## Drought Meeting

The drought meeting at Amarillo, held July 10 by Governor Shivers was attended by J. D. Swift, County Judge Jack Gray, and County Agent H. M. Breedlove. The municipal auditorium was filled to capacity. The president pledged his support to the drought stricken areas, and said that relief would be given farmers and ranchers during this emergency.

Governor Shivers asked for suggestions on what the counties needed, and H. M. Breedlove responded for Donley County, asking for long range credit with low interest rates, planting seed for winter legumes and small grains and spring planting seed. He asked for hay at once and plenty of it. He asked that corn, oats, meal and syrup mixtures be permitted for range pellets for livestock, therefore giving a better balanced ration than straight cotton seed cake and meal at this time, but said both would be needed with plenty of forage to make the winter.

Mr. Shivers answered that the department had men in the field now locating hay and that the program would start as soon as sufficient hay was located. He also stated that loan programs with liberal restrictions were being perfected.

At the present time there is over forty-one cars of feed ordered for Donley county. This consists of cotton seed cake, meal, oats, corn, and wheat. The orders are being taken at the local PMA office. The price of corn is \$1.00 per bushel, meal and cake is \$35 per ton, oats is 50¢ per bushel, and wheat is \$1.10 per bushel. Up to this time six cars have been received in the county.
