champion in the classic division with a Barton variety; and Gloria Erwin, champion in the native division.

"Overall, the nut quality was pretty good considering the type of year we've had," said Extension Agent Bryan Limmer.

Limmer said the pecan crop is not as large this year as last year, mainly because of the dry weather experienced during June.

Deadline for filing is Dec. 19.

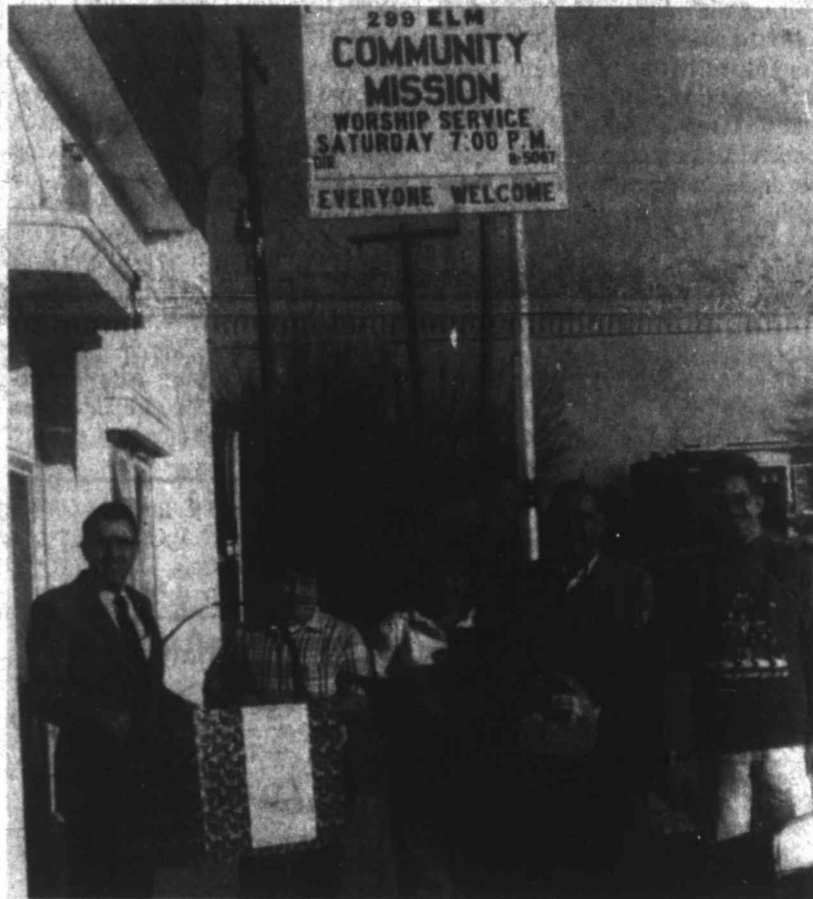
## Tree lighting ceremony set Tuesday night

## Local helping agencies report to community

At a time when many local families are experiencing economic hardships and needing short-term help and with Christmas approaching, the local voluntary helping agencies have issued a combined financial and service report to the community, to which they wish to be accountable.

The Community Mission of Colorado City, which has an application pending with the IRS for the 501(c)3 exemption status, was officially incorporated on Jan. 23, 1990. During this year to the date of Nov. 28, Ernie Lelek, treasurer, reports the mission has received total contributions of \$5,726.98. Of this total, \$3,119.75 was used for utilities and maintenance of the mission building at 299 Elm, which has been used to house a director of the

program, storage for the food and clothing bank, a "one-night" dormitory for transients, and a place to provide meetings and services for needy persons. \$1,196 was spent on transient services and \$1,068.18 on local resident relief. No salaries have been paid to any person.

During the past quarter, September - October-November, the mission has received contributions from the Calvary Baptist Church, Oak Street Baptist Church, Christian Temple, First United Methodist Church, Dorn Chapel United Methodist Church and individual contributions from Vaughn Brown, Willie Garner, E.J. Lelek and Elmer Martin. During this quarter the mission has provided motel lodging for eight

persons, and meal expenses for transients of \$135.90, in addition to services on site.

Mission Board Chairman Elmer Martin reports that there is an urgent need to find a new location for the Community Mission as soon as possible. He asks that any person with a suggestion about building space might be made available, either for operation of the ministry, or as a last resort for storage of the furniture and food and clothing banks until an operation site can be found, to contact him or another member of the board. The board of directors is constituted by the election of two representatives from each church in the community.

Dolores Wood, treasurer of the Helping Hand arm of the Community Mission, reports all income comes through local churches, and totals only \$170 per month. Contributing on a regular basis are the First United Methodist Church, First Baptist Church, Central Baptist Church, Local Circle of Loraine United Methodist Church, Pairs and Spares S.S. Class of First Baptist and Lydia S.S. Class of First Methodist.

During September Helping Hand helped four families with medical and doctor bills, three families with utilities, clothes for one family who suffered a burn-out, food for one family, and stocked school supplies at local schools for needy children. In October, one family was helped with utilities and in November, three families were helped with utilities and two with prescriptions. The bank balance on Dec. 1 was \$10.60.

David Shaw, local chairman of the Salvation Army, and Judy Chapman, treasurer, have published the following report on services rendered by this agency, which works in close cooperation with the Community Mission/Helping Hand and the Ministerial Alliance. During the fiscal year of Oct. 1, 1989 to Sept. 30, 1990, the local committee of the Salvation Army received contributions of \$1,936.50 and had expenditures of \$2,073.4. Expenditures included \$446.39 for the campaign services, and \$475.92 to the state organization. Ordinarily the state organization takes two-thirds of all contributions after the campaign expense, but because of pressing local needs, more was allocated locally this year.

The local services included clothing for four families, transportation for one, and other

miscellaneous aid. Transient services included lodging for 10 families, bus tickets for 13 persons, gasoline for nine families and medical aid for one.

During October and November, 1990, contributions to the current Christmas appeal totaled \$371. Expenditures of \$235.91 provided assistance on utilities to one family, clothing for one burned-out family, and a prescription for one person. Also, for transients, gasoline for four families, assistance on car repairs for one, and a bus ticket for one.

The Rev. Leon Green, treasurer of the Mitchell County Ministerial Alliance, has published the following report on the MCMA funds. Income for the year, Jan. 1, 1990 through Dec. 5, 1990, has been \$1,901.04, and disbursements \$2,885.05. The sources of the income have been the Holy Week Services offering of \$696.16, the Community Thanksgiving Service offering of \$378.65, dues from the ministers of \$75, interest of \$66.23, and contributions of \$685 from the Oak Street Baptist Church, Calvary Baptist Church, First Baptist of Loraine, and Plainview Baptist Church.

Expenses for transients totaled \$160.71, which provided motel rooms for two families, bus tickets

for three persons, and a tire for one traveler. Assistance to local residents totaled \$2,694.34, which provided gasoline for four persons and car repair for another to enable them to seek work or medical treatment, food for three families, glasses for one person, prescriptions for one, assistance on rent for three families, assistance on utility bills for three families, and contributions of \$50 to Project Celebration and \$600 to the Community Mission.

All of these helping agencies closely coordinate their efforts with each other on individual cases. Before transients are assisted, they also require a check by the Police Department. This information is published in order that the community may know that all contributions are carefully and responsibly used. There are some very real and desperate needs which are brought to these agencies, and the continued generous support of the public is urgent to enable help to be provided.
