TEXAS PROS. CALLED TO HOLD SUBMISSION RALLIES.

Dallas Texas, May 27.—A call for the prohibitionists of Texas to assemble at their respective county seats next Saturday, June 3, for the purpose of organizing county submission clubs, was issued today by R. Harper Kirby of Austin, president of the Anti Saloon League of Texas. The call was given out from the office of the league's headquarters in Dallas.

"The Democrats in each county who favor submission and State wide prohibition should immediately organize their county forces so that every possible effort may be put forth to carry submission at the July primaries," Kirby said in a statement accompanying the call.

The Anti Saloon League, which has been circulating petitions asking for the placing of submission of a constitutional amendment for State wide prohibition in Texas on the ballot during the coming primaries, has almost enough signatures to require the State Democratic Executive Committee to submit submission Forty thousand names are required.

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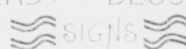
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
