Our English friends have been here for three weeks now.

During that time they have seen the temperature plummet from 90 to 54 degrees, and have experienced some of the really top class storms Texas is known for, including high winds, hail and deluge.

But what has fascinated them most, and been a little disturbing to them, has been the various forms of "danger" that most of us take for granted.

There are the obvious things, such as rabies. England has no such deadly disease.

They also have only one poisonous snake in the whole of their country, where we have rattlesnakes, copperheads and moccasins. We warned them about sitting on logs, kicking over rocks and logs or reaching in to pick things up in heavy brush without looking first.

The look on their faces when we warned them about chiggers was priceless. Having exposed them to a variety of Texas tales they first thought that we were pulling their leg about chiggers.

Tiny red bugs that bit without you knowing it, left welts and weren't visible sounded to them like another tale. However, numerous people were willing to confirm that chiggers were real, and they ceased sitting on the grass!

Poison ivy was shown to them and its effect was explained. They looked at one another in horror...again, England, peaceful and garden-like, has no such thing.

Coyotes howling at night convinced them that wolves must be waiting to tear the throats from newborn calves, and when we told them about the butcher bird hanging his victims on barbed wire fences they were certain that we were telling lies again.

But a foray into the bird book confirmed that we told the truth. When word of two people shooting at one another came over the police scanner they were absolutely horrified.

In a country where policemen seldom carry guns, only night sticks, even law enforcement officers made an impression on them.

They met the local constable, game wardens and a Texas Ranger, and they all had on weapons...something these ladies found vaguely disturbing.

Everywhere they heard about hunting and fishing...something that is in short supply in their small, crowded country.

The "blazing heat" nearly melted them, and they can't conceive just how hot it really gets in the summer. Already it is ten degrees warmer than their July and August ever gets!

In short, as Texans, and as Americans, we take for granted the left-over harshness that goes with our vast, sprawling nation.

Over and over they were impressed by what our pioneer ancestors must have had to face...and in commenting on it, brought us to realize that things we take for granted don't always seem normal to the rest of the world...but instead seem harsh and a little frightening.

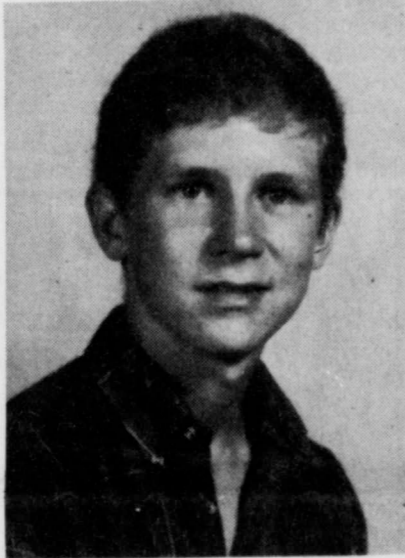
the Arigo Riders Drill Team.

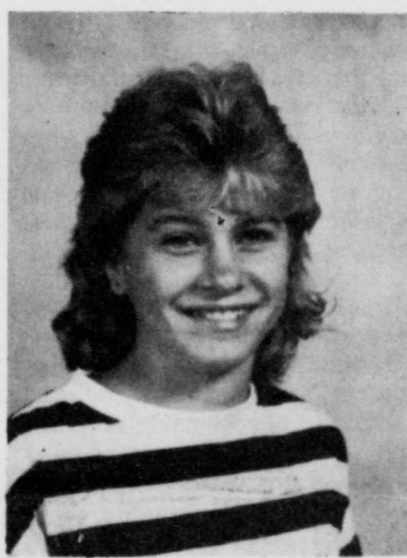
Brandon Williams, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Williams of Bogata, with a grade average of 94.22 was the third ranking student.

## Asbestos Materials To Be Removed From Schools

Ceiling material containing asbestos will be removed from the Bogata Elementary School cafeteria; ceiling material and thermal system insulation will be removed from Rivercrest High School. Work will be done by Masterclean, Inc. of Garland and will begin immediately following the close of school. The project will be completed by mid-August. During this time there will be no access to these buildings. Records of students

presently enrolled in high school will be moved to the temporary offices; however, records of former students will not be available after the close of school.

The offices of the superintendent, principal and tax collector will be located in the Rivercrest High School Agriculture Building during this time. Telephone numbers will remain the same.

## Storms Rip Through Area, Dump Rain

The immediate area was luckier than some places, but still received from three to four inches of rain within a five-hour period during the early morning hours of Tuesday, May 16.

Winds, wall clouds, massive lightning and some hail scoured the areas for hours, as an enormous weather system wrecks havoc in north Texas.

In some places, but not locally, hail devastated wheat crops and newly emerging seedlings, broke windows and caused roof damage. Locally, erosion and washing was the major problem. Some fields had low portions completely under water, others suffered from rows being washed away.

Several roads were closed temporarily as the heavy rains kept water at

high levels which created creeks running out of banks and over roads.

School bus routes were delayed, as was delivery of groceries and other items supplied by routes, but no major disruption occurred, unlike nearer to Dallas or Gainesville, which suffered worse flooding.

Several wall clouds formed, and weather-watchers kept a wary eye on them. Some reports of brief tornado funnel clouds were received by local law enforcement officials.

Lightening and wind caused power outages that lasted from a few minutes to several hours.

The storm system was expected to pass through the area by Wednesday night.

## Bogata Lions Club "Ducking For Dollars"

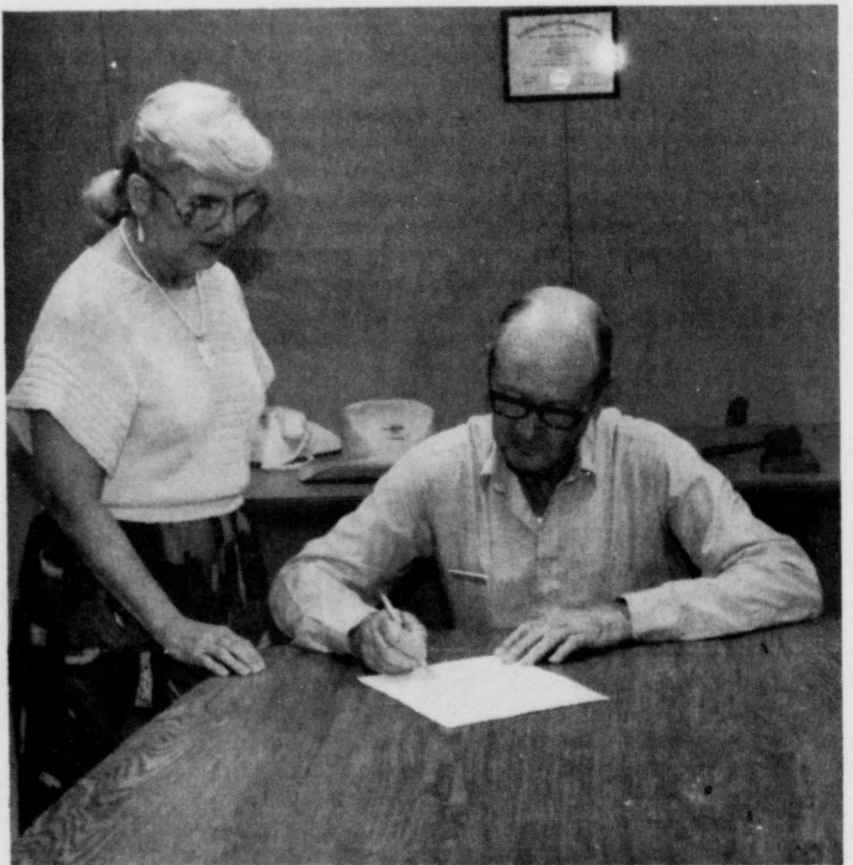
To raise money for its charitable activities, the Bogata Lions Club will hold a plastic duck race at the City Park.

## Proclamation Safe Kids Week

May 22-28

By The Mayor Of Bogata, TX

WHEREAS, during the week of May 22-28, the National Coalition to Prevent Childhood Injury has scheduled a local and national campaign to increase public awareness of the high incidence of accidental injury among children; and

WHEREAS, each year, yearly 8,000 children up to age fifteen die from injuries sustained in accidents, thereby making unintentional injuries and trauma the leading killer of children in the United States; and

WHEREAS, each year, approximately one in four children under the age of fifteen receives an injury serious enough to require medical attention; and

WHEREAS, the incidence of childhood accidental injury doubles during the trauma season, the time when children are released from school for the summer vacation and spend a great deal of their recreational hours outdoors; and

WHEREAS, the sponsors of this Campaign believe that it is critically important to focus attention on the problem of accidental injury, the need for preventive measures, and the need to educate the public on prevention and emergency response.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the Mayor of Bogata, TX, do hereby proclaim May 22-28, 1989 as "Safe Kids Week" in Bogata and call upon all the residents of this great state to join with me in supporting the aims, goals and programs of the National Coalition to Prevent Childhood Injury, for the benefit of our state's most precious resource, its children. 

## Lisa Umphries Adamson To Graduate

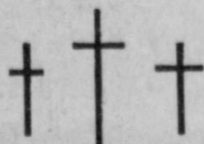

**Courthouse To Be Repaired**

Three years after Red River County was awarded a grant to make its century-old courthouse accessible to the handicapped, the Texas Historical Commission has given the go-ahead.

The approval, received by County Judge L.D. Williamson last Thursday, was hailed by both preservationists and those concerned to avoid the expense of building new quarters for county offices.

For three years the county and the THC have debated about the best location for the elevator that will make upper floors accessible to the handicapped. THC has now approved a plan that will preserve the architec-

tural character of the historic old building at a projected cost within the county's means and far less than the expected cost of a new building.

Because the Courthouse is classified as a Texas historical monument, the THC must approve any proposal for alterations. The Commissioners Court has wanted to put on a new roof and make structural repairs, and now has an approved plan for doing so.

A \$199,000 Community Development Project of the Texas Department of Community Affairs will be applied to the cost of making the courthouse "handicapped accessible". Other steps, to increase the available office space in the building, will be paid for with county funds. Judge Williamson notes that some \$100 thousand have been accumulated in the county's permanent Improvement Fund for the courthouse.

The elevator will be located in the northeast corner of the building, displacing the offices of the Justice of the Peace and the District Attorney. The vaulted ceiling of the Courtroom will be lowered to allow the creation of a third floor. These and other changes will be carried out in a way that would permit eventual restoration of the courtroom to its original state, should money for this step be found.
