## Reps: 'It's all about the money'

### Darby, Seliger say funding challenges will be immense for legislature

Texas state legislators will face a lot of needs — and not an overabundance of money to fill those needs — when they convene in Austin early next year.

That was the message Howard County's state representatives — Rep. Drew Darby and Sen. Kel Seliger — conveyed to the audience during Wednesday's Legislative Luncheon at Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

A crowd estimated at 150 people filed into the coliseum's East Room to hear Darby and Seliger talk about their expectations for the 85<sup>th</sup> Legislature, which convenes in January.

The next session of the Texas Legislature will have a myriad of issues to address, chief among them public education, healthcare and other social services, border security, and prisons — but finding the money to adequately address those needs will be the biggest challenge facing lawmakers, Darby said.

"It's all about the money," Darby said. "The reality is we have an economy that continues to expand, but not as fast as in the recent past. We're still seeing the effects of depressed prices in the oil and

gas sector." Issue No. 1, both men agree, will be public education financing.

"It's my top priority," Darby said. "Everything is on the table. When you have a

system that even the courts say is Byzantine at best, but constitutional, it's up to the legislature to try to address this. There's factors relating to school finance that are, frankly, outdated, and have

not been addressed in a number of years.

"We obviously have more growth in our schools, with more kiddos coming into our schools, so how do we make sure that how we fund

that makes some sense?" he added. "And, of course, it all relates to performance and accountability ... Hopefully, the legislature will be serious

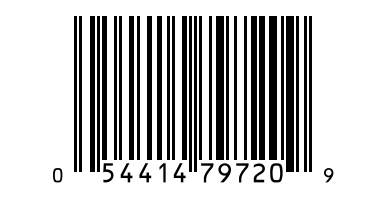
The church has been collecting items such as coats, blankets, scarves, and gloves since the beginning of fall

two major service projects.

First, club members routinely conduct vision screenings for area youth and provide glasses to children in needy families.

"We charge the fami-

lies based on their ability to pay for the glasses," Subia said. "If they can pay, the glasses cost \$18. If they can't pay, the glasses are free."

The other major project is the Texas Lions Camp, which is held each summer near Ker-ville for children with disabilities. At the camp, children can en-

gage in activities such as swimming and horseback riding while being supervised by medical personnel and volunteer counselors.

"Once they spend a week at our camp, they don't want to go home," Subia said.

West Texas Lions also support several projects within their respective

communities, such as donating to food pantries or providing week-end lunches for needy schoolchildren. In Midland, the club annually sponsors area students in foreign exchange projects to countries such as Italy or Germany, Subia said.

Persons joining the local chapter would

be required to pay a one-time charter fee of \$30. Monthly club dues would be determined by local chapter members, Subia said.

enough about those problems address those concerns."

"The fundamental question is, how much money are we going to put into public schools," Seliger said. "Clearly, the governor and lieutenant governor have indicated that vouchers are a very important issue to them, but are they to all the members of the legislators and the public as a whole? There's a lot of issues to talk about in public education, and we're going to spend a good part of the 85th Legislature talking about education and education finance."

While finding money for public education will likely garner most of the headlines during the next legislative session, other issues will

demand attention, Seliger said.

"Clearly, Medicare and Medicaid," Seliger said when asked to name other pressing issues facing legislators. "Healthcare will bankrupt this country and this state at some point, especially when so much of the (Gross Domestic Product) goes to healthcare. We have to deal with those issues, because the first day we show back up at the (state) capital, we have to come up with an additional \$1.3 billion to the last budget to pay bills that have come due.

"Transportation is already an issue, but we're already putting billions of dollars more into transportation," he added. "Law enforcement, criminal justice ... the border is always a big issue, and those folks want another quarter of a billion dollars.

We will not run short of issues (during the legislative session)."

Darby estimated that state revenue from oil and gas sectors will decrease about 30 percent from the previous session, while sales tax revenue will drop about 3 percent.

"That presents challenges on how we fund the the criminal justice system, how we fund public and higher education," Darby said. "We have huge issues pertaining to Child Protective Services and foster care services that are going to require more resources devoted to those important things. Then there's border security — does the state continue to pick up more than \$1 billion to secure the border, or does the federal government step in and accept that responsibility?"

"All those things are

going to be on the table," he added. "It's going to be a very interesting session, but it's all going to boil down to the money."

The men both said that one of their chief concerns is that the needs of sparsely populated West Texas are not pushed aside during the coming session.

"A big challenge is making sure the needs of West Texas are being communicated to the rest of the state," Darby said. "There are a lot of people living east of Interstate 35 who believe beef is grown in the back of HEB, and that clothing is grown in the back rooms of retail outlets."

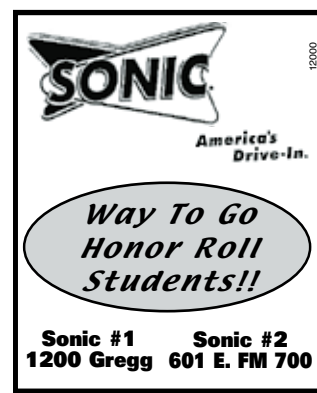

# Tannehill's play has Miami riding high

CARLSBAD, Calif. — The Miami Dolphins have won four straight games, are above .500 for the first time under rookie coach Adam Gase, and feature a hot quarterback in Ryan Tannehill.

That's quite a flip from a 1-4 start when Tannehill was the target of countless barbs.

"Everyone criticizes Tannehill," said Hall of Famer quarterback Bob Griese, a Dolphins radio analyst. "But as soon as the offensive line got better, the quarterback got better. And as soon as the running game improved, the quarterback got better. When those things happen, you can throw when you want to and not when you have to."

Tannehill leads the Dolphins (5-4) against the Rams (4-5) on Sunday in Los Angeles. Miami remained in southern California to practice this week after beating the Chargers last weekend.

The play of Tannehill is a big reason Miami is rolling. During the winning run, Tannehill hasn't turned over the ball.

"I think that's the biggest thing for us right now is taking care of the football (and) not giving the other team opportunities with good field position, and keeping ourselves in

the right spot," said Tannehill, who's thrown for 2,117 yards, 10 touchdowns and seven interceptions. "If we can continue doing that, I think we'll continue to win games."

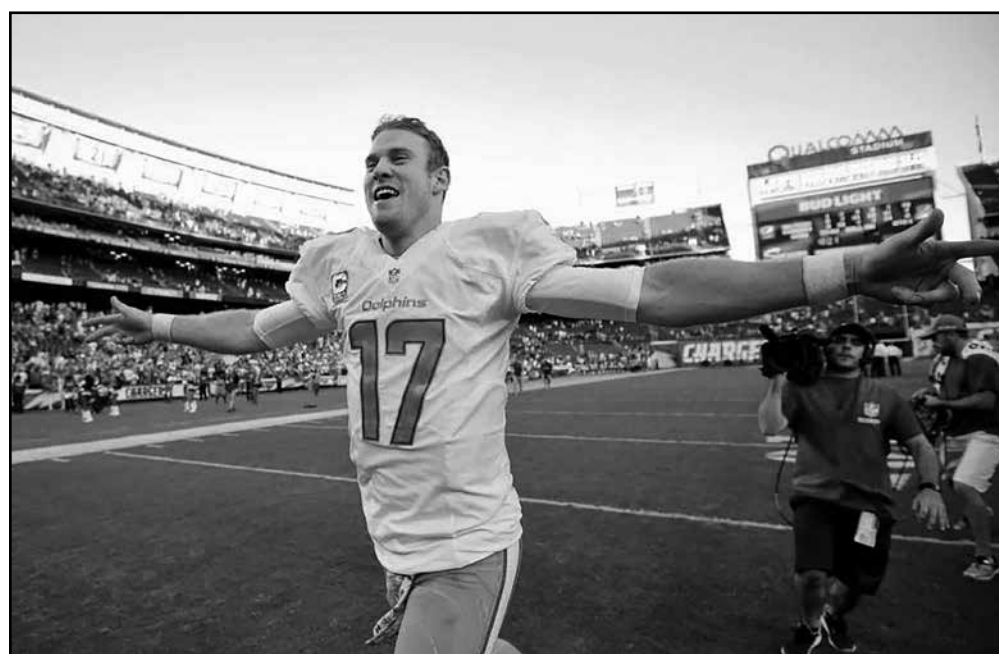
The Dolphins struggled at the season's onset. But they rebounded and that speaks volumes to Tannehill.

"I'm proud of the way that guys have battled and the way we faced adversity throughout our season, the way we stuck together and kept battling, kept staying on track, working to get better week in and week out," Tannehill said. "That hunger to succeed - that hunger to win - has been huge for us on our team. I'm excited about where we're at right now."

Tannehill is in the right spot more often thanks to his work with Gase. The two consistently worked on various aspects of Tannehill's game.

"We're constantly trying to improve," Tannehill said. "There's always something, whether it's feet, moving in the pocket - whatever it is. We're constantly trying to improve and get better."

Tannehill was nearly at his best Sunday when beating the Chargers 31-24. He completed 17 of 24 passes for 240 yards and two touchdowns, posting a 130.6 quarterback rating. It was the second-highest quarterback rating of Tannehill's career behind only his perfect mark of 158.3 vs.

"I think he's done a good job of decision making," Gase said. "Receivers and him are on the same page, along with the tight ends. I think the protection, you know the line has done a really good job as far as keeping him fairly protected. I know he takes some shots, but there are a couple of times where he knows he's going to get hit because he's

holding onto it. He's trying to take a shot down the field."

Tannehill has been sacked just three times in four games as the unit absorbs Gase's offensive system.

"It's not just me," Tannehill said. "It's the O-line giving me time to make good throws, and receivers being in the right spot and making plays on the football. It takes everyone."

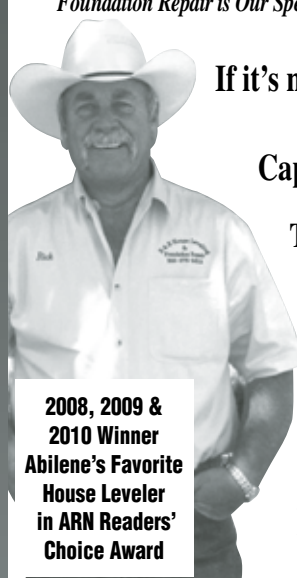

The bidding: South West North East 1♥ Pass 6♥(!) 7♣ Dble Pass ? Opening lead — six of clubs. **This incident occurred** at a game a friend of mine played in many years ago. He had been playing bridge for only a year or so at the time, and his knowledge of the game was somewhat limited. **It was late in the evening** when the hand shown was dealt. My friend's partner, sitting North, was hostess of the four-table group, and she was a bit edgy because the time had come for refreshments to be served.

So, when my friend opened the bidding with one heart and West passed, the hostess leaped directly to six hearts. Of course, she didn't have the values for this bid, and she might well have used any of a number of other approaches to slam, but she was terribly anxious to leave the table and get to the kitchen to prepare the snacks.

**East**, certainly no shrinking violet, now barged in with seven clubs. Possibly my friend should have made a forcing pass to invite his partner to bid a grand slam if she was so inclined. But first, I doubt that he was then familiar with this convention, and second, I'm not sure he would have made a forcing pass even if he had known its meaning. Instead, he doubled.

**West passed**, whereupon the hostess rose from her chair and said: "I'm very sorry, partner, but I simply must make the tea. Seven hearts!" That closed the bidding, and West led a club.

**The spade finesse succeeded**, and so did the diamond finesse, and when the diamonds turned out to be divided 3-3, my friend was able to discard his last spade on dummy's fourth diamond. As a result, he made the grand slam.

**The tea, he added**, was delicious!

**This Date In History**

Today is Thursday, Nov. 17, the 322nd day of 2016. There are 44 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History: On Nov. 17, 1800, Congress held its first session in the partially completed U.S. Capitol building.

On this date:

- In 1558, Elizabeth I acceded to the English throne upon the death of her half-sister, Queen Mary, beginning a 44-year reign.
- In 1869, the Suez Canal opened in Egypt.
- In 1889, the Union Pacific Railroad Co. began direct, daily railroad service between Chicago and Portland, Oregon, as well as Chicago and San Francisco.
- In 1917, French sculptor Auguste Rodin (roh-DAN) died in Meudon at age 77.
- In 1925, actor Rock Hudson was born Roy Harold Scherer Jr. in Winnetka, Illinois.
- In 1934, Lyndon Baines Johnson married Claudia Alta Taylor, better known as Lady Bird, in San Antonio, Texas.
- In 1947, President Harry S. Truman, in an address to a special session of Congress, called for emergency aid to Austria, Italy and France. (The aid was approved the following month.)

In 1968, NBC outraged football fans by cutting away from the closing minutes of a New York Jets-Oakland Raiders game to begin the TV special "Heidi" on schedule. (After being taken off the air, the Raiders came from behind to beat the Jets, 43-32.)

In 1973, President Richard Nixon told Associated Press managing editors in Orlando, Florida: "People have got to know whether or not their president is a crook. Well, I'm not a crook."

In 1979, Iran's Ayatollah Khomeini ordered the release of 13 black and/or female American hostages being held at the U.S. Embassy in Tehran.

In 1987, a federal jury in Denver convicted two white supremacists of civil rights violations in the 1984 slaying of radio talk show host Alan Berg. (Both men later died in prison.)

In 1991, the first national TV commercial for condoms (Trojan) aired during an episode of the Fox situation comedy "Herman's Head."

Ten years ago: Cast into the minority in midterm elections, House Republicans chose John Boehner (BAY-nur) of Ohio to lead them. Ivan J. Hill was convicted in Los Angeles of being the "60 Freeway Slayer" of six women (Hill was later sentenced to death). The FDA ended a 14-year virtual ban on

silicone-gel breast implants. College football coaching legend Bo Schembechler died in Southfield, Michigan, at age 77. Grammy- and Tony-winning singer Ruth Brown died in Henderson, Nevada, at age 78.

Five years ago: Occupy Wall Street protesters clogged streets and tied up traffic around the U.S. to mark two months since the movement's birth and signal they weren't ready to quit, despite the break-up of many of their encampments by police. Clayton Kershaw of the Los Angeles Dodgers won the NL Cy Young Award. Baseball owners unanimously approved the sale of the Houston Astros from Drayton McLane to Jim Crane, which would lead to the team moving from the NL Central to the AL West for the 2013 season.

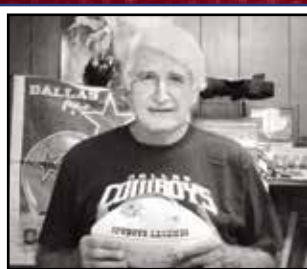
