GREAT METHODIST ENCAMPMENT FOR JUNCTION IN AUGUST

Preachers And Others From All
Over This Conference District
Will Attend.

Definite plans are now going steadily forward for a big Methodist Encampment here in August. Pastor J. C. Campbell and others have had this occasion in view for some time, but we are glad that we can now definitely announce concerning it. Some months ago Rev. Campbell conceived the idea and took up the matter with various preachers of this Conference District, and received good encouragement. It was at the last District Conference, however, that he, together with others from our town, gave the move a boost which aroused the enthusiastic interest of preachers and delegates from various parts of the District. Many there and then promised that if the Encampment be held they would attend. The plan put forward was to have a big "Camp Meeting" here in which we would have the united cooperation of all who come. All Methodist preachers and their families of this Conference District are given a special invitation to be here, and will be furnished free meals and cots during the Encampment. This, together with the pleasant outing which they would enjoy in visiting "Kimble Climes" should be sufficient inducements and remuneration for their services in co-operating with us in the big revival camp meeting.

The Junction Chamber of Commerce learned of the Encampment plans and, unsolicited, came forward nobly and said: "Go after it, we're with you." They called a special meeting to consider the matter and there a number pledged liberal contributions toward the necessary funds. Our business men realized it to be a good thing for Junction. They appointed a committee to solicit further funds and work with Rev. Campbell and the Methodist Church in making the Encampment a success.

Aside from free meals and beds to all Methodist preachers of the District it is now planned to have on the grounds a Communion and serve meals to all visitors at cost. This will appeal to many who would not otherwise attend.

Dates of the Encampment are August 2nd to 14th.

The occasion will be at some nearly suitable spot on the river, probably at Schreiner Park.

Rev. Campbell to date has the definite promise to attend from some ten or twelve preachers of the District. Many laymen from various parts of the State, among them some good musicians and singers, are also planning to come. Present prospects promise a great gathering and an occasion the like of which Junction has never before had within her gates.

Within the next few days Encampment literature will be mailed out to all points in the District and elsewhere.

Plans and details are being steadily pushed. Further announcements concerning the occasion will be published from time to time.

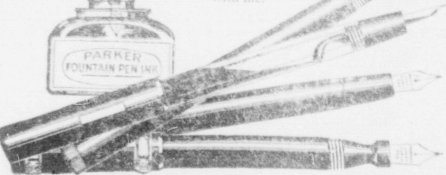

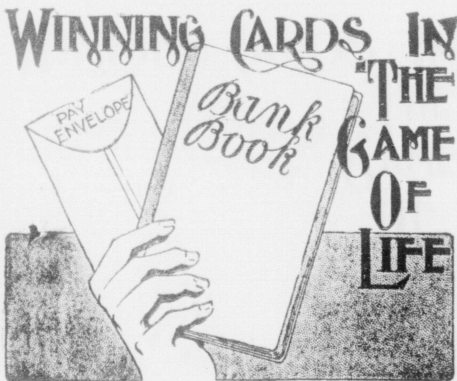
