Rodeo Queen Contest Kicks Off

Entries are now being accepted for the 1984 Queen Contest, a highlight of the annual Bogata Rodeo and Frontier Days Celebration, scheduled for June 28-29 and 30.

Contestants are also invited for the Rodeo Princess contest, said Bill Buckman of the sponsoring Bogata Rodeo Association.

The queen's contest is open to all single girls between the ages of 14 and 19 who attend school within a 20 mile radius of Bogata.

The girls must be single and never have been married and must be within the 14-19 age category as of the date of the contest.

Judging for the rodeo queen will be based on horsemanship, appearance and personality.

The girls will be expected to wear western attire while riding in the rodeo's grand entry on each of the three nights and in the rodeo parade.

It is requested, but not required, Buckman said, that each contestant submit a snapshot of herself for publicity purposes when submitting her entry.

Girls wishing to compete in the 1984 contest are asked

to complete the entry form published on this page of today's newspaper and either mail or deliver it to Bill Buckman at Buckman's Drug Store in Bogata.

Wednesday, June 7 has been set as entry deadline for this year's queen contest.

The 1984 queen, to be announced at the concluding events on June 30, will receive her crown from the 1983 queen, Jemalyn Finley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Finley of Clarksville.

The Princess contest, with the winner to be determined by advance ticket sales, is open to girls who were in the fourth through seventh grade during the 1983-84 school year, and they, too, must attend school within a 20 mile radius of Bogata.

Only the first five entries will be accepted in the Princess contest.

The 1983 Princess was Sandy Williams, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C.R. Williams of Bogata.

Shooting Leaves Bogata Woman In Poor Condition

A Tuesday morning shooting left a Bogata woman in poor but stable condition at St. Joseph's Hospital in Paris and a Bogata man under arrest for attempted murder as Red River Sheriff's Deputies continue their investigation into a somewhat puzzling

case. Dorothy Clark, a white female, was hit once with a small caliber bullet which apparently struck her in the arm and then entered her body at around 10 a.m. Tuesday, May 22.

Joe Parks, a 77 year old white male, and a Bogata

resident, were apprehended by Red River County law enforcement officers shortly thereafter.

Parks was arrested for attempted murder, and arraigned by J.C. Watson, Precinct 2, Bogata with bond set at \$10,000.

The shooting occurred at

S. Bryson Street in Bogata, and Parks apparently fired at least two shots from the middle of the road.

Parks remains in custody at the Red River County Jail in Clarksville at this time, and the incident continues to be under investigation, with no definite motive for the shooting established.

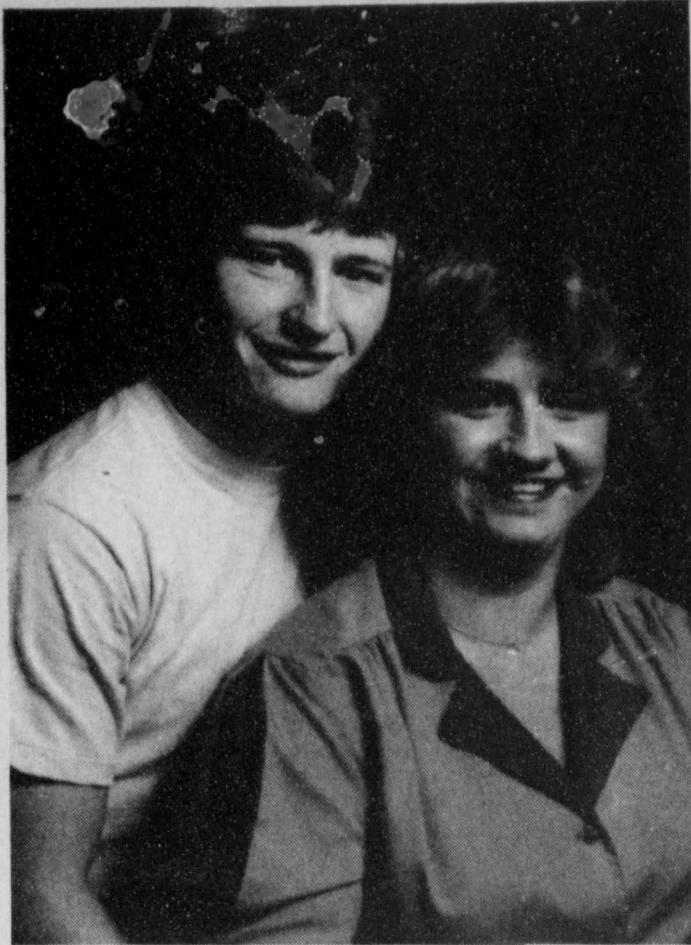

Strain Family Has Reunion

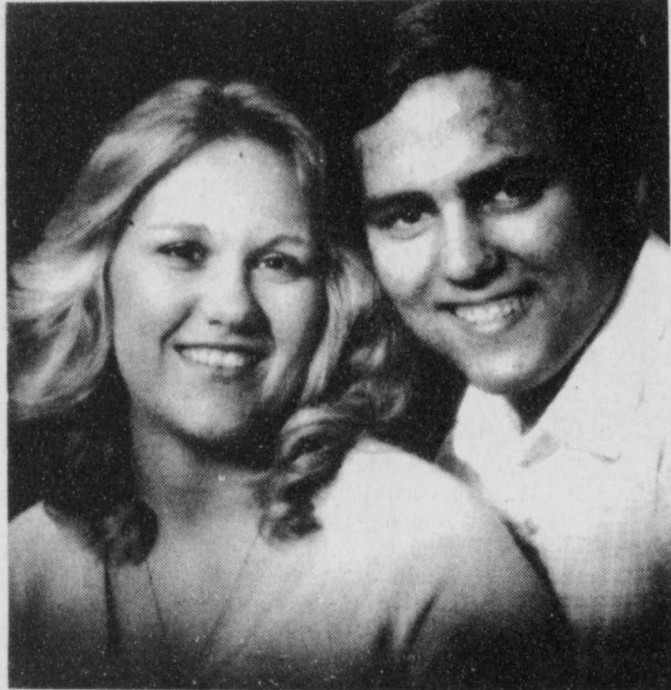
The annual Strain reunion was held at the Community House on May 6.

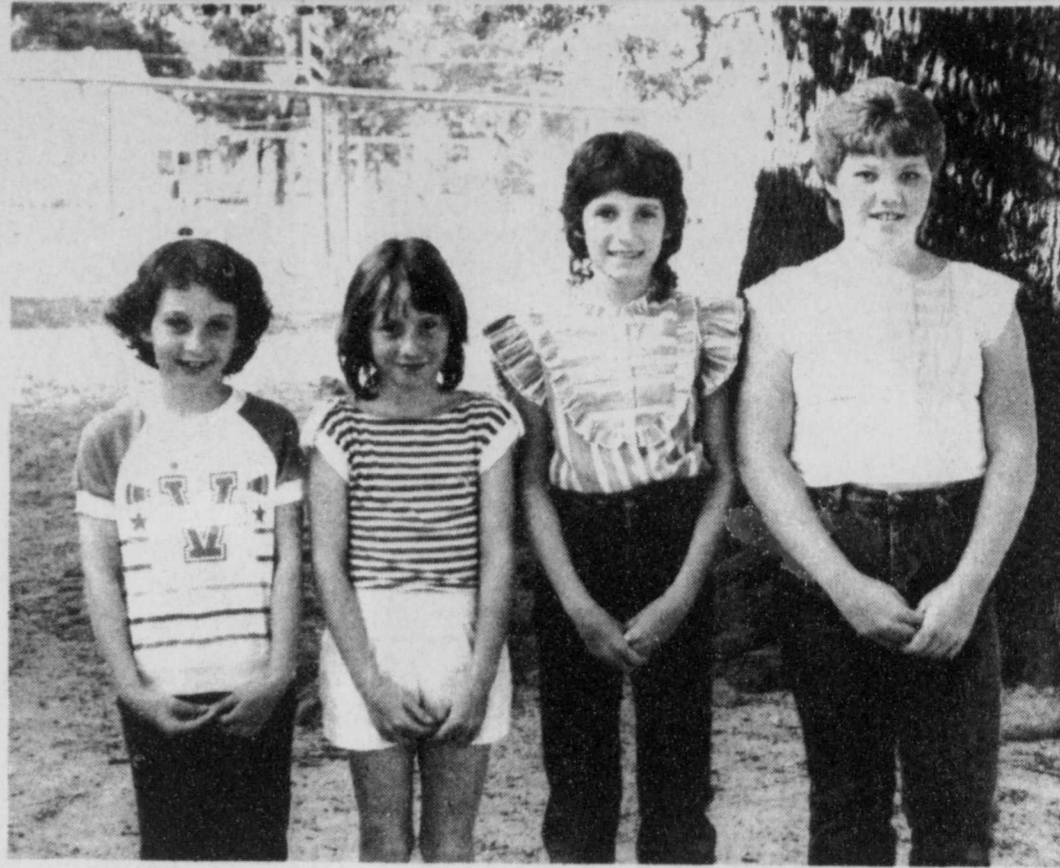
