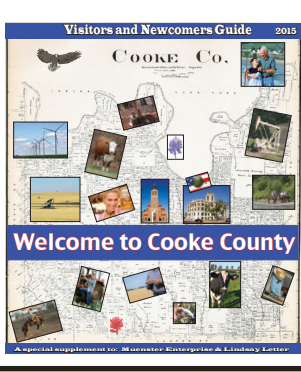

Ground breaking for walking trail planned April 28

Representatives from Keep Muenster Beautiful (KMB) and the City of Muenster met with Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) on Thursday, April 16 for a pre-construction meeting for the new walking trail at Muenster City Park. The project will begin on April 28 and should be completed by June 8.

The walk will be in the field bordered by Hwy. 82, Ash Street, and Cross Street, and will connect to the existing park via the walking bridge. A six-foot concrete sidewalk and lamp posts that will match the lamp posts in town are in the project plan.

Tom Felderhoff, Jr., engineering technician, is the TXDOT project manager, and Stan Endres, Muenster city administrator, is the KMB project chairperson.

KMB won the \$90,000 Governor's Community Achievement Award (GCAA) in 2012 that is providing this city improvement project. TXDOT expanded the scope of this project by adding \$50,000 to the awarded amount. This award is based on the environmental efforts of the community in the categories of community leadership, public awareness, youth and education, beautification, litter prevention, solid waste management, and law enforcement and illegal dumping. KMB submits a grant application competing against other cities in the state with populations of 3,000 or less.

Residents of the Muenster Independent School District have an opportunity to vote in the upcoming Board of Trustees election. It will be held Saturday, May 9 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. in the MISD Administration Building, 135 East Seventh Street, Muenster.

Early voting begins on Monday, April 27 and ends on Tuesday, May 5 at 4 p.m. It will be held in the MISD Administration Building. Hours to cast votes are weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Muenster ISD has a contest for Place 5 between incumbent Richard Dangelmayr and Craig Stoffels. Place 6 incumbent Kimberly Hess Walterscheid did not draw an opponent. Place 7 saw Jeff Flusche file as a candidate. Steve Trubenbach did not seek another term for Place 7. He currently serves as president of the MISD Board of Trustees.

All candidates have been invited to participate in a question and answer interview which will be published in next week's *Muenster Enterprise*.

This is the sixth time that KMB has won this award. Other city improvements that the GCAA has provided Muenster are the decorative street lamps and trash cans on Main Street and Hwy. 82, new ADA sidewalks and planting beds and shrubs on the first two blocks of town, new sidewalk in front of the Center Restaurant and Nortex, and the rod iron fencing at city park facing Hwy. 82. Cities are eligible to win the GCAA every three years, which means that Muenster is eligible to win this award again this year.

KMB hopes that other groups will contribute projects to help develop this new addition to the park. Some possible ideas are benches, trash cans, landscaping, exercise stations, music stations, and/or art work. All ideas have to be approved by the City.

KMB encourages all local groups to report their beautification and recycling efforts to KMB. Before and after photos are needed, as well as the number of volunteers involved and how many hours are invested.

Ten month probationary contract renewals for the 2015-16 school year were approved for certified teachers Casey Singer, Katie Thomas, and Afton Vieth.

The Board approved a term contract renewal for the 2015-16 school year on a 10 month 10 day basis for Vicki Eldridge as a certified librarian.

Debra Sicking was approved for dual assignment term contract renewal for the 2015-16 year on an 11 month basis as instructional technology specialist/teacher/webmaster.

School Nurse Marlene Fisher received approval for a term contract renewal for 2015-16 on a 10 month basis.

J.B. Gray, III's dual assignment teacher/coach term contract was renewed on a 10 month and 10 day basis.

The Board approved Kristi Schneider for a term contract renewal on a 12 month basis as certified school counselor.

A dual assignment teacher/FFA/CTE term contract renewal on a 12 month basis was approved for Daniel Waneck.

Jeff Presnall received approval for a dual assignment teacher/coach/technology coordinator term contract on a 12 month basis.

Joni Sturm was approved for a retire/rehire teacher contract on a nine month basis.

Courtney Cody was approved for a dual assignment teacher/FFA/CTE probationary contract for the 2015-16 school year.

A unanimous vote by the Board approved the City of Muenster's request to participate in the cost of paving Ninth Street. The District's cost is \$6,408 for the paving job which will be chip and tar.

In other action the Board:

- Reviewed and discussed the American Red Cross Shelter Agreement and the Fire Inspection Report.

- Approved the EIF Academic Achievement.
- Approved the EFG Local (Update 101) with all out-of-state trips to Oklahoma to be approved by the superintendent and all others to be approved by the MISD Board.
- Approved the 2015-16 District Calendar with school starting on Aug. 24 with two comp days being scheduled for June 6 and 7. Dec. 10 is Elementary UIL Day and this is one of the two comp days - all teachers must attend.

Obituary

Marcella Metzler 1936 - 2015

Funeral Mass for Marcella Clara Hess Metzler, age 78 of Lindsay was held Monday, April 20 at St. Peter's Catholic Church in Lindsay. Burial followed in St. Peter's Cemetery. Rosary and visitation were held the evening before at Geo. J. Carroll & Son Funeral Home Chapel. Metzler died Wednesday, April 15, 2015 after a hard fought battle with thyroid cancer.

Marcella was born July 29, 1936 to John J. and Edna Hess in Muenster. She grew up in Muenster and graduated from Sacred Heart High School in 1954. On June 15, 1954, she married Julius Metzler of Lindsay. For 60 years of marriage, she spent her time being a devoted wife and mother to their four children. She especially loved to cook and create new recipes. A family favorite was her special barbecue sauce recipe, which became the hallmark of the Smokehouse Restaurant in Lindsay when it opened its doors for business in 1976. Marcella made over 23,000 gallons of barbecue sauce before a bout with breast cancer brought her sauce making to a halt.

Marcella turned her attention to giving of her time to the sick and the elderly in nursing homes by playing her accordion for their enjoyment for the next 25 years. She was an accomplished seamstress for her family. She also enjoyed making crocheted handwork, quilts, and tending to her numerous flower gardens.

Marcella learned to sew as a child and made her own wedding dress, and made most of her family's clothing including three-piece suits for her husband and sons for many years. She especially enjoyed sewing for her daughters and her grandchildren. Marcella made a quilt for each grandchild. She also crocheted personalized name doilies for all her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren as well as for many nieces and nephews as wedding presents. She was working on the last doily when she passed.

Music held a special place in her heart and that talent was passed on to her grandchildren. At her visitation, grandson Travis Reiter played two of her favorite musical selections, "The

Last Date" by Floyd Kramer and "Amazing Grace" by Jim Brickman, on the piano. Her great-granddaughter Savannah Mendez sang "Miserere Nobis."

Consumer alert - TDI warns consumers of timeshare fraud

The Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) warns owners of timeshare vacation properties of a fraud scheme involving unlicensed title insurance companies. Consumers should always make sure they are dealing with properly licensed title companies and can contact TDI's Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439 for assistance.

Timeshare fraud typically begins when a person contacts timeshare owners and either says they are representing a buyer or offers to help them sell their properties. The person sends the owner to work with a specific title company, but the company doesn't exist. The company address, phone

number, and website are legitimate-looking but are all fake. Finally, the person asks the owner to send money to an account in Mexico and then disappears without providing any services.

TDI urges consumers to follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of timeshare fraud:

- Make sure any title company you work with is licensed or registered to sell title insurance in Texas by calling the TDI Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439.

- Know the company's exact name. Unlicensed companies often use names that are similar to the names of licensed companies.

- Verify that the title insurance company you're using has a physical office with a real address and a working phone number. If possible, visit the office in person.

- Ask the buyer's representative to send you details in writing about the services offered.

- Ask questions about expenses you are asked to pay up front. Seek a second opinion if the explanation is suspicious. If you are asked to transfer funds to Mexico, contact the taxing authority in Mexico or an attorney to advise you.

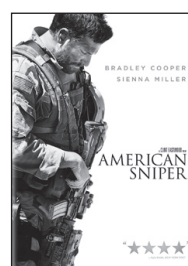

Muenster State Bank provided a free hot dog luncheon for all the workers.



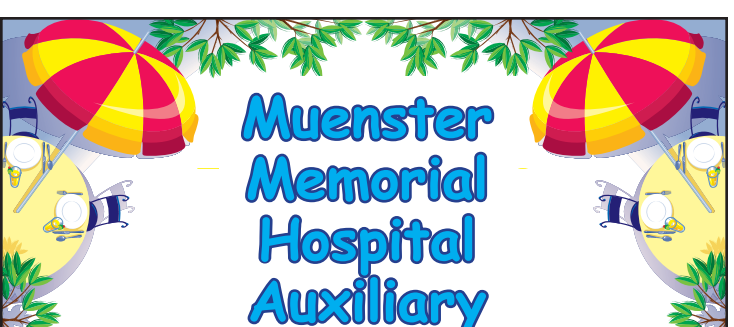

FARM & RANCH

Heavy rains continue to benefit Texas wheat but delays other plantings

More rainstorms swept over much of the state, leaving fields too soggy to work in many areas, but generally benefiting wheat, pastures and rangeland, according to Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service personnel.

Planting of corn, cotton, rice, grain sorghum and soybeans continued to lag behind the five-year average. Planting of sunflowers, at 10% completed, was actually slightly ahead of the five-year average of 9%, according to the AgriLife Extension agent reports.

Thunderstorms and high winds and/or hail in parts of the Panhandle and South Texas knocked down some wheat. In other areas, dryland wheat didn't receive moisture at the right time and was stressed. But generally, winter wheat was doing well, thanks to plentiful moisture, according to the AgriLife Extension agent reports.

According to the National Weather Service, most of the Coastal Bend and Southeast regions, and parts of South

and East Texas received 10 inches or more of rain in the last two weeks. More than 15 inches was received in isolated areas.

Parts of the Panhandle remained the exception. Producers in Deaf Smith and Randall counties still needed rain for newly planted corn and dryland wheat. Rolling Plains producers were still welcoming any rain received as it helped rangeland recover from the drought and will give spring plantings a good chance this year.

In many parts of the state to the east of U.S. Interstate 35, the continued rain was too much of a good thing. However, comments from AgriLife Extension county agents indicated producers weren't complaining that much, despite soggy, muddy fields and delayed plantings.

In North Texas, continued rain caused flooding and delayed corn planting past the crop insurance deadline and made it too wet to fertilize wheat. In Van Zandt County, the Tawakoni and Fork lakes

were nearly full for the first time in more than five years, said Tommy Phillips, AgriLife Extension agent there.

Lakes and streams were also full to overflowing in East Texas, according to reports from AgriLife Extension agents there. Winter pastures were doing well – perhaps too well – as ryegrass could not be removed from pastures because of wet conditions, and was over-shading warm-season grasses and hindering their growth.

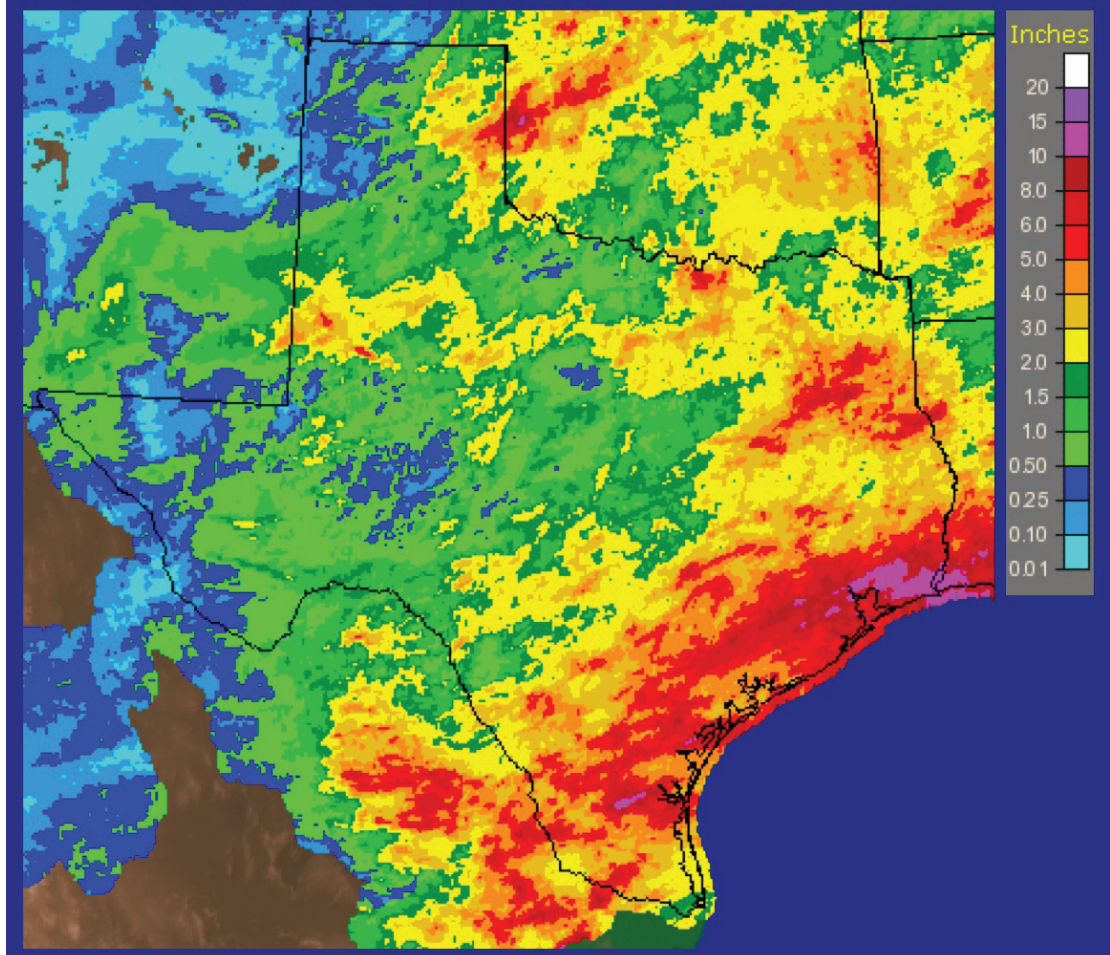
Vietnam rids age restrictions on U.S. beef imports

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF) recently announced that Vietnam has removed all cattle-age restrictions for imports of beef from the United States, according to *Drovers CattleNetwork*.

Previously, U.S. beef for export to Vietnam had to come from cattle slaughtered at less than 30 months of age, verified through the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) Export Verification (EV) program.

Vietnam is a relatively small, but growing market for U.S. beef. The removal of the age restrictions should encourage continued growth, particularly for lower-priced beef products.

In 2014, U.S. beef exports to Vietnam totaled 2,869 metric tons valued at \$22.1 million, according to the USMEF.

Two fly control options for beef cattle

Economic losses in beef herds occur when horn fly numbers exceed 150 flies per animal. Therefore, it is necessary to control horn flies in cattle to maximize economic returns and enhance animal welfare, according to *Drovers CattleNetwork*.

Two fly control options were recently tested: XP-820 fly tags manufactured by Y-Tex Corporation and Aim-L Vetcaps marketed by Agrilabs.

The XP-820 fly tag is a slow release product containing abamectin, which had not been previously used in the United States. XP-820 is labeled to control horn flies, including strains resistant to synthetic pyrethroids, and several tick species.

The Aim-L Vetcaps are soft-gel capsules that contain 10 milliliters of lambda-cyhalothrin with piperonyl butoxide. The capsules provide horn fly and lice control for cattle over 600 pounds. The Vetcaps are applied with a Vetgun, a remote delivery system that is designed to save time and reduce handling stress by allowing the product to be applied to cattle in the pasture.

Results found both products reduced horn fly numbers, although the XP-820 fly tag was the most beneficial and economical of the two products. XP-820 reduced fly numbers to 10 to 20 per animal. While Vetcaps and Vetgun required less time for application and less animal

stress, application effectiveness was reduced after two weeks. To maintain its effectiveness, multiple applications were required during fly season.

Honey production up 19%

Honey production in 2014 from producers with five or more colonies totaled 178 million pounds. This is a 19% increase from 2013, reports *AgriMarketing*.

There were 2.74 million colonies producing honey in 2014, up 4% from 2013. Yield per colony averaged 65.1 pounds, up 15% from the 56.6 pounds in 2013.

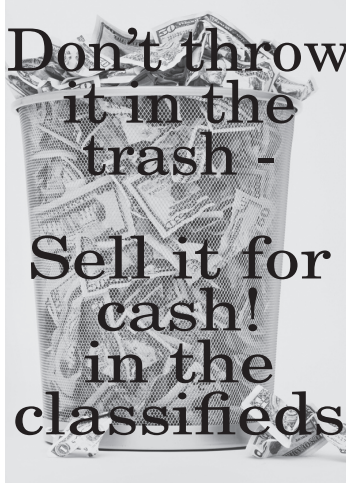
