Construction is started on new facility

It is beginning to get busy around town as work has started on a new Chevron convenience store on the corner of N. Highway 208 and the I-20 service road. Bob Parks of Parks Fuels of Big Spring, said the 2,000-plus sq. ft. convenience store will open around May 1 and would employ six people. Mike Dennis, spokesman for McCormick Marketing in Snyder, said Friday that his company has plans for a new complex where the present Phillips 66 station is now located on the south service road. Dennis said plans are to build a "very, very nice complex that would draw attention to Colorado City as a potential stop-off point for travellers on the Interstate as well as on Hwy. 208." He said a minimum of three businesses, including a major oil company, would be located in the complex and he estimated the total work force as between 30 and 40. Architects are currently working on a design that would meet the design standards of the firms involved. "We are tremendously excited about this project," said Dennis. "This will be a project that will attract national attention to Colorado City because of the uniqueness of it." Dennis stated that more details, including the firms to locate here, would be announced "just as soon as all the paperwork can get done, and believe me, there is a lot of it in a project of this magnitude and cost."

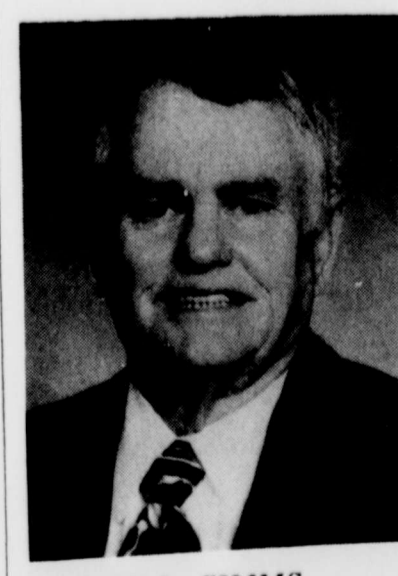

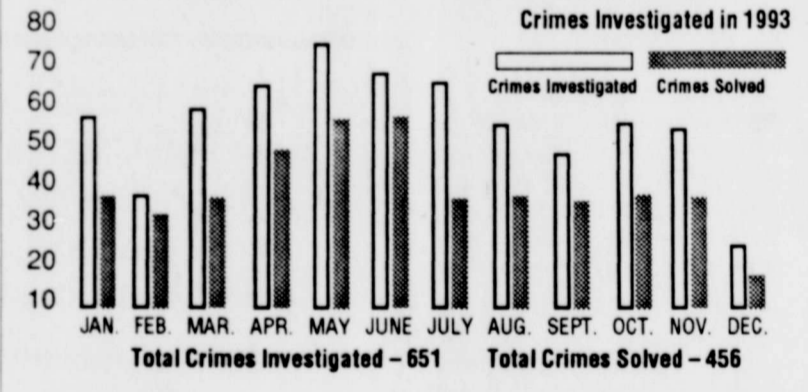
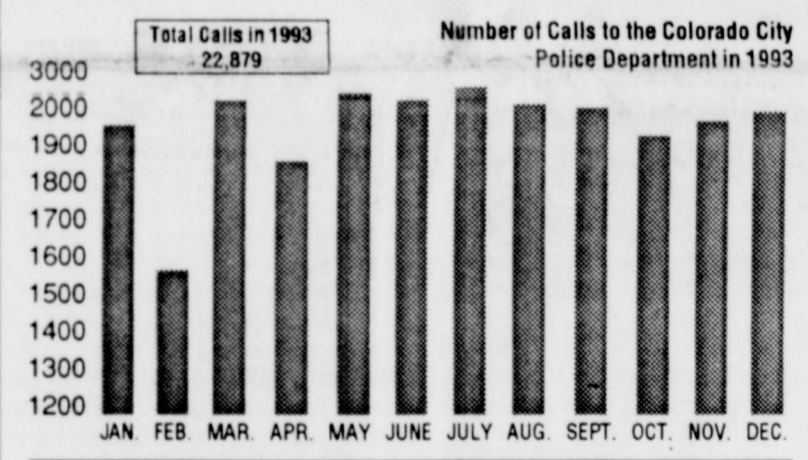
expected shortly on a new facility to be built where the present Phillips 66 station currently is operating on the south service road. That building will be razed for an operation that will employ a minimum of 30 people.

Bill Sims has announced his re-election bid

Senator Bill Sims, D-Point Rock, recently announced his candidacy for Texas Senate District 24. He was first elected a state senator in 1983 and was voted President Pro Tempore of the Texas Senate in 1992. "The people of the 24th District, particularly those involved with agriculture, face many new challenges as the role of the federal government changes and trade with Mexico grows more important," Sims said. "Crime prevention and increased law enforcement also is a major concern within the district. These issues need strong, experienced leadership in state government. I can continue to provide that leadership." As chairman of the Natural Resources Committee, Sims is deeply involved in the debate over water and landowner rights. He also is a member of the Finance and Criminal Justice committees and plays a key role in shaping policies that affect Colorado City, the 24th District, Texas and the nation. He also was elected chairman of the Legislative Natural Resources Board, a legislative body charged with oversight and review

He added that in comparing Colorado City to surrounding communities, it is a comparatively safe place to live and do business in. Montgomery summed up the report by stating "with continued community support, Colorado City will be one of the best places in Texas to live."

New stickers no problem, says Burt

Texas has introduced a new auto registration sticker that is a deterrent to theft. Just peel it and stick it inside your windshield above the inspection sticker. Thieves will miss that easy access sticker on the back license plate but you won't, according to the State Department of Transportation. Mitchell County Tax-Assessor Mike Burt said no one has reported any problems to him concerning the new system. "They said we would probably have someone try to pull it off once it was stuck down on the windshield or try to put it on their license plates but so far they haven't" said Burt. With the new registration sticker inside the windshield, thieves stay away and the driver can see the registration every day. The windshield sticker saves money, too. In 1992 it cost Texans \$3 million to replace vehicle registration stickers. The department estimates that 60 percent of the replacements issued are the result of theft. Several hundred Texans will now save time and avoid aggravation by not having to replace stolen stickers. The sticker is also easy to remove next year. No scrapers are required. When the sticker is removed, the word "void" appears. The stickers should be removed each year and should not be lined up across the windshield. The sticker will also reduce frustration for you. The owner will know when the sticker has expired

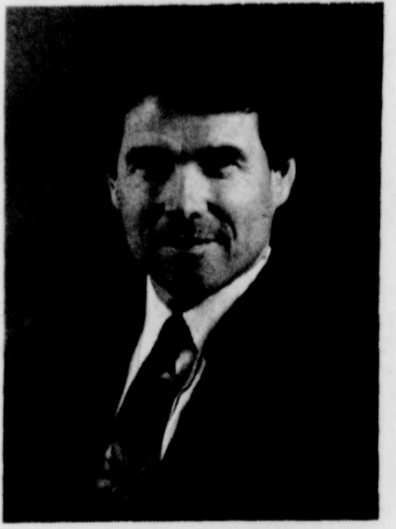
Texas Agriculture Commissioner Rick Perry to address local Chamber banquet

Stubblefield is selected as chair for a three county underground water district

David Stubblefield has been elected as temporary chairman of the Rolling Plains Underground Water District and will serve until permanent officers are elected. This action took place in a Tuesday night meeting in Snyder. The three counties studying implementation of the Rolling Plains Underground Water Conservation District are Scurry, Borden and Mitchell. Officials say the purpose of this district or any other water district is to protect the quality of the water in the area underground water table and to insure landowners' rights to the water.

Brent Murphy, Borden County, will serve as vice chairman and Bill Eiland, of Scurry County, will be the secretary.

Snyder National Bank was chosen as the depository for the district and the directors also decided that Rt. 1, Box 44, Colorado City, will be the district's address.

The three-member board discussed the need for more information about implementing an underground water district. They decided to let Stubblefield contact a representative from another district to attend their next meeting, slated for Tuesday, Feb. 8, at 7 p.m. at the West Texas State Bank in Snyder. Stubblefield has stated in the past that it is the concern of the landowners that if these three counties do not form their own water district and elect their own directors then the state will. If that happens, then the landowners will have no say in who is appointed as directors of the tax base limits or assessments to support the district.

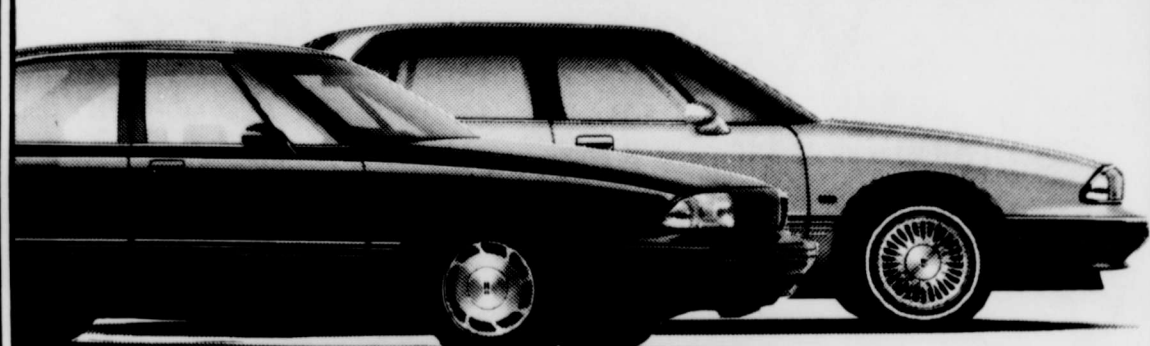

Names sought of men who served in Navy and Coast Guard in WWII

We're looking for over 200,000 men who served in the U.S. Navy or Coast Guard during World War II in the Navy Amphibious forces, on landing ships or on the many support ships.

The largest landing craft, the Landing Ship, Tank (LST), was about 327 feet long and fifty feet wide. The crews quickly named them Large, Slow Targets. They were not fast but they were without equal on invasions.

An LST rode high in the water,

had a flat bottom, carried a crew of about 110 men and a cargo of some 300 fighting men and equipment. They would also spend weeks ferrying supplies to the troops and have often been compared to huge floating bathtubs with decks.

LSTs were home to more than 200,000 sailors during World War II. The Navy built more than 1,000 and it is estimated that an average of 200 men spent part of their Navy time on each LST.

We need to reach those men,

especially those in Texas. They need to know there is now an

organization for those who served in the Navy amphibious forces. It is the Texas Chapter of the U.S. LST Association and we hold reunions twice a year in different parts of Texas.

Firefighters will battle 14,000 fires

If recent trends continue, Texas fire fighters can expect to battle nearly 14,000 fires during January and February this year. Four out of every ten of these fires will be outdoors.

"Texas faces a unique outdoor fire threat during winter," said Michael E. Hines, executive director of the Texas Commission on Fire Protection. "Dry, dormant plants provide the fuel and high winds fan the flames. A tossed match or a smoldering cigarette in these conditions can spell disaster."

In January and February of 1992 (the most recent year for which complete fire statistics are available), almost 5,500 outdoor fires occurred across the state. Most of the fires were in empty fields and vacant lots and along roads and highways. Seven civilians and six fire fighters suffered injuries in these fires.

In their reports to the Texas Fire Incident Reporting System, fire departments indicated that in fires for which the cause was known, more than half were either deliberately set or had suspicious origins.

The departments attributed an additional one-third of outdoor fires to carelessness or misuse of fire, including 375 fires caused by improper handling of cigarettes and other smoking materials.

Children playing with fire started almost 200 outdoor fires in the same time period. High winds caused 31 fires and 24 fires thought to be extinguished rekindled themselves.

The Texas Commission on Fire Protection would like to ask everyone to help minimize the threat of outdoor fires this winter. The commission recommends these precautions:

Store matches and lighters out of children's reach.

If you smoke in the car use your ashtray. Don't toss cigarette butts out the window.

Inspect electric and gas-powered outdoor tools frequently and follow safety precautions.

Take extra care with barbecues

grills and campfires. Never leave outdoor fires unattended. Pour water on the embers and check to make sure that ashes have completely cooled before leaving.
