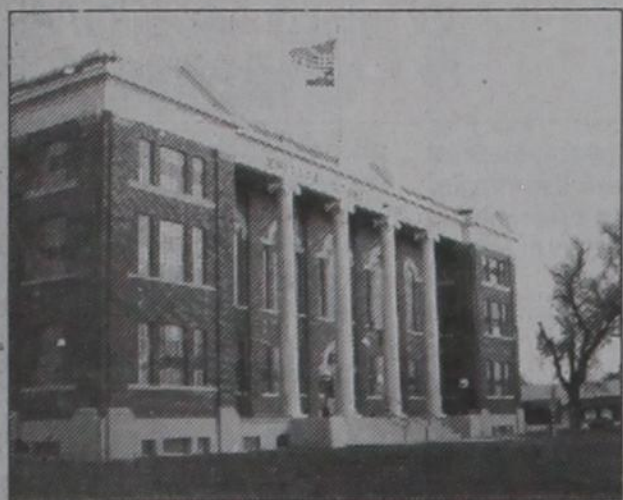

Parkview Hospital Board Meets

AUGUST 21, 2006

Chairman Dean Tipps declared that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Parkview Hospital Board Room.

Present were: Dean Tipps, Chairman; Thomas Helton, Vice Chairman; James Batton, Dale Garner

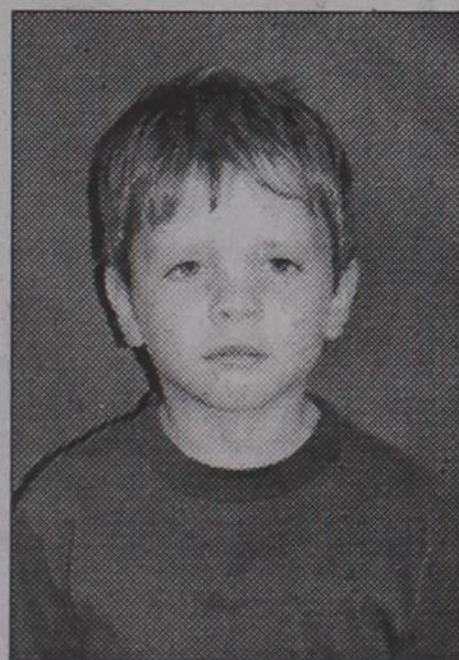
Absent: Sue Chandler, Secretary

Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN

Noel Walton, Eastern Panhandle Insurance

The agenda was amended to allow Noel Walton to discuss Agenda items 8 and 9. Mr. Walton presented the different types of bonds available to cover the administrator and members of the Board of Directors. Our enabling legislation states that each board member shall be bonded for \$1000 per year for the term of office (two years). Policy states that the administrator is to be bonded for \$50,000. Discussion followed. Mr. Walton stated that we already have a \$2500 Dishonesty Bond which covers all employees of the district. Following more questions and discussion Jim Batton made a motion that we increase the amount of the dishonesty bond to \$10,000; obtain a bond of \$50,000 for the administrator and a bond for \$1000 for each of the board members. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Walton then gave an in depth presentation about business interruption insurance. There was much discussion regarding this type of insurance, whether or not we may need it, what is covered and is not covered. Chairman Tipps thanked Mr. Walton for his presentation and stated that we

will consider this at a future meeting. Mr. Walton left the meeting at this time.

James Batton made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 2006 meeting. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Dale Garner made a motion to approve payment of the bills. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented financial statements, investment report and statistics. There was some discussion regarding changing interest rates for short-term certificates of deposit but no changes were recommended. James Batton made a motion to approve the reports as presented. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented bad debts and charity write off accounts. There was some discussion regarding the auditor's comments that we need to do charity Write offs monthly. Accounts were reviewed and Dale Garner made a motion to approve the write offs as presented. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

QAPI minutes and scorecards for July 2006 were presented for review and comment. James Batton made a motion to approve and Thomas Helton seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the proposed operating budget and capital expenditure budget for 2006-2007. There were several questions regarding revenue estimates for MRI services which begin in September. Thomas Helton made a motion to approve the budgets as proposed. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Chairman Tipps led the discussion regarding the new rules for setting the tax rate. Ms. Fagan Cook went over the worksheets from the Tax Assessor and Collector which determine what the effective tax rate is as well as the roll-back rate. After some further discussion James Batton made a motion to adopt a 2006 tax rate equal to the effective tax rate of \$0.13305 per \$100 of value which would increase taxes compared to 2005 taxes by \$137,694. Dale Garner seconded the motion that carried unanimously.

Notice of City of Wheeler . . .

Drinking Water Nitrate Violation

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the City of Wheeler water system that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for NITRATE. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for NITRATE at 10mg/L, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of drinking water in your community for NITRATE INDICATES A LEVEL OF 10.5 mg/L.

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not recommended for nitrate removal.

Commissioners' Court Meets Mon., Aug. 28

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, August 28, 2006 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom in the Wheeler County courthouse.

Eighteen items were on the agenda.

The court approved the hourly payroll time sheets for payment. The commissioners voted to pay the bill as approved.

No action was taken on the budget.

The Treasurer's and Tax Assessor/Collector's reports were accepted.

Danny Debose, representing Enbridge Pipeline met with the court to present a booklet on pipeline safety and see if the court had any problems or questions for Enbridge. The court appreciated his visit.

Samson Resources was given permission to cross Co. Rd. 13 for the installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

The commissioners agreed to enter into a contract for 2007 Texas VINE Annual Maintenance Grant. Sheriffs' and Constables' Fees for 2007 will not be changed.

The court agreed to a salary supplement for the Election Administrator. County Clerk Margaret Dorman serves as Election Administrator. Since the acquisition of the computers for conducting the election, a lot of responsibility has been added to her job. A \$3000 supplement will go into affect October 1, 2006.

County treasurer, Juana Benefield, and County Clerk, Margaret Dorman had gone over the County Policy Manual and recommended some updates in wording. The commissioners agreed with the changes and a new policy manual will be printed and given the employees.

The court voted to send a letter of employee certification for TCDRS enrollment.

The retired county employees will be receiving a 'cost of living adjustment' on their retirement checks January 1, 2007.

The county will be renewing their insurance with TAC—medical and dental policy for the county employees.

Art Taylor, Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2, asked for approval of changes in his personnel. The addition of Darla Reeves to the payroll as part time employee, effective 08/07/06 at \$7.50 per hour was approved.

Taylor asked for the removal of Elizabeth Corchado from payroll effective 08/18/06; it was approved by the court.

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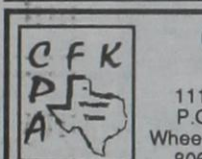

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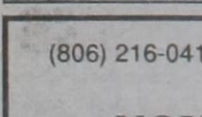

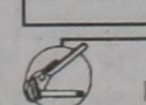

The other day we dropped in at the Social Security office in Pampa to ask a couple of questions. I got the shock of my California life as we were the only ones in there on a Friday afternoon. The lady at one of the windows ask us to take a number, which we did and before we got sat down, she called us and took our number and ask if she could help. We were out of there and on the way home with our answers in approximately 4 minutes..... I know this is hard for my friends in California to believe, but I am not kidding. In California, we have to call ahead - way ahead and get an appointment. Then wait in the waiting room just like when you visit the doctor or dentist office. Heaven help you if you forgot even a page of your paper work. Out there you plan to be there for hours where here it takes minutes. Really shocked me as I have been in the Social Security Offices in Los Angeles and Orange County with friends, relatives and myself on business many, many times.

Glenn and I got another shock this week when one of our two small roosters laid an egg about the size of a half dollar. It would take 3 of them to equal a regular size egg. You could describe them as oversized crows and I thought maybe Brother Johnson would like to have more fried chicken since we do not want anymore roosters. They were hatched by my late Gertrude and Red last spring, but the eggs belonged to Blackie who is a Silky bantam. Their dad is Henry so it is quite a funny mixture and I'm thinking we have made a new breed of bantams. Since they looked like baby roosters, the egg laying saved their lives. I am sure glad our income does not depend on egg production.

Glenn is talking about raising waterfowl on the pond on the farm. I do not even want to see one after hearing the name. We do not do waterfowl in California and as far as I know I have never seen one. Sure sounds odd. He said they use them in catching fish, but as far as I am concerned, we do very well on nibbles - those little things that look like tiny marshmallows. Worms and any live bait are for other fishermen not me! I told Glenn that if they have legs they would probably walk away from the pond anyway. I guess it will be a long time before I understand this part of the country, but I am learning.

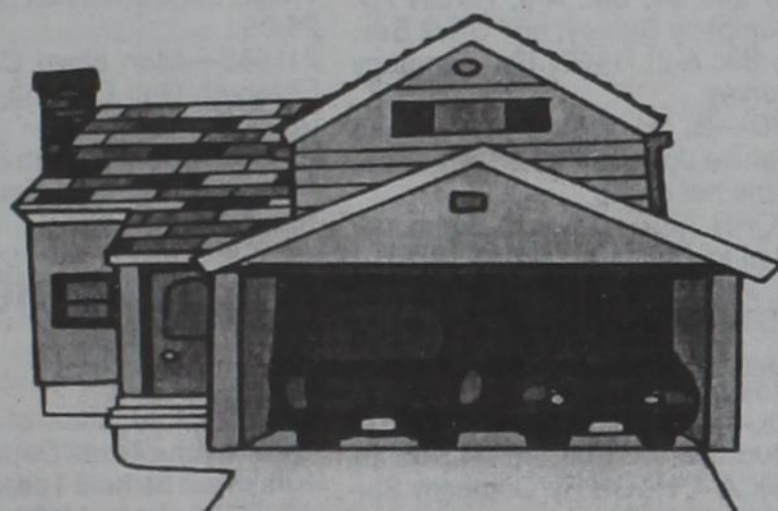

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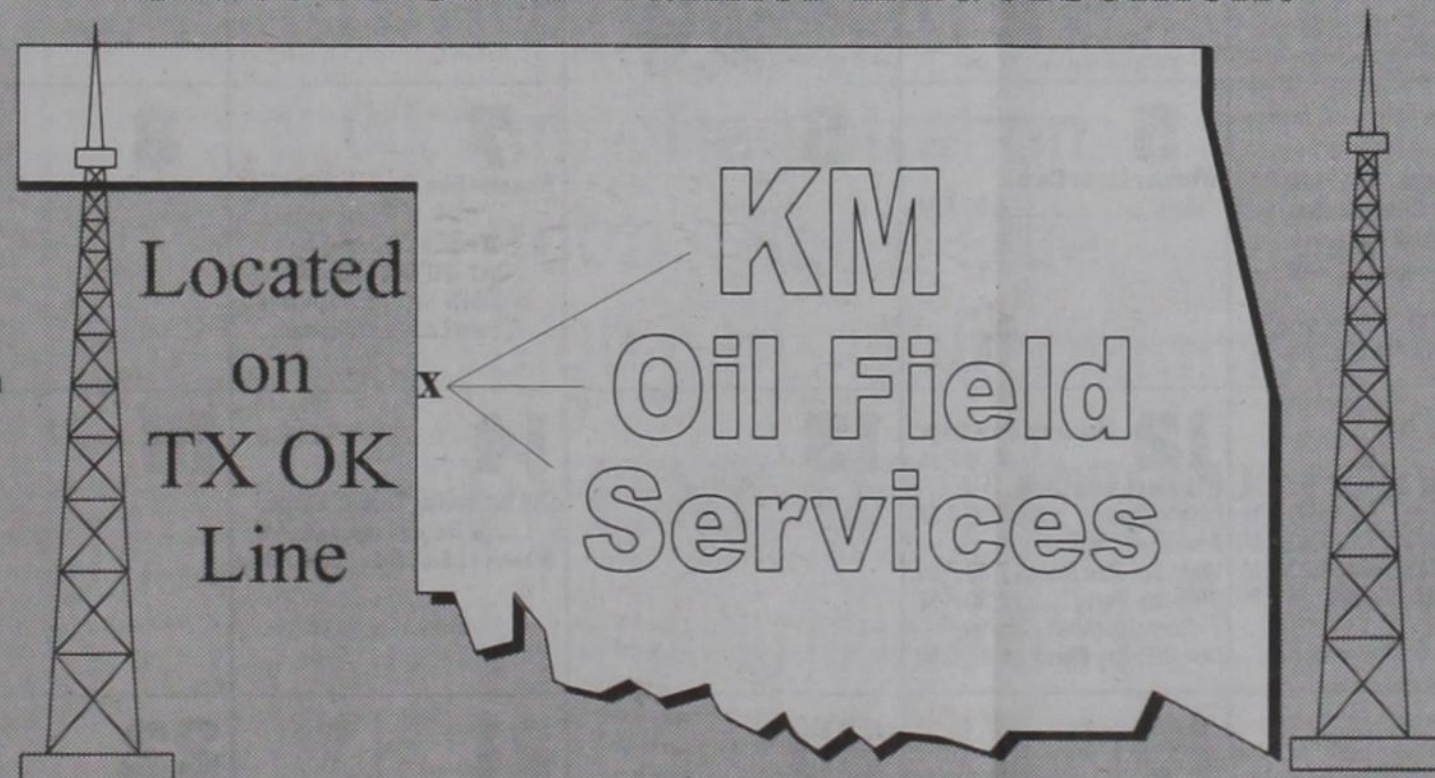

pared for a disaster, every person in that community needs to take the steps to become disaster-ready.

Known for its educators/agents in counties throughout the country, the Extension Service is a valuable resource concerning disaster education. Through a nationwide network known as the Extension Disaster Education Network (EDEN), your local County Extension office is readily connected to expert materials in disaster preparedness, recovery and response from Land Grant universities nationwide.

Being disaster prepared is more than just knowing what to do in case of a tornado or a fire. It's also about preparing a 72-hour disaster supplies kit for your home, office and car; developing and practicing an emergency plan for your family; understanding your community's warning systems and

evacuation routes; knowing who to contact in your community for more information, and how you can get involved.

Disasters are like pop quizzes - most often they are unpredictable. If you are not prepared, they can be devastating. The more you prepare, the better you will know exactly what to do and where to go. No matter how much you have prepared, it is important to have a resource you can rely on for disaster education. Your local Wheeler County Extension office can be that resource at 826-5243. "Red River Quail Symposium"

Texas Cooperative Extension will co-host the "Red River Quail Symposium" Oct. 11-13 at Wichita Falls.

Dr. Dale Rollins, Extension wildlife specialist at San Angelo, said the symposium's theme will be "Habitat Management and Hunting in Transition."

"Those transitions include the importance of hunting leases versus grazing as income for landowners, management strategies for smaller tracts and new technologies shaping quail habitat," Rollins said. "If you're a quail hunter or a landowner who caters to quail hunters, there should be several items of interest to you at this program."

Bobwhite populations have historically been strong in the Red River Basin, and especially so west of Interstate 35, he said

However populations have dropped significantly over much of this range in the past 20 years.

"The desire for good quail hunting has driven up real estate prices in this region," he said. "Thus we have a growing number of people who want their land management to benefit quail first and livestock second. But we still have lots of ranchers whose priority is cattle first and quail second. We'll feature several presentation on how grazing can be employed to improve quail habitat."

Extension has conducted several "Quail Appreciation Days" and "West Texas Quail Study Groups" in recent years, but this symposium will be the first to be co-hosted by the Bollenbach Quail Management program at Oklahoma State University, Rollins said.
