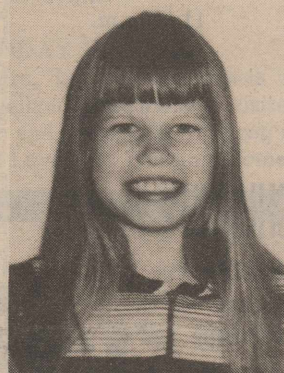

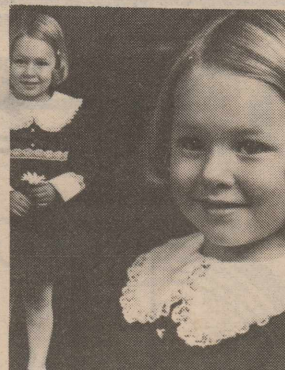

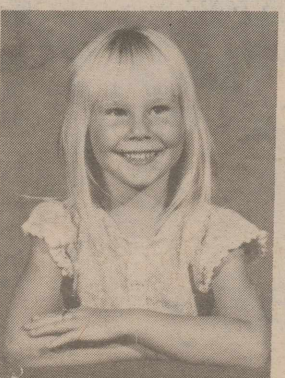

Cemetery Gate Damaged

Investigation is being conducted by Castro County Sheriff's Department in the damages inflicted to property at Hart Cemetery Friday night. Vernon Ellis, night patrolman, made the discovery in a

routine check at 1:30 a.m. Saturday. West gate of the cemetery had been torn down and the brick columns which supported the archway sign were broken. City Marshal Lonny Rhynes

reported this week that investigation of the scene indicates that someone apparently was entering the cemetery in a truck and pulled the sign down when they backed from the drive.

"We don't believe it was vandalism," he said but added that not reporting the damage, if it were an accident, made the case a felony.

Tire tracks at the scene were made by a single axle truck, he said.

Vandals did strike the same night at the American Legion Park. One guard rail was already missing from a slide and the second was taken off Friday night.

Seats to the merry-go-round were pulled off and placed in the road. L.C. McLain discovered the damage Saturday morning and reported it. A city employee found the seats in the road about midnight Friday and moved them from the roadway.
