## GROWTH OF OCHILTREE

More new buildings are being erected in Ochiltree. Four residences and one business building is now under good headway and preparations are being made for five other dwellings. One year ago Ochiltree had 2 general stores, 2 real estate offices, 1 blacksmith shop, 1 livery barn and 8 dwellings. Today she has 2 general stores, 1 drug store, 4 real estate offices, 1 sanitarium, 2 livery barns, 2 hotels with a combined capacity of 80 guests, 1 tin shop, 1 printing plant, 2 blacksmith shops, 2 lumber yards, 1 butcher shop, 1 barber shop, a First National Bank, church building, 8-room school building and 30 dwellings, making a total gain of 23 residences, 11 business buildings and 2 public buildings.

**OCHILTREE 3;  
 BALCO, OKLA., 4**

Last Sunday afternoon Balco and Ochiltree met on the Wolf Creek diamond and crossed bats in the fastest game of base ball ever played in the county which resulted in a score of 3 to 4 in favor of Balco.

The first four innings were shut outs on both sides, only two men reaching first, but Balco started off in the fifth after the first two up had been retired. Cooper reached first on an error by D. Eubank. Humphry put one out to Cropper who failed to make connections, letting Cooper score. Shockley reached first on errors by Shotwell and Lee, and was then advanced by Thomson's single. Powell then came up for a three-bagger and died at third by Couch going out at first. Woods was first up for Ochiltree and rapped out a wot-bagger and scored on a hit by D. Eubank before the side was retired, making the score 4 to 1.

From the fifth to ninth inning neither side scored. In the ninth occurred the leading feature of the game. Cooper had reached third and Humphry first with no one out when H. Eubank fielded Shockley's liner and assisted by D. Eubank and Woods, made a tripple by catching Cooper and Humphrey at first and third. The first two up for Ochiltree went out right now but Woods took four and went to first. Cropper then hit a pop-up to Powell who demonstrated his skill in the art of juggling. Lee then sent Woods and Cropper home with his three-bagger, but the scoring stopped there as D. Eubank went out at first, ending the game.

**NOTES.**  
 Powell's whiparm is a daudy. It was a pitchers battle from start to finish. Cutting out all errors the game would have resulted in a score would have been 1 to 0.

Shotwell pitched an excellent game.

Powell struck out ten of the first twelve up.

Three of Ochiltree's errors cost them that many scores.

Ludwick and Emmett are a good pair of short stops.

Both pitchers pitched themselves out of holes at the right time.

Emmett was the only one on the Ochiltree team that didn't strike out but he failed to get a safe one.

Ochiltree had more chances to field the ball, got all the hard ones and made errors of the simple ones.

A nice snappy game. Umpire's decion's never questioned; no boisterous talk; no betting and nothing but water to drink, all of which seemed to satisfy the good sized crowd of spectators.
