Hart Basketballers Win In Hale Center Tourney

Hart's girls team won two of three games and the Longhorns dropped two of three in the Hale Center basketball tournament last week.

The girls lost their opener to Happy, 62-31, but came back to beat Petersburg, 42-37, and Anton, 43-17.

Connie Bailey had 15 points in the first game, 11 against Anton, and 16 against Petersburg. Connie Popejoy got nine against Happy, and eight against Anton. Jo Sanders picked up six against Happy, 13 against Anton and 13 against Petersburg. Connie Bowden got 13 against Petersburg and five against Anton.

The boys beat Cotton Center, 57-37, but lost to Hale Center, 39-30 and Ralls, 81-46.

Gary Heller had 24 against Cotton Center, while Billy Farris picked up 23 points. Carl Ward hit for 13 against Hale Center, while Farris added nine. Farris led scorers in the Ralls game with 22.

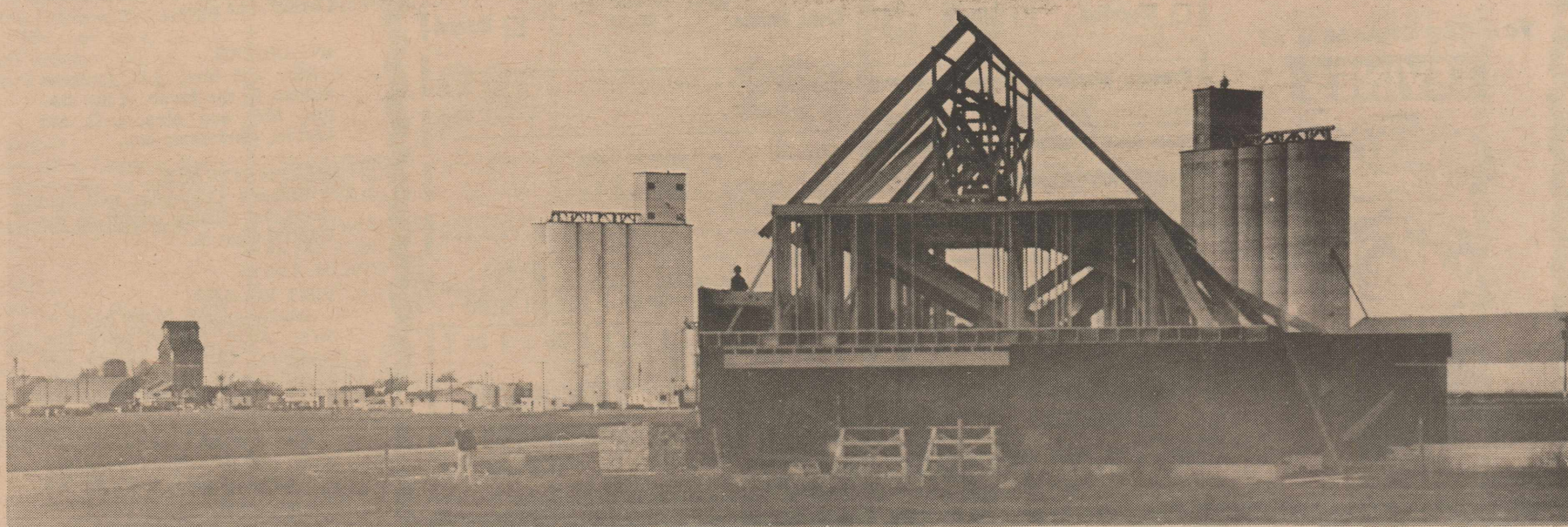

RECIPE OF WEEK

SAM HOUSTON WHITE CAKE
1/4 c. of butter or margarine
2 c. of white or 2 1/2 c. brown sugar

1/2 c. butter milk
1/2 c. warm water
3 c. sifted flour (I use Everlight)
3 tsp. baking powder and 1 tsp. soda

6 egg whites beaten until stiff but not dry
1 tsp. lemon and 1 of almond extract

Cream butter or margarine until soft and light, add your sugar now, white or brown, gradually and continue creaming for five minutes to incorporate as much air as possible. Mix flour and baking powder and sift three times. Add extract to milk and water. Add flour alternately with liquid to creamed mixture beating with mixture. After each addition, beat egg whites until stiff but not dry and fold immediately into batter blending thoroughly but quickly. Avoid over beating. Put batter into three greased and floured 9 inch layer cake pans. Bake in moderately hot oven 375 degrees. Cool five minutes and remove from pans onto wire rack. Use your favorite frosting. My choice is:

COCOANUT FROSTING

1 3/4 c. of white sugar
2/3 c. cold water
2 egg whites
1 tsp. vanilla
1 can med. size cocoanut

Cook sugar and water until it spins a long thread, 240 to 242. Beat egg whites two minutes at No. 8 speed until stiff. Continue beating while pouring syrup over egg whites. Gradua-

lly add vanilla and continue beating until thick enough to spread. Spread on cake and sprinkle cocoanut on top while still soft. Enough for top and sides of 2 or 3 layer stack cake.
