

# Doran is named Officer of the Year

Rockport Police Officer Edward P. Doran has been named Police Officer of the Year by the American Police Hall of Fame.

The national citation was presented to Doran in ceremonies at 2 p.m. Sunday. Making the presentation was Rockport City Manager Herman Johnson.

This is the first time for the presentation of this award to a Rockport officer, according

to Johnson and Rockport Police Chief Joe Hinojosa. Along with the citation, Doran's name will be placed in the Police Academy as an award recipient.

"I can't think of anybody else more deserving than Doran for this award," Chief Hinojosa said following the presentation.

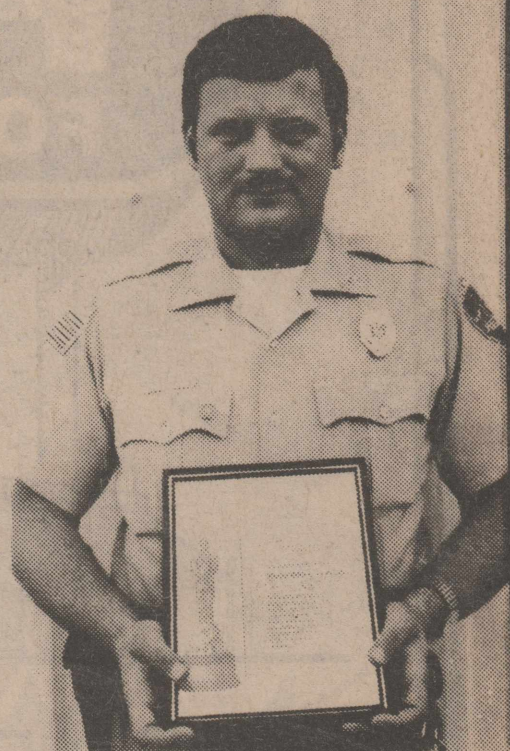
He added that Doran, a member of the Rockport force since Oct. 1, 1981, "has been

doing an outstanding job in everything — above and beyond the call of duty."

The Chief said he has received several letters from Rockport citizens commending officer Doran. Hinojosa himself issued a commendation to the officer last year for Doran's response to an alarm at the Escondido Gallery involving a burglar still inside the building.

The American Police Hall of Fame award was presented by Robert Ferguson, honorary president of the APHF awards committee who, in a letter addressed to the community, said, "Too often we take for granted the vigil of our nation's law enforcement officers to protect life and property."

# Funds voted for path

The Aransas County commissioners unanimously approved a motion to donate \$1,200 in county funds to the application for a grant from the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department for construction of a hiking-bicycling-jogging path along the bay side of Fulton Beach Road during a special meeting Friday. Each of the four county commissioners donated \$300 from his precinct fund the project.

The motion came during a joint meeting of the commissioners court, the Town of Fulton and the Aransas County Navigation District. Fulton officials originally had hoped to extend the path down the full length of the beach road from Traylor St. to Live Oak Point along the county right-of-way, but Aransas County Judge John D. Wendell told those present that the county does not own all of the land on the bay side of the road. He said that the county right-of-way is in most cases much less than the 60 feet along regular roadways due to the changing shoreline. In addition, Wendell said, permission for easement for the path must be obtained from landowners along the way.

Ken Pagans, an advisor with the Texas A&M University Marine Advisory Service, said that easements or donations of private property are considered charitable donations and contribute to in-kind funds from TP&WD.

The path will be offset four feet from the shoulder of Fulton Beach Road and will be six feet wide. An engineering study will be made to determine what materials will best hold up in adverse conditions, as well as overall feasibility of the project, by Olson Associates. Proponents of the project had originally suggested using asphalt materials for construction, a point which came under fire from various persons. Olson will charge \$1,200 per applicant (if there are three applicants) for engineering consultation work.

Several persons strongly objected to the use of asphalt, saying it would not hold up during severe storms. "A bicycle path (made of asphalt) wouldn't last three hours," said Wendell. "It needs to be made out of concrete."

Most everyone agreed that the shoreline needs to be bulkheaded in several places to

prevent the path from washing away. However, Pagans explained, TP&WD will not fund erosion control projects. He said that if application is made and the project approved for grant funds and the path turns out not to be a feasible project, it could be replaced with a viable alternative.

Several persons stated that the shoreline will probably have to be bulkheaded to protect the path. It was estimated that a 10-foot bulkhead with a cap would cost approximately \$60 per foot to construct.

ACND Commissioner Bobby Landrum suggested that the path be started down by Fulton Mansion, where the shoreline is relatively protected, and run up just north of the ACND park — using the remainder of the grant money to improve the beach area near the harbor. The ACND, if it votes to join Fulton and the county in the project, wants to include improvement of the beach area as part of the project. The ACND wants to raise the concrete bulkhead along the beach two feet to allow a sandy beach to be made behind it. The Navigation District also wants to improve picnic facilities in the park area.

## After heart attack

# Sheriff Hewes reported 'stable'

Aransas County Sheriff Bob Hewes was listed in stable condition in Spohn Hospital, Corpus Christi, Monday after suffering a heart attack at his residence last Thursday, May 12.

A spokesman at the hospital reported Monday morning that Hewes, who was in the hospital's coronary care unit Friday, had been transferred to a room.

Hewes has been Aransas County sheriff for 15 years, since he was elected to his first

term of office in 1968. A native of Danville, Ill., and graduate of high school there, Hewes entered the U.S. Navy immediately following graduation and after a two-year tour of duty joined the Navy Air Force where he served for nearly 10 years.

Following discharge from the military, where most of his duties involved law enforcement work, Hewes served as a police officer in Aransas Pass for two years and a deputy sheriff in San Patricio County,

serving in the Ingleside-Aransas Pass area, for two and a half years.

He served as chief deputy for Aransas County prior to becoming chief of the Rockport Police Department in 1964. He served as police chief until his election as sheriff.

He has been active in the VFW and is currently involved with the Aransas County unit of the Salvation Army.

# Tourist Association adds to Paws & Taws Building relocation fund

The Rockport-Fulton Tourist Association (RFTA) became the latest organization to donate to the Paws & Taws relocation fund, with presentation of a \$1,000 check to the Paws & Taws Inc. directors by RFTA President Allen Ray Moers.

The presentation was made this past week. At the same time, seven limited edition prints have been placed on exhibit at Allied Live Oak and First National banks with bids being invited in a "silent auction." The prints will also be displayed, and additional bids accepted, at the RFTA banquet May 19 and the Rockport Area Chamber of Commerce banquet June 4.

Established to promote tourism in the

area, with emphasis on the Winter Texans who come to Aransas County each year, the Rockport-Fulton Tourist Association has had its headquarters at the Paws & Taws Building for the past two years.

At their own expense, RFTA members constructed a small air-conditioned office on a portion of the front porch of the Paws & Taws Building and maintain a paid secretary, Liz Phillips, daily Monday through Friday to handle phone and mail inquiries and distribute information on the area to the average 200 tourists per month who stop in.

The Paws & Taws Building serves as the site of RFTA activities for Winter Texans,

including the weekly bingo games and potluck suppers, and activities of Winter Texans themselves such as the state "Days" when residents of a particular state get together for refreshments and a program.

Other activities of the RFTA include advertising in publications from the Florida coast to the tip of Texas to promote Aransas County for tourism and provision of brochures on the Rockport-Fulton area at all points of entry into Texas. The RFTA has personal representation at the annual boat show in Houston where they distribute pamphlets promoting the area.

The association was formed in 1971 by a small group of motel owners and now has a

membership in excess of 100.

Donations to the Paws & Taws moving fund now total \$3,682.35 since the fund drive was launched by a \$1,000 check from the Fulton Oysterfest. All funds will be used to help pay the estimated \$30,000 cost of moving the Paws & Taws Building from its present location to a new site near Fulton Harbor.

Other fund-raising activities planned by Paws & Taws Inc. (PTI) include a dance on June 4 and a Mexican breakfast-lunch on June 5 as well as the auction of the limited edition prints.

The prints, donated by the Rockport-Fulton Association of Ducks Unlimited, include Herb Booth's "Blowin' In," number

15 of 600 prints; John L. Carter's "Deadwood Bottoms — Pintails," number 187 of 150; Milton Fontenot, "Spring's Leaving Out," 137 of 300; O.J. Gromme, geese in flight, 553 of 950; and Gene Murray's colored ink pen drawing of ducks in flight, 672 of 700.

Also donated for the auction are Jerry Raedeke's "Feet Down at Dr. J's," number 1,928 of 3,000; and two prints by M. Wayne Willis: retriever with duck, 461 of 500, and "Flooded Stubblefield," number 328 of 500.

While the prints are on display at the banks, a bid may be made by signing the "silent auction" list that accompanies each print.

# Sales tax returns are up

In the face of a statewide trend of decreased sales tax revenues this month, Rockport showed an increase of nearly 30 percent and Fulton a more than 17 percent jump in sales tax collections so far in 1983 compared to the same period last year.

Sales tax returns for the month ending April 30 — representing sales made in March — amounted to \$64,876.28 for Rockport and \$6,889.08 for Fulton. Tax returns for the same period in 1982 were \$49,908.95 for Rockport, \$3,720.90 for Fulton.

In Rockport, this brought year-to-date sales tax collections to \$172,217.63, 29.47 percent over last year's \$133,020.46 total. In Fulton, year-to-date returns of \$18,312.36 were 17.11 percent ahead of last year's \$15,638.61.

Rockport and Fulton figures compared

favorably with sales tax returns to other area cities, which showed for the most part either small gains or losses in 1983 totals compared to 1982.

In Aransas Pass, the May sales tax rebate amounted to \$54,571.20, a drop of more than \$6,000 from 1982 returns and the year-to-date total of \$169,326.66 was 5.69 percent below the total for the first four months of 1982.

Ingleside's year-to-date totals, \$47,319.20, were 15.71 percent below last year's, although the city's April tax rebate of \$18,093.15 was approximately \$970 higher than for the same month in 1982.

Portland showed a 20 percent gain in year-to-date sales tax returns and Sinton's year-to-date totals are 21.89 percent ahead of last year.

Included on the agenda will be a report on a Coastal Bend Council of Government's advisory meeting on the area's recreational needs and a report on a contract dealing with retaining of John Olson and Associates to do a study of Rockport's park facilities.

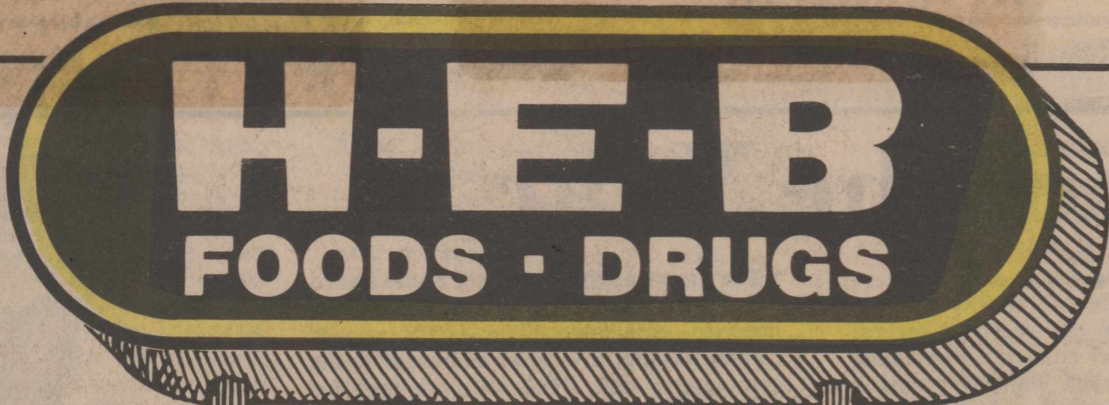
Hiring of Olson's architectural firm as consultants for a survey of improvements and use of the city's park facilities was authorized at an April 25 meeting of the city council.

The study is the first step as the city eyes the possibility of applying for a portion of some \$3 million in matching funds grants that will be available, for a limited time, through the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department.

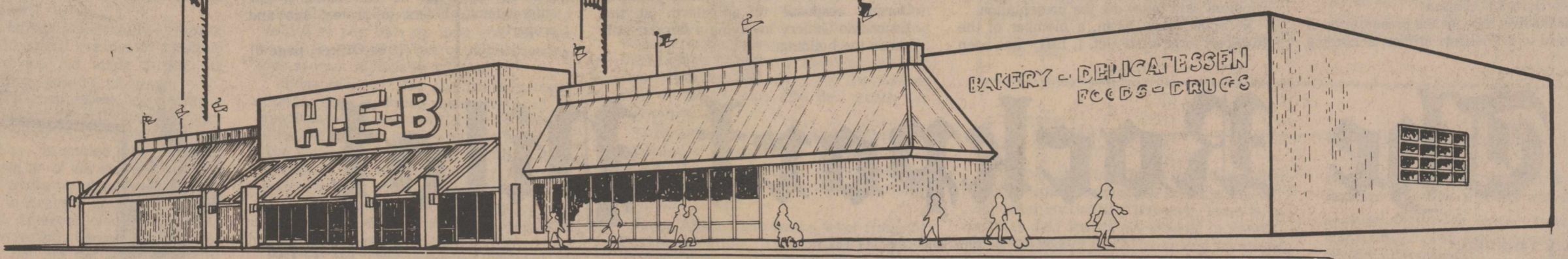
Also on the park board agenda will be discussion of possible projects to be included in the 1983-84 park budget request for the city.

# IWC announces plans for summer

SAN ANTONIO — Beginning June 1 Incarnate Word College will offer college students the additional two five-week summer terms, plus a new and innovative 10-week session, but the younger set will also have plenty to occupy their summer time.

For several years Incarnate Word College has offered a wide range of summer activities for children in recreation and the arts. This summer the span is from 3 to 19 and has grown to include computer literacy, reading improvement, ballet and driver education.

Students and their parents have the option of full or half-day programs, and the driver education program for 15-year-olds and older includes nighttime driving

experience.

The summer day camp for 6 to 12-year-olds includes swimming, gymnastics, tennis, movement exercise, art, music and dance. The morning sports programs are in three groups by age and the afternoon sessions are in music, art and dance.

A Reading Laboratory for ages six and up, including adults, offers remedial reading and help with study skills and content retention. The lab operates in the morning hours.

Both pre-teens and teens are eligible for a new addition to the summer schedule "Computer Literacy for Children and Teens," this is an introductory 10-hour course featuring hands-on computer experience in the IWC Computer Lab. The children's class is for ages 8-12 and the teen class from 13 to 19.

For the older set, the annual Teenage Summer Stock Theatre is a six-week full-range theatre program offered by Karen and Richard Jones, and it ends with a full theatre production open to the public. It begins June 13.

The IWC Ballet School summer course for 10 to 19-year-olds is a June 1 to July 1 daily program from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. in technique, pointe, floor or pool barre, plus stage makeup for ballet, ballet history and video study, terminology and character.

A state approved driver education class for those 15 or older (limit 12 students) includes classroom and behind the wheel experience.

Fees for the various IWC summer youth programs vary with the type of program, full or half-day, and the number of children from one family attending.

# Cheese giveaway cut back by USDA

COLLEGE STATION — The U.S. Department of Agriculture will be giving away less cheese due to a drop in commercial sales.

In ordering a 52 percent cutback in the cheese giveaway program that was started about a year ago, Secretary of Agriculture John Block cited two reasons — needy people who qualify for free cheese normally buy their own, and some people who are not so needy receive free cheese rather than buy it.

"Evidence that the cheese giveaway program was hurting cheese sales started showing up during the last quarter of 1982," said Dr. Bud Schwart, dairy marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

"During that quarter commercial sales were down 8 percent from a year earlier. But the real shocker came last February when commercial sales were down a staggering 20 percent from February of 1982."

The cheese giveaway program was started in early 1982 as a means of reducing government stocks of dairy products purchased under the dairy program. More than 50 million pounds of cheese had been given away each month before the cutback.

"Not having outlets for surplus dairy products complicates the problem of what to do about dairy policy," said Schwart. "The USDA has imposed a 50 cents per hundredweight tax on milk producers to try to discourage increased production which has been hurting the dairy industry in recent years. The assessment will pay part of the cost of the dairy program and will hopefully turn milk production around from its persistent upward trend," he noted.

Wendell told those present that the county has no money budgeted for any projects and the only possibility for county funds would have to come from each commissioner's precinct fund. Each of the four commissioners agreed to give \$300 from his precinct fund toward the project application. "If we don't ever start on it, it will never get done," said Precinct 44A Commissioner Mike Womack. "We've got to start on it this year and continue it next year and keep it up until it's done."

The ACND has not yet formally agreed to participate although it is expected a motion to that effect will be made during the Tuesday evening, May 17, meeting.

After the joint meeting the court heard a presentation from Kenneth Moseley, vice president and comptroller of Allied Live Oak Bank. Moseley examined the county's balance figures as of the end of April and analyzed the return on county investments.

According to Aransas County Treasurer Marvin Wix, interest-earning checking accounts have recently become available for public funds but are not included in the depository contract the county holds with

Allied Live Oak. Allied attorneys are currently looking into whether or not a county request for the interest-earning checking accounts (NOW accounts) would be considered a breach of contract. A decision is expected sometime this week.

Moseley suggested putting county funds into 14-day certificates of deposit at an interest rate of 10 percent for deposits of \$100,000 and above. He also suggested that these CDs could be staggered at various intervals to give county funds the liquidity needed to pay bills on time and that the county try to keep advised or all bills coming due at least 15 days in advance.

Judge Wendell told the commissioners that the state is closing down several of the roadside parks because they have become dumping grounds and are hard to maintain. The state has notified the county that it intends to close the park on Hwy. 35 across from The Bull in Fulton, adjacent to T.R. Wendell's property. The state has told the county that it will give the park to the county if the county agrees to maintain it.

All of the commissioners declined to accept responsibility for maintenance of the

park and approved a resolution allowing the state to close and abandon it.

The court approved a one-year renewal of County Sanitarian Leonard Specht's contract. Specht works on a yearly contract, which means he is ineligible for social security or county insurance coverage. Specht's salary last year came to \$15,000 plus car allowance of \$350 per month. On his new contract, Specht requested a salary of \$19,000 plus \$350 per month car allowance. He cited his productivity and the fact that he is now a registered sanitarian as reasons for the increase. The court granted him a \$1,500 raise, bringing his salary for the coming year to \$16,500 plus \$350 per month car allowance.

In other court action, the commissioners approved a request from Aransas County Sheriff Robert O. Hewes asking that the travel allowance for conferences be raised from \$200 to \$300.

Judge Wendell also read a letter from the Rockport-Fulton Tourist Association inviting county officials to their annual banquet May 19.

Port Aransas received a \$30,409.06 check from the State Comptroller's office this month, bringing year-to-date collections to \$74,457.88, 14.32 percent above 1982 totals.

The monthly sales tax returns from State Comptroller Bob Bullock represent the cities' 1 percent revenue on taxable sales. The money is collected along with the state's 4 percent tax and is returned to the cities each month.

Statewide, Bullock sent checks totalling \$94.5 million in local payments to the 974

Texas cities that levy the 1 percent city sales tax.

Bullock said the total sales tax returns for the year so far amount to \$309.6 million, 2.7 percent below the total at this time last year.

Bullock added however that, "although these receipts are still running behind last year, we have seen a steady improvement for the past three months." Bullock predicted if this trend continues, "we should finish this year with a slight increase over 1982's totals."

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# Sea adventure awaits in Marine Awareness Camp

BAY CITY — Wanted. Adults interested in marine life, ecology, fishing, boating, diving and the seafaring life.

(i.e. 4-H, scouts, schools, etc.) which they are

Scout leaders, 4-H volunteers, school teachers, school club sponsors, etc. are the type of individuals the camp wishes to involve at the camp, and on a continuing basis, in youth marine education. However, others should not be discouraged from submitting their registration requests, as every effort will be made to accommodate those wishing to participate.

It should also be noted that this camp program is "not" for coastal residents only. Though they may seldom directly utilize the resources provided by the Gulf, bay, or beaches, the lives of inland residents are greatly influenced by — as well as have a tremendous influence on — these precious resources.

The youth of our state are the decision makers of the future, and as such, need to be adequately prepared to meet the resource challenges of tomorrow. Your involvement in this educational endeavor would be a welcomed and valued contribution.

The cost of attending this unique camp program is \$50 per adult, which covers the cost of room, board, tours and instructional materials. The \$50 registration fee represents a substantially subsidized rate; the young people attending will be charged \$75 each which also represents a subsidized amount.

## For pay increase

# Teachers march on Austin

Thousands of angry and frustrated Texas teachers will gather in Austin Saturday, May 21, to demonstrate to the Texas Legislature and the general public that they are "deadly serious" about a significant pay increase this year, according to officials of the 95,000 member Texas State Teachers Association.

TSTA this week urged members throughout Texas to come to Austin next weekend for an "education march" down Congress Avenue and a subsequent rally on the Capitol grounds.

TSTA President Barbara O'Neal said that early field reports indicate that thousands of Texas teachers and education supporters are responding.

"We want to make sure that the people of Texas realize that a very few

wealthy men in the Texas House of Representatives are willing to sacrifice the educational needs of this state simply for political expediency," she said. "That's outrageous and totally unacceptable to the majority of Texans."

"Education is at a critical crossroads. If we do not begin to address its needs during this session, we won't be able to halt the serious decline in quality education before the end of this century," the former Waco teacher added. "An entire generation of kids will be lost."

O'Neal said teachers' frustrations stem from lawmakers who tell them they can't have adequate salary increases for the next two years because such spending measures are recessionary.

"During the past decade, those same lawmakers told us that we couldn't have a living wage because those kinds of increases were too inflationary. Do teachers have to wait a lifetime for economic conditions to be perfect?" she asked.

Because of the expected crowds at Saturday's gathering, TSTA officials said they have secured satellite parking areas for teachers at northern and southern city limit sites.

"The 'education march' down Congress Avenue is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. and will conclude with a rally at the Capitol at 2 p.m."

Governor Mark White, all other statewide elected leaders and the entire 68th Legislature have been invited to participate in the rally.

## Test children early for color blindness

Only a very few people are completely color blind — that is, seeing everything in just black and white.

The most common color deficiency is red-color blindness, according to Growing Child, the monthly child development newsletter. It affects about one out of every 20 boys but only about one out of every 200 girls.

In red-green color blindness, a person has difficulty telling the

difference between green and red. Red and orange may appear as only slightly different shades of green. Sometimes a difference in brightness will be seen, or green and yellow will look very similar to red. But blues are usually easy to distinguish from each other and from reds and greens.

If a child, especially a boy, tends to confuse reds and greens with each other but not blues and yellows, he may very well have a red-green color deficiency, particularly if there are cases of color blindness on his mother's side of the family.

To test a child's color

discrimination, gather a number of small objects having the colors red, green and blue. Then ask the child to put objects together in the same pile if they have the same color.

You may have to give the child two things to begin with and ask him if they are the same color. Place them together or separately according to his answer, then ask if a third object is the same color as one of the piles. Continue this way until all the objects have been sorted.

If the child clearly makes three different piles, his color vision is probably normal, even if he has difficulty remembering the

names of colors or using them correctly. If he makes only two piles or has three or more piles of mixed colors, he may have some degree of color blindness. An optometrist or ophthalmologist can make a more complete diagnosis. If a child is color blind, what then? Unfortunately, there is no treatment or cure for color blindness. It is just something that has to be lived with.

Simply being aware of the fact of color-blindness can save some frustration when a child shows confusion of colors he would normally be expected to know.

If his teacher knows of the

color difficulty she will be able to make allowance for him during color activities. In adulthood, it will be best for a color-blind person to avoid occupations involving electricity or electronics, where color-coded wires could be confused. Fortunately, occupations that require good color discrimination are fairly few.

perform Saturday, May 21, are the premier aerobatic team of the Royal Air Force. The nine-member team will demonstrate the precision and capabilities of the British Aerospace Hawk aircraft. Their performance at NAS, Corpus Christi, is one stop of their 15-day good-will tour of the United States. The team will be performing at various military installations throughout the United States.

Robert A. "Bob" Hoover is one of America's foremost pilots, having earned his wings and then some. He was a combat pilot in World War II; a graduate of both the U.S. Navy and U.S. Air

Force test pilot schools. Today he is an aerobatic pilot who has appeared at thousands of air shows over a period of more than 35 years.

His precision aerial demonstration in the standard production Shrike Commander twin-engine business utility aircraft and the P-51 Mustang thrill millions of aviation enthusiasts each year. In 1966 he served as captain of the aerobatic team which represented the United States in the international competitions at Moscow. He has also appeared at a number of international demonstrations, including the Paris Air Show and the International Aerospace Show, Sao Paulo, Brazil.

The Confederate Air Force (CAF) was organized in the late 1950's when World War II aircraft were being systematically destroyed. Today, this non-profit, educational organization is dedicated to the preservation of the great combat aircraft. Located in Harlingen, it has

## Families are greatest saboteurs of obese people

HOUSTON — Some of the largest obstacles that moderately obese people face in their quest for slimmness may sit across the family dining table, according to a Baylor College of Medicine weight control expert.

The success of any diet depends not only on the motivation of the obese person, but also on realistically evaluating the environment, said John P. Foreyt, Ph.D., associate professor of medicine and psychiatry. That includes the level of social support from a spouse, family, friends and co-workers.

The family that chides an obese person about his weight and then brings home high calorie foods or demands fattening dishes for dinner isn't helping for a reason.

"Families are the single greatest saboteurs of obese people," Foreyt said. "You are going to have to face the fact there may be people out there who want you to be the way you are. They may have a need for you to be obese."

Foreyt said that, for example, a husband may feel more comfortable if his wife is fat; there is no threat that she will be attractive to someone else. Also, a husband may feel there is no need to look good himself if he feels his wife will always be there.

Foreyt said if there is a lack of support at home, an individual must recognize that the odds of losing weight are stacked against success. The next step is to try to get the family's support and get them involved.

"If they are not going to help you, you have to learn to deal with it without them," he said. You then have to weigh the benefits of losing weight against the problems it may cause at home. The first step toward change is understanding the barriers of change."

Foreyt said families should be complimentary and supportive, understanding of the psychological hell the obese person is going through.

"Dieting is extremely stressful and it causes all kinds of negative feelings," he said. "That person will tend to take it out on the family around them. The supportive family must understand the behavior is temporary, caused by the stress of dieting."

Understanding is also required from family and friends for the person who overcomes the odds and is successful in losing a significant amount of weight and keeping it off, perhaps for the first time.

"When people do succeed, they are different people and they need to be different people," Foreyt explained. "The spouse and family has to come to grips with the fact they are now living with a different person. That's often difficult for a family to do, because they have their habits too. Those habits need to change, just like the obese person's have changed. If that does not happen, often there is severe disruption within the family that will require professional help."

External factors aside, the obese person who loses weight has an even tougher foe to deal with: a self-image that continues to see a fat person.

Foreyt said that changing one's body image psychologically is the

biggest problem he deals with in weight control programs he supervises at Baylor and the Methodist Hospital. There are several positive things that can be done, however.

"First, throw out all your clothes," he advises. "Buy a completely new wardrobe. Look at yourself in the mirror. Look at how people are reacting to you differently. Learn to be

assertive, learn a different style of living. Do not be your same person. Join new groups where people did not know you as a fat person. Get involved with people who see you as you are now, not as you once were. Live a whole different life."

That is not an easy thing to do, Foreyt said, but it is the only way to successfully become a formerly fat person.

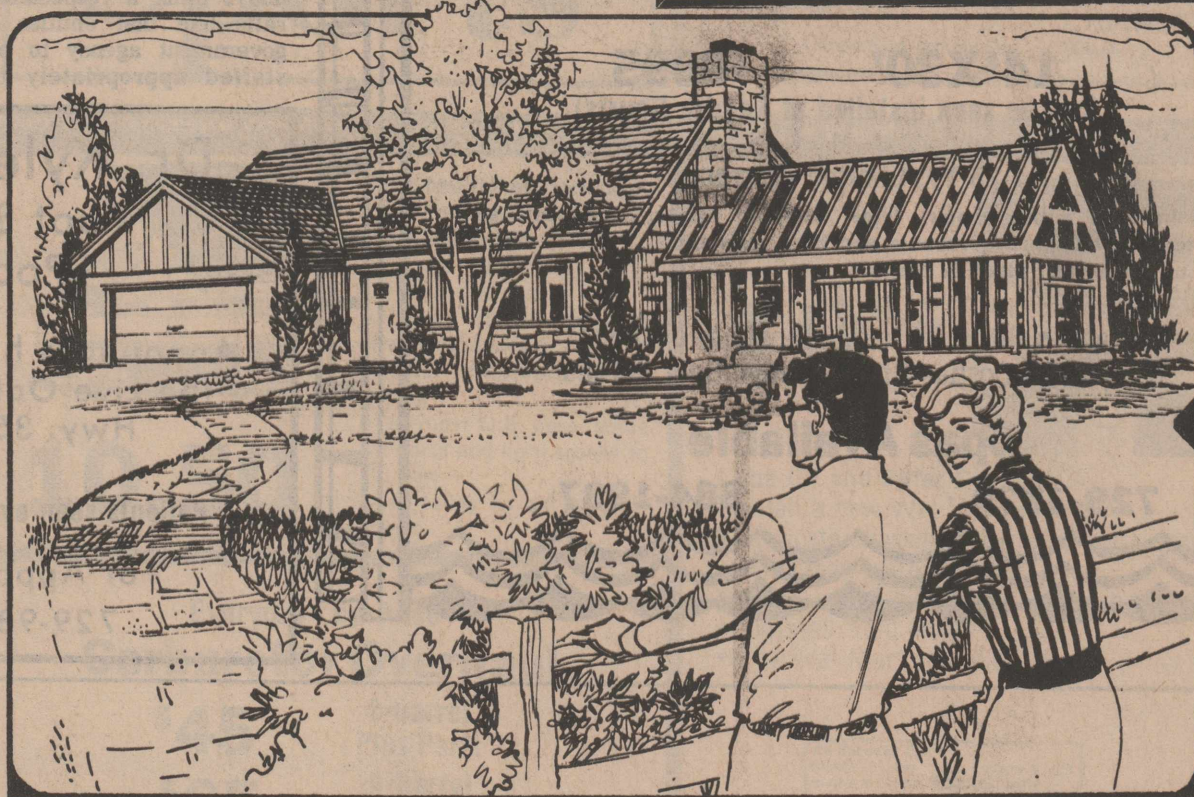
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## Bentsen amendments approved

WASHINGTON — The Senate Finance Committee approved Thursday a proposal by Senator Lloyd Bentsen blocking Administration plans to fire 2,000 employees of the U.S. Customs Service.

The committee also adopted a Bentsen amendment requiring

countries which benefit from the Caribbean Basin Initiative to help control the smuggling of illegal drugs to the United States.

Both proposals were approved unanimously by the committee.

"The border economy in Texas has been damaged severely by devaluation of

the Mexican peso. The U.S. government should not add to this area's problems by slashing the workforce of the Customs Service and slowing the flow of international commerce even further," Bentsen said following the committee vote.

"The Administration

budget for fiscal 1984 included only a 1 percent increase in funding for Customs, while proposing an increased emphasis on drug enforcement. The administration plan called for firing 2,000 Customs employees — including 918 inspectors, fully a fourth of the entire inspection force.

"Drug enforcement is important, and a federal crackdown on drug smuggling in Texas is overdue. But the Administration proposal would be robbing Peter to pay Paul and the hard-pressed border area would be victim."

The Bentsen proposal adopted by the committee increases the Customs Service authorization by \$33 million. This would prevent the mass dismissal of Customs employees and permit the Administration to carry out the bulk of drug enforcement activities it had planned.

"The Customs Service now earns about \$18 for every \$1 appropriated for it and I think a respectable ratio like that entitles a government agency to be staffed appropriately to

insure that our trade laws, as well as our criminal laws, are effectively enforced," Bentsen said.

"I am pleased that the Finance Committee has also adopted my amendment to the Caribbean Basin Initiative bill which would bar a country from receiving CBI benefits if that country fails to cooperate with U.S. efforts to combat illegal drug trafficking.

"I would note that other standards are required of the 28 nations and dependencies in the Caribbean Sea and Central America that are potentially eligible to participate in the CBI. And I would further note that a standard requiring cooperation on narcotics control is already established for those countries seeking duty preferences under the U.S. Generalized System of Preferences (GSP)," Bentsen said.

"Drug abuse is a serious and growing problem in this country. Including narcotics control standards in the CBI will assist in our efforts to win the war against drugs," Senator Bentsen said.

## A&M field day June 2

The biennial Field Day at the Texas A&M Research and Extension Center has been scheduled for Thursday, June 2.

In an effort to avoid midday heat, the field tours will be held before lunch, said Dr. George Slater, resident director of research at the center.

The program starts at 9 a.m. with a brief outline of the morning events by Slater before loading on trailers for visits to the various research plots.

A variety of activities and

exhibits will proceed simultaneously inside the center building itself for those who've finished the tour or have minimal interest in the test plots.

Among the indoor activities will be a hands-on demonstration of computer use and the latest agricultural software; an exhibition by top 4-H method demonstration teams plus craft exhibits and a photo display; the always popular plant clinic where homeowners may take their ailing favorites for expert diagnosis. Other exhibits will spotlight such activities as brush control, mariculture, food preservation, home economics and community development.

Additional displays will likely be added between now and the event itself, said Nelson Jacob, who's in charge of displays and exhibits for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Meanwhile, the crops and management tours will demonstrate the breadth of

agricultural research under way at the Clarkwood center. Naturally attuned to cotton and grain sorghum, the several tour stops will show work on fungicide seed treatment for downy mildew and midge control on milo; treatment thresholds for bollworms on cotton; new cotton and soybean varieties for the Coastal Bend; integrated brush management in South Texas; new herbicides for weed control in both cotton and grain sorghum, and energy-efficient tillage systems and micronutrient responses by row crops.

The scientist concerned will lead the discussion at each stop.

With 45 minutes scheduled between the end of the tours and the start of lunch at the center, plenty of time will be available to view the various exhibits, Jacob noted. An impressive display of farm equipment is planned, including one of the ultralite planes, which will demonstrate its particular qualities, wind conditions permitting.

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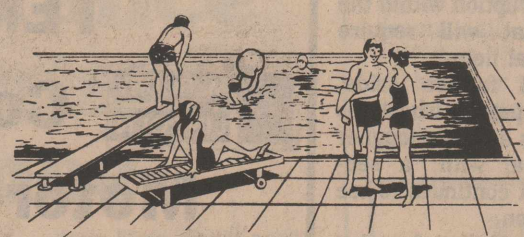
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## Foundation to make grants

One of the best gardening books we've seen is Neil Sperry's "Complete Guide to Texas Gardening". This Texas native not only has his own gardening talk show on KRLD radio in Dallas, but has presented over 1,000 gardening programs all across Texas. Mr. Sperry is a son of a Texas A&M faculty member and has accumulated over 25 years of experience as a professional and practicing horticulturist.

All too often authors aim their works at other parts of the country. Some how they just don't fit our soils and climates. Texas is a large state with widely varying weather conditions. You can add one week to each end of the growing season for every 100 miles you go south.

This book covers them all well. It goes into lawn problems, vegetable gardening, shade and fruit trees, shrub plants and more. What is the best fast-growing shade tree for our area? Can I just plant new sod or seed in the bare spots, or do I need to rototill it and start over completely? These are typical questions answered in this book. "Complete Guide to Texas Gardening" is published by Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas and should be available at any nursery in Texas. The price is \$24.95.

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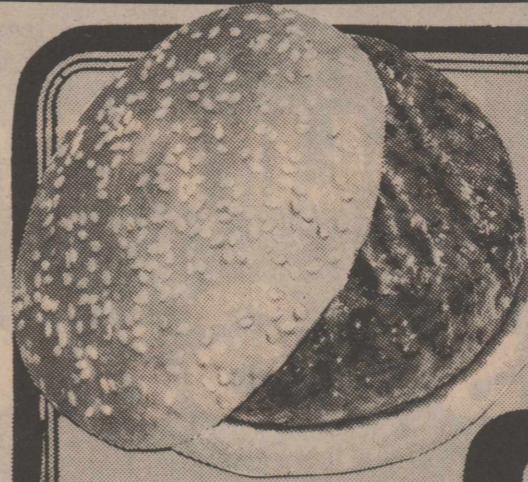






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# \$50 million in recent bond sales will maintain low rate for veteran's loans

AUSTIN — Texas Land Commissioner Garry Mauro has announced that the Veterans Land Board authorized the sale of an additional \$50 million in bonds for loans through the Veterans Land Program on May 10 which will maintain the current 8.5 percent interest rate on loans. Mauro, chairman of the Veterans Land Board, said, "Because the strength and stability of the program brought such a favorable bond sale, the Board can continue to offer 8.5 percent loans to veterans."

In addition to the \$50 million sold to provide new loans, the Board authorized the sale of an additional \$36 million to restructure the debt of the program. Eligible Texas veterans are able to borrow up to \$20,000 over a 40-year term

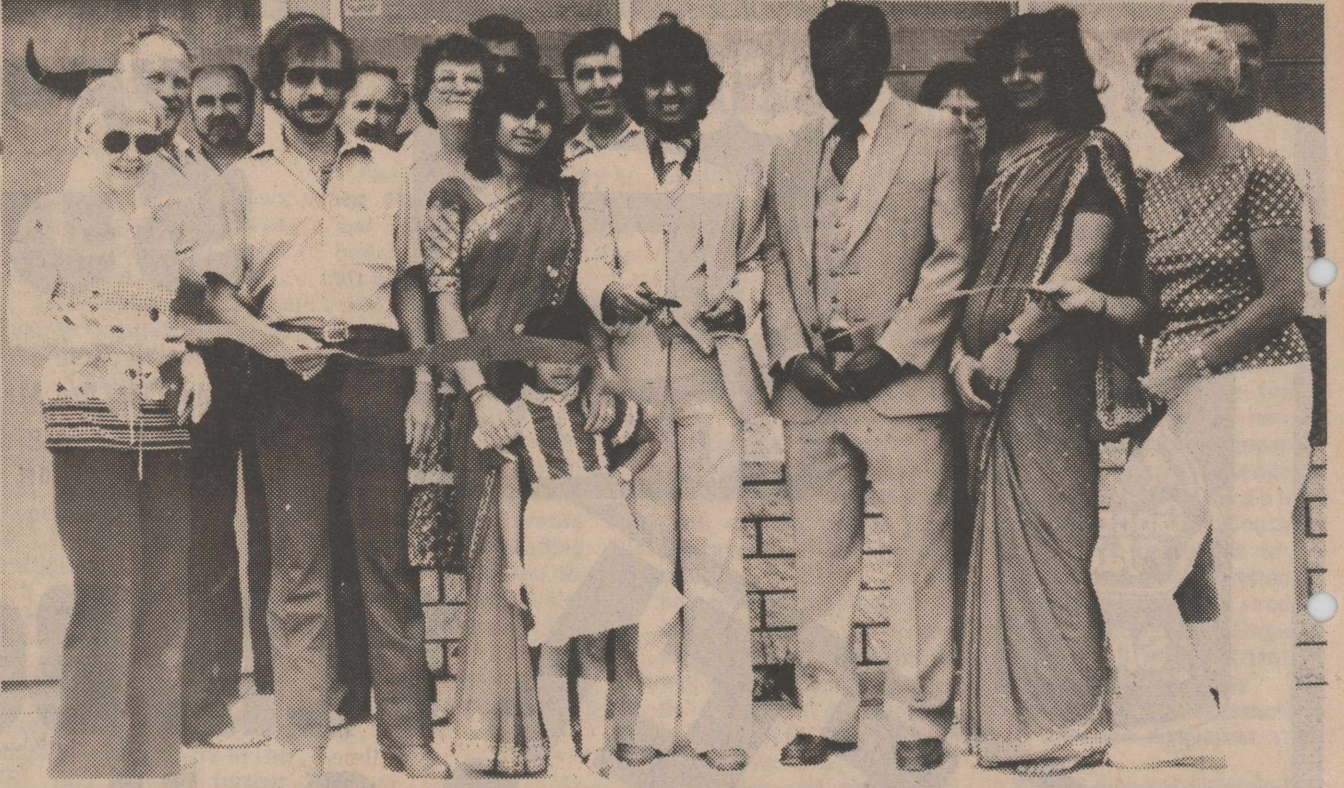
to purchase a minimum of 10 acres of land. Since the Veterans Land Program began in 1949, over 80,000 Texas veterans have participated in the loan program.

"The Veterans Land Program's very competitive interest rate, 5 percent down payment, semi-annual payments, and the long-term 40-year payoff period offer an excellent investment opportunity to all Texas veterans," Mauro stressed. "I encourage all eligible Texas veterans to participate in this outstanding program."

Mauro noted the situation for veterans applying for loans has changed dramatically since January 3. "When I first took office, we had over 14,000 veterans on the waiting list for loan applications. It was not uncommon for some loans to take longer than a year to close. We have now completely eliminated the waiting list and veterans who apply can expect their loans to be processed within 90 to 120 days," he said.

The Veterans Land Board sold \$50 million worth of bonds at a March 21 sale. This is the second sale of the \$250 million bonds authorized by Texas voters in 1981.

"The Veterans Land Program has provided thousands of Texas veterans the opportunity to purchase land. Since the loan program is supported by bonds, the entire program is operated at no cost to the taxpayers. With the next 5,000 loans approved by the Veterans Land Board, another \$100 million will be generated to the Texas economy," Mauro stated.

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## Parent input needed for study

LINCOLN, Neb. — Parents who have experienced the crisis of a stillbirth are needed as volunteers in a new study by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

"We are trying to find out how families cope when a baby is stillborn," Dr. John DeFraim, director of the Nation-Wide Stillbirth Family Study, explained. "There are 33,000 stillbirths in the U.S. each year, and hardly any research on what happens to people. We would guess that it is a tremendous crisis in their lives."

Interested fathers and mothers should write DeFraim at the Department of Human Development and the Family, UNL 68583. They will receive an anonymous questionnaire to fill out, post-paid, and results of the study will be mailed them when they are compiled.

Earlier research at UNL focused on Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and the family, and became the basis for a book on coping with sudden infant death. "It's amazing to me," DeFraim said, "that stillbirth effects four to six times more families than SIDS, and yet there is hardly any research on how these families survive."

## State of the region Government evaluation process changes

The ways that the United States government is evaluating the potential of minerals which may be recovered from its lands is in a state of flux. Before June, a determination is expected of how scientists are to proceed. A reorganization has occurred but the guidelines for the scientific work have not yet been issued.

For 16 years, an office of the U.S. Geological Survey had operated in the Coastal Bend. It carried out the marine program for the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean as other offices did for the Atlantic and Pacific. A wide variety of work was done including such projects as studying trace metals in bays and estuaries, and studying sediment to determine whether it would hold the legs of a rig or whether they would sink.

Another division of the U.S.C.G. had responsibility for collecting royalties. Valves were placed on storage tanks to register the amount of oil and gas withdrawn. It was found that many of these valves were being bypassed. To correct this situation, a new system of royalty accounting was set up in an agency called Mineral Management Service. Their guidelines were established and that system is functioning. Scientists were moved from the U.S.G.S. into the Minerals Management Service.

The order which made this change required that guidelines be in effect by June 1 for the agency to continue to exist. There is also an order in effect at this time that no data will be collected even though the agency's boat and gear are to be maintained.

The scientists in the Coastal Bend, an office of 25 people, are able to carry on their work as they have large amounts of data collected in 1967 and 1968 which they are analyzing. At this time, they are concentrating on source rock characterization. This can provide the government with a basis for determining what off-shore lands have a good potential for oil and gas production and which do not.

Five years from now, the government is opening up all federal lands on-shore and off-shore for leasing. No assessment can be made on some of it as no data has ever been collected. Data and assessment are particularly important to small oil companies, as large multinational companies can provide their own.

In this time of oil glut, leasing is at a minimum. In a recent sale in the eastern Gulf of Mexico, 5,000 blocks of land were put up for bids.

Only 20 bids were received on 12 of those blocks. But the time will come when the rush is on again and the amount the government receives from its leases can depend on reliable data.

Although concentration is on oil and gas, there are other mineral resources to be considered. The commodities involved in the program in the next largest amounts are sand and gravel. Large amounts from federal lands are to be sold to the State of Louisiana for beach replenishment. There are phosphate deposits off the shore of Florida which may be strip mined 20 or 30 years from now.

Oil and gas drilling is done on the side of salt domes. A recent study has shown that there are mineral resources, such as copper and zinc in commercial quantity in the caprock of these domes.

What directions the government will take in these programs will soon be known. They are of major importance to the economy of the Coastal Bend which has benefitted so much from off-shore activity and looks forward to even greater benefit in the future.

A wallet containing \$19 in cash and a credit card and a set of house keys were taken from the residence of Mrs. Zollie Glass in Holiday Beach on April 28.

A pickup truck belonging to Howard McNutt was reported damaged while it was parked in front of the sheriff's office between 8 and 11 p.m. April 22. Both side panels on the truck were damaged.

Sheriff's deputies made one arrest on May 6 on a charge of driving while intoxicated.

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## Journalism dominates fiction

FORT WORTH — Popular Texas novelist Larry McMurtry paints a gloomy picture about fiction.

"We live in an age that is dominated by journalism and journalists," McMurtry recently told a Texas Christian University audience, "and in the last 10 or 15 years journalism has virtually overwhelmed fiction."

The native Texan, author of such books as "Horseman, Pass By," "Leaving Cheyenne," "The Last Picture Show" and "Moving On," lectured twice during TCU's recent observance of Creative Writing Week. McMurtry was a TCU English instructor during the early 1960s.

One reason it is so hard for young writers to publish is

because fiction has practically stopped selling, McMurtry said. Journalistic books are selling instead.

"A generation of journalists has grown up who probably went to college and took creative writing courses, mastered the techniques and styles of fiction and applied them to subjects which allowed them to retain the appeal of fact," he pointed out. "These have practically taken away the market."

McMurtry believes there has always been a slight bias in the Anglo-Saxon world against that which is obviously a lie, such as a novel. Some 18th Century novelists like Cervantes, D'foe, Fielding would frequently try to disguise the fact that they were just making up a novel by pretending that it actually

was a manuscript discovered in a sea captain's chest.

McMurtry denied that he lifts the incidents in his books from the life of his home town, Archer City. "People always assume that a book like 'The Last Picture Show' is not something I made up. I did make up the book, though I used the locale and the general experience of growing up in a small Texas town."

He also is a movie writer and believes that "Texas is a definite plus in Hollywood." The movie "Hud" probably never would have been filmed at all if it had been set in Indiana.

"It had Texas going for it," McMurtry said, "and Hollywood likes the Texas outdoors."

## County businesses fail to respond to cancer drive

A lack of response from Aransas County's business sector is amounting to a \$2,000 shortfall in this year's Cancer Crusade compared to last year's campaign, according to Roy Olbrich, president of the Aransas County unit of the American Cancer Society.

Olbrich said the 1982 Crusade brought in more than \$11,000 in funds that are used to help pay for ACS programs in cancer research, education and service and rehabilitation aid to victims of the disease.

By comparison, he said, this year's Crusade, which is nearing completion in

Aransas County, has brought in only \$9,000 so far.

Olbrich said a lack of response from the business community is "the main problem" in meeting the Cancer Crusade goal. "I delivered some 200 envelopes with self-addressed stamped envelopes to area businesses," he said. "I've

received about 10 envelopes back."

He added it isn't too late for any businessman who wants to make a donation to do so. "I'll even provide them with another envelope," he said.

He said anyone who wants to make a donation to the Crusade can call him at 729-4385.

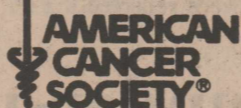

## THE FIX-IT SHOP

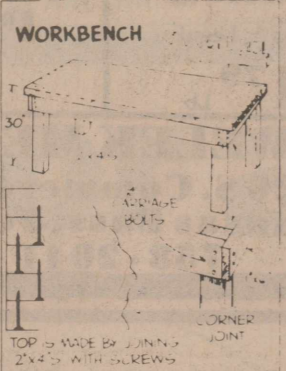


### BUILD A STRONG WORKBENCH

The heart of any workshop is the workbench. It should be heavy and sturdy enough to form a stable base for the materials being worked on. The size of this workbench is a suggested size, of course, and can be varied according to the needs of the individual user.

Materials required: Seven 2 X 4's, six feet long, for top; four 2 X 4's 28 inches long for legs; two lengths of 1 X 6's 5 1/2 feet long for front and back braces; two lengths of 1 X 6's, 25 inches long for side braces; twenty quarter-inch carriage bolts 1 1/2 inches long; about 3 dozen 2 1/2-inch wood screws.

First, fasten the front and back braces to the legs with the carriage bolts, checking with a T-square to make sure that the legs are at an exact 90-degree angle with the braces. After this is done, fasten the side



braces to the legs, again checking for a 90-degree angle between legs and braces.

Now you are ready to assemble the top of your workbench. Join together the six-foot lengths of 2 X 4's with the wood screws countersunk, making sure that the ends are flush with each other. Once the top is assembled, it is fastened to the legs with two of the wood screws at each corner. Seal wood with three coats of shellac and apply a coat of water-proof varnish.

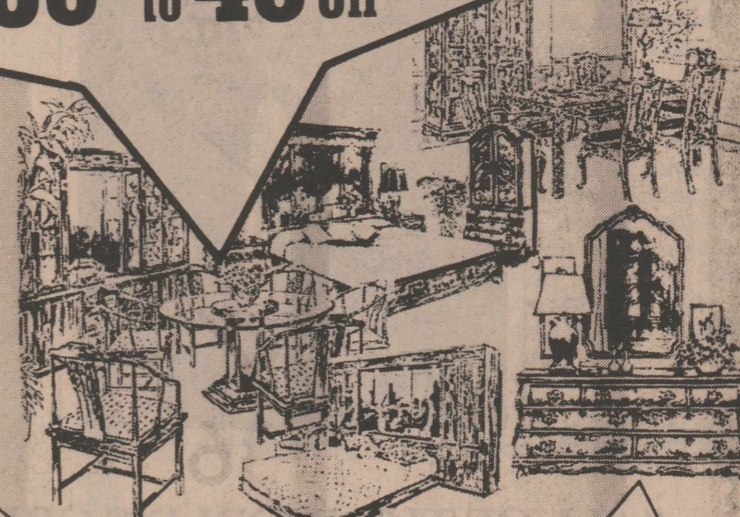

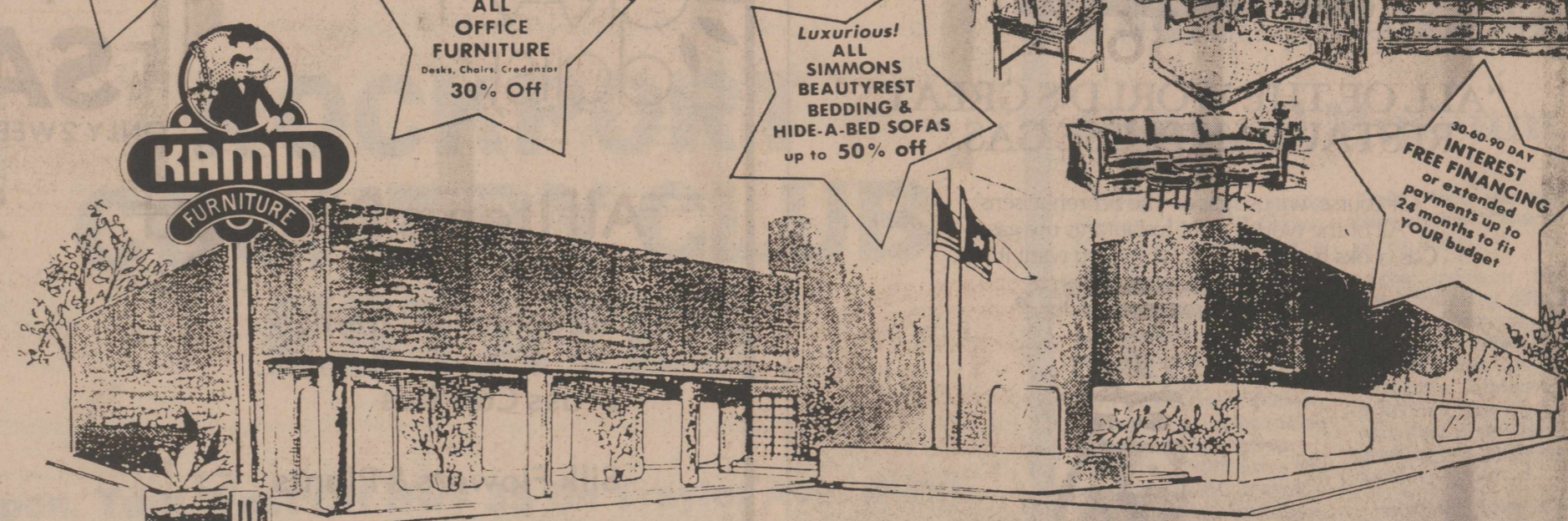

## Courtesy in boating is marine tradition

A pleasant surprise to novice boaters as they first take to the water is the courtesy skippers and crews show to one another, in sharp contrast to the ill-tempered outbursts a motorist can experience.

As the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary emphasizes in its free boating courses, good manners and courtesy — admirable traits at any time — are age-old traditions of the sea and become the hallmarks of the competent pleasure boater.

Also, as the number of vessels on our waterways increases enormously each year, such marine customs as common courtesy, good manners and the golden rule on the water become prime ingredients of boating safety.

Practicing these traditional amenities, Coast Guard Auxiliary instructors point out, is largely the exercising of common sense and fair play and respecting the rights of other boaters. And it sets an excellent example for the novice skipper.

In cruising you un-

doubtedly have had a hand wave from the crew of a passing vessel, an indicator of people enjoying their pastime. And you cheerfully responded.

There are a number of boating courtesies, and examples of bad and good boating manners, that are covered in Auxiliary public classes. Here are some of the more important:

**Speed** — Keep it down in narrow channels, anchorages, harbors, near docks and in the vicinity of fishing vessels, water skiers and small sailboats.

**Wakes** — Severe damage to moored vessels, docks and seawalls results from heavy wakes. Keep your wake down in confined areas. You can be liable for damages.

**Bow riding** — An extremely dangerous practice, especially where children are concerned.

**Buzzing** — The boating hot "rudder" shows his lack of courtesy by buzzing piers, swimming areas and other vessels.

**Pollution** — The considerate boater retains used cans, cartons, garbage

and other debris in a container until the cruise ends.

**Right-of-Way** — If the other boat fails to recognize your right-of-way, the well-mannered, prudent skipper will avoid a collision by giving way.

**Anchoring** — Only the thoughtless or selfish boater anchors in midchannel, or ties illegally to a buoy or navigation aid while fishing.

Giving the other fellow a helping hand when you spot a distress signal is the mark of marine courtesy. Even at the launching ramp, courtesy and good manners come into play. It may be something as simple as helping another boater launch his craft.

Coast Guard Auxiliary boating instructors stress that practicing courtesy and good manners is elementary but essential to developing boating skills and seamanship. ## Bluegill is under-utilized

The bluegill sunfish is one of the most under-utilized sportfish in Texas, according to Don Steinbach, fisheries specialist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. It is also the only species of sunfish that is capable of supplying forage for largemouth bass in smaller private lakes.

A perennial favorite of the young inexperienced angler, the bluegill sunfish also provides excellent recreational fishing for flyrod enthusiasts.

Because of its small mouth, the bluegill's food is restricted primarily to

insects and insect larvae such as dragonflies, damsel flies, aquatic beetle midgers and callis flies. Land dwelling insects often fall prey to the bluegill during the warmer seasons if they fall into the lake or pond.

More experienced anglers use wet or dry flies tied to simulate these kinds of insect larvae or adults to hook the bluegill. A very small hook, baited with small insects like grasshoppers or crickets or with earthworms often results in excellent catches.

Steinbach says certain characteristics of the

bluegill make it an excellent forage species for bass. Bluegill do not compete with the largemouth bass for food since the bass feeds primarily on fish while the bluegill sunfish is restricted to insects and other organisms that live at the bottom of the pond.

The multiple spawning characteristic of the bluegill provides small and intermediate size food for bass throughout the summer. No other sunfish can provide this same type food base for bass.

By properly utilizing bluegill sunfish in small lakes, the fisherman has an excellent source of food fish and also produces food for bass. If the bluegill population is not properly controlled, it can rapidly overpopulate in small ponds. Steinbach says this can be prevented by regulating the bass fishing so that no more than 20 to 25 bass per surface acre are harvested each year. By regulating the bass population in the small pond or lake, the bluegill sunfish population is kept down and provides large bluegill sunfish for angling.

## Horse short course planned

COLLEGE STATION — Horse enthusiasts will be treated to a wide range of activities at the 1983 Horse Short Course at Texas A&M University May 26-27.

Among these will be a session on management recommendations, a tour of Brazos County horse farms, a cutting horse training clinic, a horse sale and open cutting horse contests.

"This year's short course deals in all facets of the horse industry — production, management, training and use," says Dr. Doug Householder, horse specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension

Service, Texas A&M University System. The Extension Service is conducting the short course in conjunction with Texas A&M's Department of Animal Science.

"We are combining some key discussions on horse production with a training clinic and farm tours to see actual demonstrations and practical applications of various methods and techniques," adds Householder. "The sale the second day is designed to raise funds to complete the A&M Animal Science Department's N.W. 'Dick' Freeman Arena. Freeman contributed immensely to

Texas A&M's horse program as well as to the Texas horse industry."

Discussions during the opening session of the short course, which begins with registration at 7:30 a.m., include exercise physiology in horse training and conditioning, reproductive performance in broodmares, controlling flies on horse ranches and an overview of horse research at Texas A&M.

The Brazos County Extension Horse Committee is hosting a tour of county horse farms that afternoon. Stops will include the Hank Bird Quarter Horses and the Windham Ranch.

Buster Welch of Merkel, a professional horse trainer, will conduct a cutting horse clinic the first evening at Texas A&M's new livestock pavilion. The clinic will include live demonstrations on riding and training the cutting horse, notes Householder.

The special Freeman Arena Development Horse Sale will be featured the second day of the short course and will begin with registration at 7:30 a.m. at the livestock pavilion.

The two-day program of activities will conclude with an NCHA (National Cutting Horse Association) Open Cutting Horse Contest

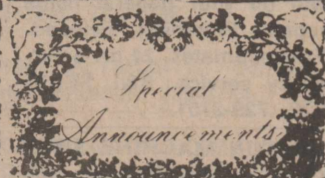

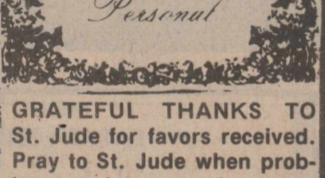

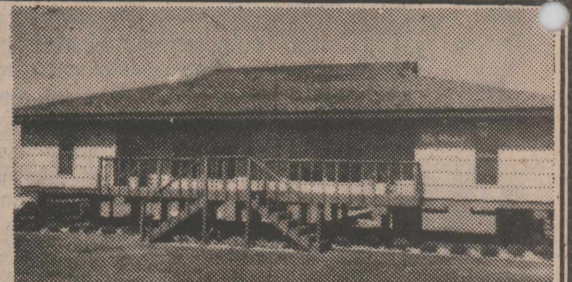

Ali MacGraw, her career blown backwards by the "Winds of War," is determined not to quit acting until she can go out as a winner. Stung by bad reviews for her performance in the \$40 million World War II mini-series, MacGraw will fight back in a new movie she's filming with George C. Scott in Hong Kong.

And even if it's her last film, MacGraw, 43, has vowed she'll never return to the desperate years of heartbreak that led her to experiment with drugs. "She'll fight back once she's over the pain," confides a Hollywood TV executive close to the actress. "She's a determined little fighter. Ali doesn't think of herself as an actress so much as a personality in the business. She's always been honest about that, so she's particularly destroyed to be attacked for something she's never claimed to be the best at."

Comebacks are nothing new for the beautiful star, who admits that she experimented with cocaine and marijuana during a five-year period of depression following her break-up with third husband Steve McQueen, whom she later learned was dying from cancer. "It was a very dramatic life with Steve," says MacGraw. "I still haven't recovered from his death. It devastated me then and it's still with me. I cried

all night long when I heard he was dying."

Then the star had to face the deaths of both parents. "My life was at its worst," she says. "I was at rock bottom and feeling as if nobody was around to love me. I felt so miserable I thought I was unattractive and unwanted. I sat on the floor and cried. The experiment with grass and cocaine didn't get me hooked. Neither are smart for people. It didn't take me very long to know they'd never work for me. I loathe it," she adds. "In every way they're bad for you. They wreck your health, your looks and they age you rapidly."

"I am highly-strung emotionally. My moods can change from white to black instantly. It's either wonderful or heartbreaking. It took a long time for me to decide to make a foray into television. But to be honest I needed to work. I needed the money. The problem with my life is that all my mistakes have always been so public. I've grown stronger from making them, and that's made me the survivor I believe I truly am."

What's the inside story on "Inside Story?" How do Hodding Carter and his team of media watchers decide what to watch? What to air? When to air it? How exactly do they do what they do? It's a long story. They do it with up to 1,400 minutes of material for each half-

hour of the GE-funded weekly series — more than 40 times as much footage as viewers see on PBS.

With anywhere from six to nine days of filming on location, with as many as six camera crews working on a single story. With as much as 90 hours of editing — about three hours per program minute. With final editing sometime pushed to a perilous 24 hours before airtime by late breaking developments. Those are the things that can be tallied.

But nobody — not Carter nor executive producer Ned Schurman, an equally avid media watcher — can even guesstimate the total hours behind each "Inside Story" edition. That's because the real inside story on "Inside Story" is rooted in questions about how — and how well — the press informs us that were raised months, even years, before the current third season was a glint in Hodding Carter's eye. "Ideas are constantly coming to us because the press, remarkably, has more and more become a major part of the stories it covers," says "Inside Story" anchorman and chief correspondent Carter. "This almost never-ending stream supplies us with the material to do our job, which is to report on how well the press does its job."

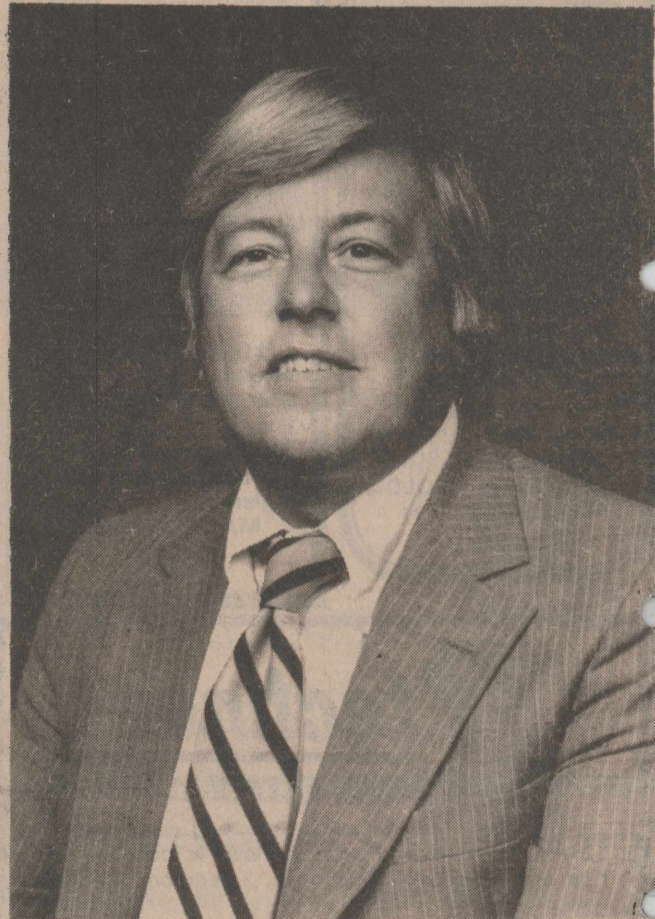

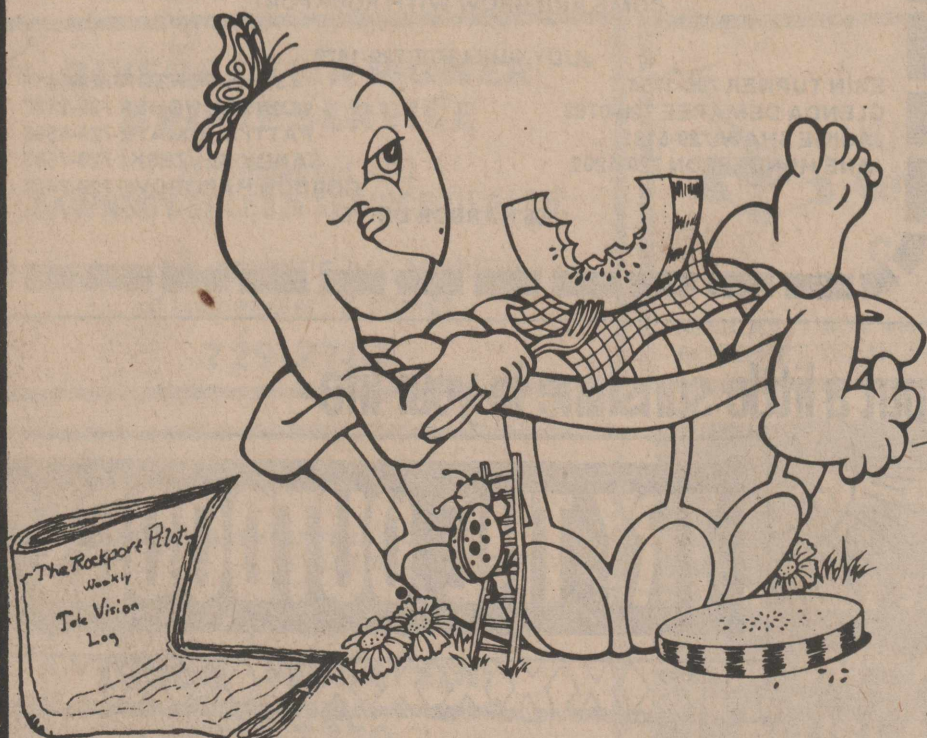
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
