OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

LONG LOANS

It's likely, that most of us have taken out a long-term loan sometime in our lives. For the majority of us, it's usually for a house. In our case, we had saved up a little money, so, we bought a

house in Amarillo, from some folks that had gotten a 30-year loan. They had paid on the house for 10 years, but were moving to another town. We gave them 1,000 dollars for their equity, then assumed

the remaining twenty year loan. I remember very well, that the monthly payment was seventy eight dollars a month. There were a few months when it was pretty hard to make. We wound up living there for thirty-six years, and I can remember how elated we were, to not have a house payment. Some of the more interesting loans

though, were made by me, to someone else, usually a guy I worked with. One of those loans, was to a young man who needed an Ironworkers tool belt. It just happened that a friend of his knew I had a really nice one that I wasn't needing at the time. He said he'd bring mine back, as soon as he could get his own. Apparently, he never could get one of his own, because I haven't seen him since. I've forgotten his name. I find it's a little hard to stay sore at someone without a name. My "hammer drill" met a similar fate, but different circumstances. The guy I loaned it to was someone I actually knew. It's just that he had it so long, he probably forgot who he borrowed it from, and I forgot who I loaned it to. I'm not mad at whoever that was. Lastly, there was my old working buddy and fellow

welder, "Lucky." Lucky and I worked at a fabrication shop that was in financial trouble, and our payroll checks began to bounce. Naturally, some of our own checks began to bounce. He was worse-off than some of us, because he'd just bought a pickup and a new boat. At one of our last days there, before they locked the doors, we'd divided up a small fund we had set up several years before, to help out someone who was sick or injured; sort of a "homespun sick pay." Anyway, Lucky, was almost in tears about the chance of getting his boat repossessed. Since I had fifty dollars I'd received from the fund, I loaned it to

him. That was in 1969, and I'll bet Lucky has been trying to find me ever since, to pay me back. If he shows up at my door one of these days, I probably won't recognize him.; Answer to last week's history trivia question: Two of the main reasons for the war of 1812, was the British Navy seizing American merchant ships and impressment of sailors on those ships, who were naturalized Americans that were born in Britain.; This week's question: What caused the fires in San Francisco, April 18, 1906? How much of the city did it burn, and how many people did it leave homeless? Answer next week.

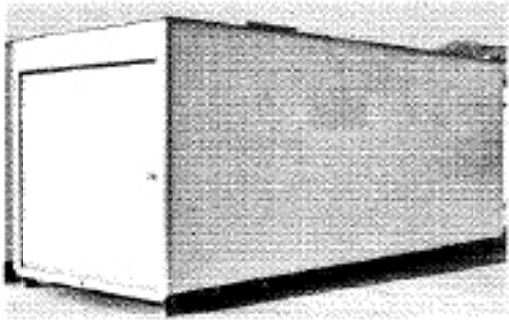

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND INTENT TO OBTAIN AIR QUALITY STANDARD PERMIT REGISTRATION

PROPOSED AIR QUALITY REGISTRATION NO. 77900L002

APPLICATION Mr. Richard DeVuyst has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration No. 77900L002, which would authorize construction of a concrete batch plant. The applicant has provided the following driving directions: From Mobeetie, travel west approximately 3 miles on State Highway 152 (West Oklahoma Avenue) to private drive. Travel south on private drive 0.5 mile to facility, Mobeetie, Wheeler County, Texas 79065. This link to an electronic map of the site or facility's general location is provided as a public courtesy and not part of the application or notice. For exact location, refer to application.

The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants: particulate matter including (but not limited to) aggregate, cement, road dust, and particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on April 22, 2016. The application will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Amarillo regional office, and the Wheeler Public Library, 302 South Canadian Street, Wheeler, Wheeler County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Amarillo regional office of the TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING You may submit public comments, a request for a public meeting, or request a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. **The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.** After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to consider in the permit process.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

The executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments. If a hearing request is timely filed in Response to this Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Air Permit, the time period for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to thirty days after the mailing of the executive director's response to comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following the Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If any comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on a mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application. **If no hearing request is received within this 15-day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided.** A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on those issues submitted during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. To request a hearing, a person must actually reside in a permanent residence within 440 yards of the proposed plant. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and Registration Number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests which the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 15 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, at the address below.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material air quality concerns submitted during the comment period.** Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.

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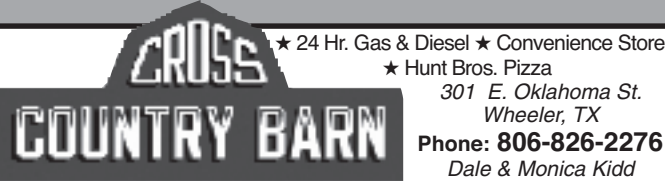
