheeler and is spreading rampantly. Parkview Hospital would like to remind our community of a few precautions to take during the flu season:

- ★ Be prepared to stay home if you become ill
 - ★ Drink lots of fluids (this does not include alcohol) ha ha
 - ★ Handle your fever with Tylenol and Ibuprophen
 - ★ Cover cough and sneezes
 - ★ Wash your hands at least hourly
 - ★ If ill, stay at Least 3-6 feet from loved ones
 - ★ Do not go to work until you have been fever free for 24 hours
 - ★ Return to your healthcare provider if conditions worsen or if illness is not improving.
- Parkview has set up a Satellite flu room to assist with the surge of patients that are exhibiting flu like symptoms. The satellite flu room is open Mon-Fri 8-5 pm, and is located behind the Parkview Home Health building. Just follow the posted Flu Room signs. In the area an R.N. will assess you, and take a nasal swab for a flu test. She will then notify a MD of the results. This service is free of charge.
- An Antiviral medication may be prescribed for the high-risk patients including pregnant, young, or those with a medical history of chronic conditions.

of Shamrock, which was the county's part of the cost for a radio tower which was placed on the county property in Shamrock. The City of Shamrock paid 1/2 the cost.
The Cafeteria Plan limit was raised from \$100 per month to \$200 per month. A cafeteria plan has to do with health insurance deduction.
