

Rodeo, Frontier Day Getting Ready To Roll

A giant rodeo parade will kick off rodeo activities in downtown Bogata on Thursday, June 27 at 5 p.m. at Kisner's Grocery. The rodeo, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, will begin at 8:30 nightly at the Bogata fairgrounds arena.

Advance tickets are available from the rodeo princess candidates. Ticket prices are \$3.00 advance, \$3.50 at the gate for adults; and \$2.50 for 12 and under, preschool are free.

Bonnie Eloise Williams, trick riding expert, will entertain the fans at each rodeo performance with superb trick riding exhibition along with a comical routine where she roman rides two miles over high jumps, dressed as Raggedy Ann.

The Arago Riders 4-H Horse Club will set pivots each night of the rodeo and ride in the parade. The club was formed four months ago of students in the Deport, Detroit, Bogata, Clarksville and Fulbright areas under the leadership of Sammy and Bettye Woodall and Luke and Dee Crayton.

The Bogata Rodeo is a Dodge Series Rodeo and is sanctioned by the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association. The Dodge Series will conclude in October with the awards presentation at the 1985 C.R.R.A. Finals Rodeo in Ft. Smith, AR. Currently leading the Dodge Series All-Around category is Mike Esquibell of Owasso, OK who has collected 58 1/2 points in the bareback riding and saddle bronc riding. He is followed by Gary Asbill of Sallisaw, OK who has accumulated 34 points in steer wrestling and team roping.

Entries for the Bogata rodeo will be open Saturday and Sunday, June 22 and 23 by calling 918/836-8677 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Producer for the Bogata rodeo is the Wing Ranch Rodeo Company, home based rodeo contracting company, owned by Jerald and Joan Smith.

The Frontier Day promises to be bigger and better than ever before. Saturday, June 29 will begin with a free pancake breakfast at 7 a.m. on Main Street in Bogata. At 9 a.m. a women's nail driving contest will take place followed by a three-legged sack race at 9:30. At 10 a.m. the Tug-Of-War will begin, followed by an Egg Toss at 10:30 and horseshoes and washers preliminaries at 11 a.m. Noon entertainment will accompany the lunch break. Beginning at 1 sharp, horseshoes and washers finals will begin, with tobacco spitting at 1:30, watermelon eating at 1:45. Two o'clock will see the turtle auction and the turtle race will begin at 2:30.

All contest decisions made by the Frontier Day judges will be final.

A registration booth for all contests will be located at the dunking booth. You must be registered within thirty minutes of the start of each contest.

Entries are needed in the Tug-Of-War. There will be a limit of 10 people and 2,000 lbs. per team. Anyone or any organization interested in competing is asked to call Regan Bell at your earliest convenience, in order that the roster can be advertised in next week's paper.

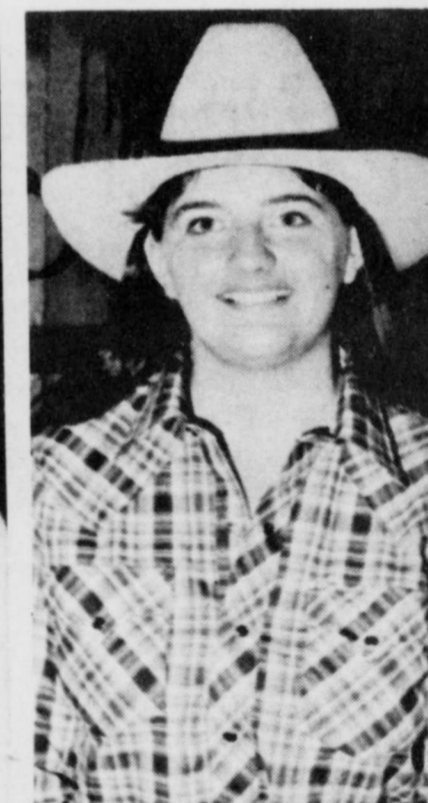

Workshop On Collecting Local History

With a mini-grant from the Texas Committee for the Humanities, a state program for the Humanities, Paris Junior College will sponsor a workshop Friday, June 28 on "Caring for Your Community's Past: Collecting and Preserving Local History." The workshop will be open to the public free of charge, said Daisy Harvill, director of the Aikin Regional Archives at PJC.
Dr. David J. Murrach, director of the Southwest Collection of Texas Tech University in Lubbock, will present the workshop from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. that day in the Alford Center. Reservations should be made by calling Mrs. Harvill at 784-9411, by June 26.
In the workshop, Dr. Murrach will outline the many types of historical papers that a collector may save to preserve the history of a particular family, town or region, and suggest ways in which collectors may organize, care for and preserve their collections.

For the past 13 years, Dr. Murrach has been actively involved in the development and administration of a major local and regional historical collection. He is associate director of libraries for Special Collections and is an historian and has written or edited three books and more than 20 journal and newspaper articles related to the history of the American Southwest.
The workshop on collecting and preserving local history is part of a PJC project, "Caring for the Past of the Red River Valley," cosponsored by the Sesquicentennial Committee of Paris. Other project activities include an oral history workshop scheduled on September 14.

The Hammonds, Doing What They Like Best

John and Debbie Hammond moved to Cuthand eight years ago. They moved from Dallas to the country because of their love for the outdoors and for animals in general. They love it more than ever now. John and Debbie have two daughters, Kristin, age 11, and Julie, age 9. The girls take an active part in the three acre operation that sometimes seems like a cross between a farm and a zoo. At present the family have a flock of ducks, including several ducklings, forty or fifty chickens of just about every variety imaginable, doves, five dogs, twenty-five cats, and a few odds and ends thrown in. By the way, anyone wanting a kitten can find one at the Hammonds'. Any size, shape or color, ranging from vibrant yellow to black, and they are all free!!!!

The animals didn't get it...but I'm doing what I want to do". Any stray, any homeless animal, can find a home with the Hammonds. John is an expert carpenter. He can do anything from building cabinets to leveling a house. He is old fashioned...he takes pride in his work. When the couple purchased the place eight years ago, it was, literally, just a shack. They went back to Dallas after about a year, discouraged after two fires and endless hours of working to put in new windows, siding, insulation, plumbing. But, when spring came they couldn't stand the city any longer, and back they came. This time, they stayed, and Debbie says she is so happy they did. Do the girls like it? Yes and no. The oldest girl love it very much. The

younger one, who really doesn't remember the city, thinks she would like city life. "In Dallas", Debbie smiles, "we always had trouble trying to keep our pets around the close neighbors. Here we can have what we want." One dog, a Treeing Walker Hound, is blind in one eye, and limps because of a pin in a hind leg. It doesn't keep her from being a favorite part of the Hammond family. A tiny kitten comes out from the barn, mewling for its bottle. The mother is dead, and Debbie and the girls matter-of-factly take on the task of bottle raising it. It is life according to the regular routine for the Hammonds...people who love animals, the land, the country, and, obviously, one another. They are a delightful family, and their kindness to animals reveals much about them.

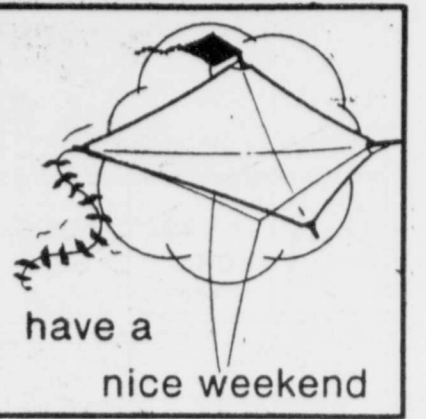
Car Trouble!

One year, I think it was about 1920, farmers made a pretty good cotton crop and sold it at a pretty good price. Dad thought it would be a good time to swap for a new automobile, so one Saturday morning he crooked up the old car and headed for Paris with trading on his mind. He let Osie and I go along. We were in Paris all day loosing at Fords, Saxons, Dorts, Stars and Chevrolets. It was late in the afternoon when we started home. There were no paved highways at that time and the road from Paris to Deport was mostly blackland and rutted, but it was dry and passable. We were cruising along at about 20 miles per hour, enjoying the smell of new car paint when we hit high center between the-ruts. It didn't stop the car, but the noise it made sounded like a pig hung under a gate. It was squealing and squawking and wouldn't stop. We were near Pattonville, so we squawked up to a blacksmith shop and stopped. Before the car came to a halt, Osie jumped out and another little boy who was about his age jumped on him. Osie always welcomed a fight, and before we realized what was going on, they were rolling and tumbling in the road, pulling hair and gouging eyes. Dad pulled them apart, then told the blacksmith about the car's squealing problem. The blacksmith soon located the trouble, and removed the dust pan from under the car. The high center in the road had pushed it up against the exposed flywheel and the gear teeth that mesh with the starter pinion, were rubbing against the bottom of the pan. After the problem was corrected, we got back into the car and continued on home.
