ISSUES ORDER THAT MARINES WILL FIRE

(By Associated Press)
MANAGUA, Nicaragua, March 7.—United States marines were enroute today to Matagalpa to prevent fighting there between the Liberal and Conservative factions.

Major H. G. Bartlett, in charge of the contingent, made known that a note would be sent General Moncada, chief of the Liberal military forces, informing him that if the Liberals should attack Matagalpa, that they would be fired on as the marines were being sent for the express purpose of preventing combats that might jeopardize the lives and interests of Americans.

PARTY LEAVES TO ATTEND FT. WORTH STOCK SHOW

NEW CYCLONE HITS ISLAND

ST. DENIS, Reunion Island, March 7.—A new cyclone, of great intensity, following that of last Thursday, was menacing this island today.

It was feared that the new cyclone had swept over the island of Madagascar, where there were many deaths and extensive property damage in last week's storm.

FOUR MEN PAY LIFE PENALTY

ROCKVIEW, Pa., March 7.—Four men, condemned for killing a policeman in an attempted hold-up last May in Philadelphia, paid the penalty with their lives in the electric chair in the Western state penitentiary here today.

They were: Joseph Curry, 29; Harry Bentley, 23; William Julian, 27; and Frank Doris, 27, all of Philadelphia.

ANOTHER TRIANGLE TRACK MEET HERE ON MARCH 13

EAST DALLAS IS FLOODED

DALLAS, March 7.—Firemen were called today to rescue a number of residents of Southeast Dallas who became stranded in their homes after a heavy rain-fall.

The water rose to a height of 10 feet in some places and drove a number of families to the second floor of their dwellings.

Street car service was paralyzed in East Dallas.

COURT RULES ON PRIMARIES

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, March 7.—Political party primaries in the state, were held by the United States Supreme Court today, to be subject to federal laws.

Deciding in the case from the Texas courts, which held that the states are restricted in their jurisdiction over the primary, and cannot bar votes from the polls on account of race or color.

Negroes who are denied the right to vote in the primary on account of color, the ruling said, have grounds for damages since the constitution guarantees the negro equal right.

The Texas law prohibiting negroes from voting in Democratic primaries therefore is declared void and unconstitutional.

SINCLAIR JURY IS SELECTED

WASHINGTON, March 7.—The selection of a jury in the trial of Harry Sinclair on a charge of contempt in the Senate, in refusing to answer questions in the Teapot Dome investigation, required only a little more than two hours today in the district court here.

Science to Teach Washerwomen Non-Shrink Trick for Woollies



(By Associated Press)
BRADFORD, England, March 7.—Washerwomen put too much "punch" or something to their work and on this account are to be taught how to wash woolies scientifically.

The Bradford Textile Society is behind the innovation. The manufacturers contend that their goods are not at fault, and that when material shrinks it is usually because the washerwomen do not know their business.

Prof. William Davies of the Nottingham Technical College has been engaged by the society to take the lead in a campaign designed to teach washerwomen how to wash properly, by class as well as correspondence courses. He also will show that it is not

necessary, as has been thought for generations, to break or crack one's back over a scrubbing board. The old theories as to washing, avers the professor, are all wrong.

"The time is ripe for establishment of technical education for washerwomen," announced Professor Davies. "Hosiery and manufacturers of woollens often send out instructions with their products, but the housewife and the washerwoman pay no attention to them. Stockings should be subjected to a gentle squeezing action. This does not correspond with the 'punch' that the brawny washerwoman develops on washing day. It is that 'punch' which is responsible for a great deal of the shrinkage of many garments."

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., March 7.—Two men are dead, another is dying and two others are slightly wounded as the result of an attempt by possemen to capture John Bruno, 50, known to be demented, after Bruno had barricaded himself in his home near here yesterday.

The affair ended only when a bullet struck Bruno and mortally wounded him.

Before he fell, Bruno shot and killed Max Miller, 35, and probably fatally wounded John Libertine, 34. He less seriously wounded two others.

ALLEGED HORSE THIEF ESCAPES; SHOT IN ARM

Jim Thomas Johnson, held in the Irion county jail at Sherwood, was shot in the arm Sunday afternoon, about two miles from Sherwood, by a son of the Irion county sheriff, after Johnson had refused to obey the command to stop in his escape from the jail.

Johnson is being held on charges here of horse theft, burglary and theft of a saddle.

The prisoner was in the run-around of the jail when he effected his escape by digging a hole through the wall of the jail. He had been gone only a short time until he was located.

Johnson is back in jail today, in a cell, suffering an injured arm.

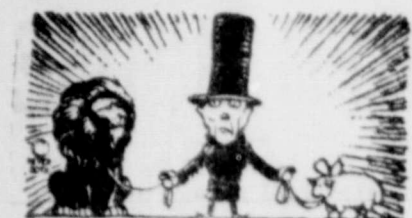

Rail Merger Recalls Empire Builder's Dream;
"Northerns" Follow Path of Lewis and Clark

ST. PAUL, March 7.—Rails that cross and follow the trails over which Lewis and Clark fought their way through trackless wilderness into the Pacific Northwest more than a century ago are comprehended in the proposed merger of the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railroads.

Through forests, along streams and over mountains never before traversed, Lewis and Clark pioneered in the early years of the nineteenth century to blaze a path which opened the great Northwest.

More than half a century after them came James Jerome Hill, rising from a laborer's job to empire builder. Jim Hill visioned the vast Northwest, then an uninhabited waste with miles of untiled prairies blooming with life and commerce. He sent ribbons of steel across the plains and over the Rocky Mountains to the Pacific coast. Two of the railroads he fathered are the Great Northern and the Northern Pacific, which will be joined in a

giant system. Advancing westward from St. Paul and eastward from the coast, track layers, who often found themselves explorers too, met to drive the last spike in the contemplated Northern Pacific line at Gold Creek in Montana's Hellgate Canyon on Sept. 8, 1883, and ten years later, on Jan. 6, 1893, to finish the Great Northern in Washington.

The Lewis and Clark trail, which followed the Missouri River into Montana, is crossed by the Northern Pacific at Mandan, N. D., and Clark's returning route is the railroad's path for a considerable distance. The Great Northern follows the Lewis and Clark trail through much of Montana and runs parallel, for a way, to the homeward course of Lewis. Should the union of the Northerns be carried through the merger will control operated mileage exceeding 28,000, with a \$1,500,000,000 valuation and a capital investment of \$650,000,000—for

although the consolidation does not plan to embrace the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy lines, more than 97 per cent of that road's stock is owned jointly by the two roads.

Northern Pacific mileage is 6,682 and that of the Great Northern 7,092, subsidiary lines bringing the total to 15,550. The combined lines have some 2,700 locomotives, 2,200 passenger cars and 115,000 freight cars, and operate in Wisconsin, Minnesota, both Dakotas, Iowa, Montana, Idaho, Oregon, Washington and the Canadian provinces of Manitoba and British Columbia.

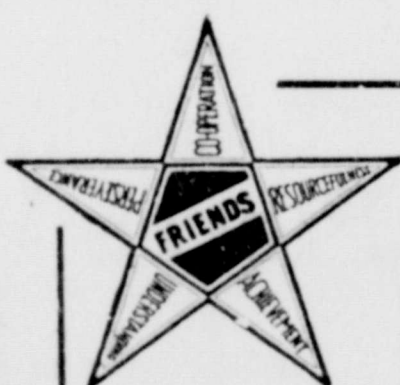

Ballinger High Wins in Triangular Track Meet

The Ballinger high school track team was high in the triangular track meet held here Saturday between Ballinger, San Angelo and Miles teams. Ballinger scored 63 points, San Angelo 61 points, and Miles 11 points.

Henson Alagood was high point man with a score of 20 points. Alagood entered in only four events but he took first place in all of them to win the title. He is expected to win several points for the Bearcat squad in the district meet to be held later this year. He will be remembered as the half-back who intercepted the pass on the Winters high school athletic field on November 19, last year, and scored a touchdown after running about 70 yards. Alagood promises to be a real track man. He was also very good in basketball, having made a letter on the 1927 team.

Other Ballinger men who brought home points were Parrish, Tuckey, Cervenko, Clarke, Dean and Arthur. T. J. Dean was second in high point scoring, making 19 points in his efforts. Dean was not in the football season and played only a little in the basketball season.

Coch Bill Bissett and his San Angelo athletes came to Ballinger with the intentions of winning the meet, but the Bearcats were working like a machine and were on their toes at the start of each event.

Coch Wright will give his men some hard practice in the next few days and just preceding the county meet, and in preparation for the district meet.

Winters athletes were supposed to take part in the meet Saturday but for some reason they were unable to attend.

In 1924, Jean-Marie Bigot, aged 65, was declared the best workman in his trade, for a finely chased iron church door. The ring of the forge is heard night and day from the basement smithy in his home close to Paris. During the day he executes orders for skilled iron-work. At night he hammers away at whatever pleases him.

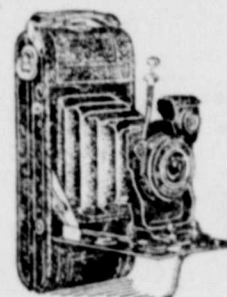
