accident, to take down the names of some youngsters parents. These children appear in the paper, but

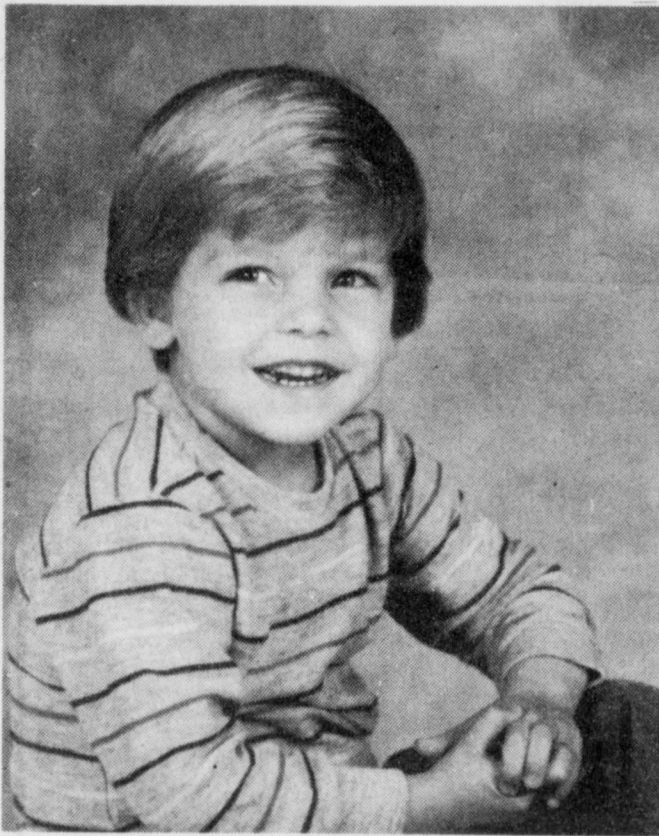
without their parent's names. They are: Nikki and Billi Ann Hammonds, Joy Hebeart and Kim Stewart.

The newspaper extends sincere apologies for this oversight, and hopes that the parents will understand.

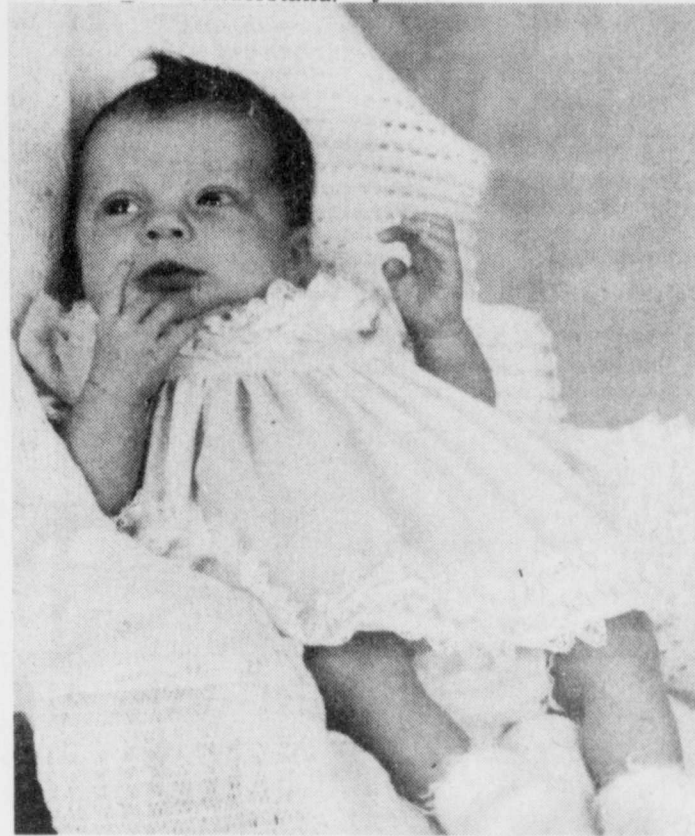
A bigger, even better edition is already in the planning stages for next year.



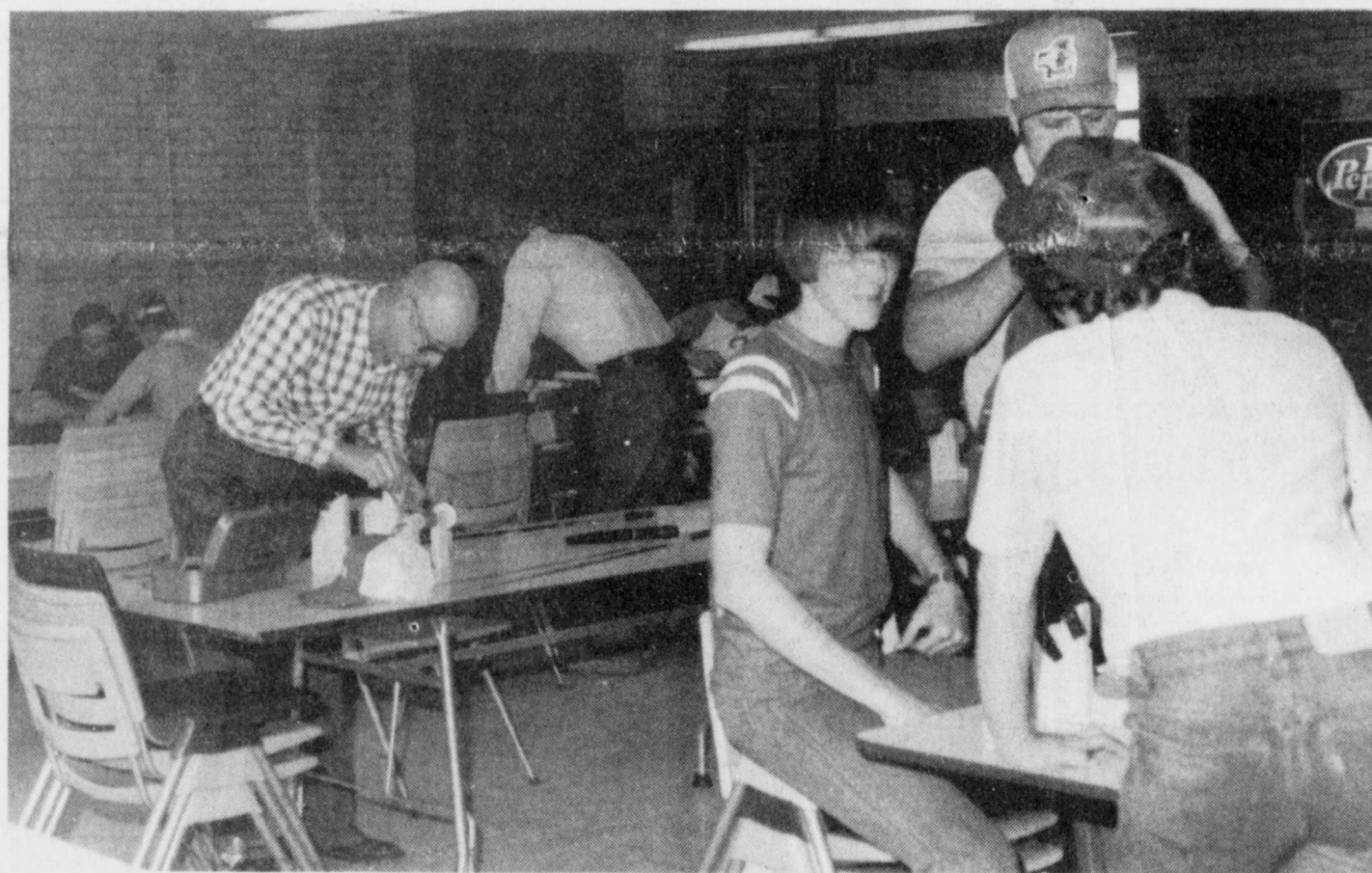

 A covered dish luncheon was served at the noon hour.

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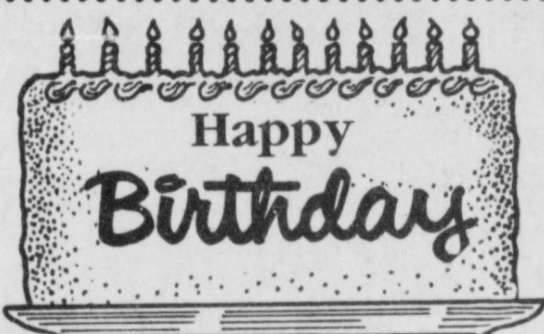
