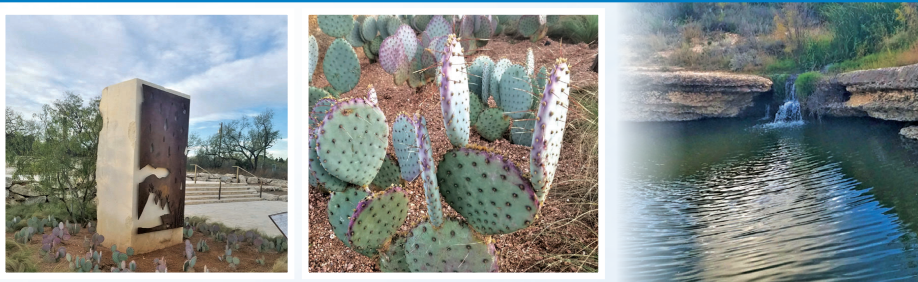

**Council approves BSHA support resolution Tuesday**

During its meeting Tuesday evening, the Big Spring City Council unanimously approved a resolution supporting the Big Spring Housing Authority and opposing a plan of transferring administration of the Local Housing Choice Voucher Program to the Abilene Housing Authority.

"Earlier on, there had been a resolution passed by the then-board of the Housing Authority effectively indicating a desire to transfer administration of the Local Housing Voucher Program from Big Spring to Abilene," said Big

Spring Mayor Robert Moore. "In anticipation of that, I contacted Abilene, the Housing Authority there, and they had indicated at the time that they were not receptive to agreeing to a transfer of those vouchers as long as the mayor and City Council of Big Spring were in opposition to that. Frankly, at that time, the mayor was not in opposition to it; at this time, the mayor is in opposition to it. I just thought it safe just to put it on the record that the City Council of the city of Big Spring, if we do concur, indicate that we wish the Big Spring Housing Authority to remain a functioning entity serving our community."

According to the resolution, the program, which has been in place since 1998, serves about 230 recipients in

Big Spring and surrounding communities.

"The Big Spring City Council objects to transferring the Housing Choice Voucher Program administered by the Big Spring Housing Authority to another jurisdiction. It is the position of the City Council that moving the program would create undue hardships on existing program recipients and divert funds used for low-income housing in Big Spring," the

resolution states.

At the start of the meeting following the call to order, invocation and pledges to the U.S. and Texas flags, John Scott addressed the council during the Public Comments portion of the meeting regarding Monday's Public Hearing in which Mayor Moore removed Linda Blankenburg and Patricia Nabors from the BSHA board of

commissioners. Scott said that a statement was made during the hearing that Housing Authority recipients were required to travel to the Housing Authority office to receive a voucher.

"As a former auditor, I will tell you that that practice would be a horrid control and invitation for fraud. The vouchers are mailed directly to the landlord. They're not picked up by the tenants," Scott said. "The Housing Authority would like to be able to do direct deposit like some larger institutions do, but that cost has been reviewed and at this time is more than what you can save by not having to pay the postage."

Other speakers during the public comments portion of the meeting included Scott Hart, Mark Lindsey, Scott Emerson and Derek Wash.

Hart represented the Journey Home Veterans Center, who said the center is an outreach for homelessness in the community, and asked the council to consider adding homeless shelters to the list of permitted uses for Heavy Commercial (HC), Light Industrial (LI) and Heavy Industrial (HI) districts in the city.

Lindsey spoke about out-of-order fire hydrants in his neighborhood, asking when the plastic-wrapped hydrants might be repaired to ensure availability of water for fire emergencies. Big Spring Fire Chief Craig Ferguson indicated that the Fire Department keeps a list of non-functional fire hydrants, and that they're repaired each autumn. He said the department will go out for bids on this year's repairs next week.

Emerson urged the council to form a "Master Plan Committee" to review progress on the city's current master plan.

"I think it was, like, seven or eight years ago," he said, commenting on the creation of the current master plan. "What I don't know is, how far along we've progressed on the master plan."

Wash is president of the Howard County Fair Association. He asked the council to consider refusing to permit local carnivals near in time to the County Fair, because carnivals are very important to the revenue-generating function of the fair.

"It (carnivals) is just what drives the revenue of the Fair Association, and in recent years, in lieu of an event that I think is important to the community, for a quick buck, either the Chamber of Commerce or other entities have allowed carnivals to come in within two or three weeks of our carnival at the fair, and put them on at free places like out by the ball fields on the interstate. So when they do that, those carnivals come in and say, 'Look, we can just call them and they'll let us have it out there

for a smaller portion, so we won't come three weeks later whenever it's time for the fair."

In other business, the council held public hearings on submission of an application to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department for a 2023 Local Park Fund; and on consideration of a zone change of about 3 acres at 3910 S. Service road from Agricultural (A) to Heavy Commercial (HC). No one spoke at either hearing.

City Manager Todd Darden gave his report, including a reminder regarding the District 6 Large Item Pickup scheduled June 15; a planned mosquito spraying via airplane covering about 6,000 acres locally; and an update on the Water Line Replacement Program.

The Council approved nine items on the meeting's Consent Agenda, including approval of city council minutes of the May 24 regular meeting; and final reading of four resolutions and four ordinances.

The approved resolutions include: Vesting negotiating authority on behalf of the city for specific contracts and future contracts in the city manager or his designee, abolishing the part of the Big Spring Personnel Policies on entitled meetings with council and staff, reauthorizing tax abatement guidelines and criteria, and suspending the June 17 effective date of Oncor Electric Delivery Company's requested rate change to allow the city time to study the request and to establish reasonable rates. According to the meeting's agenda, the complete application of Oncor rate changes is available for review in the City Secretary's office.

The approved ordinances include: Charging the city manager with the responsibility of establishing City Council agendas; granting a partial exemption from ad valorem taxes for the homestead of adults for 2022; annexing 5.08 acres in N/2 Sec. 8, Blk. 32, T-1-S, T&P RR Co. Survey; and defining "retiree" and "retirees" as the term applies to Comanche Trail Golf Course green fees to refer to retired city workers who retired from the City of Big Spring and spent at least 20 years working for the City of Big Spring.

The council approved vouchers, including \$488,947.03 for May 26, \$828,577.59 for June 2 and \$704,174.18 for June 10, and Drafts and Manual Checks in the amount of \$133,239.06. An additional \$15,547.83 of Drafts and Manual Checks were tabled to give Councilman Troy Tompkins (District 5) additional time to review them.

The council unanimously approved moving its depository bank account from PNC Bank to Prosperity Bank.

In New Business, the council acknowledged receipt of the Zoning Board of Adjustment's minutes from its Nov. 18, 2021, meeting.

The council took unanimously approved the rezoning of 3910 S. Service Road, as discussed in the public hearing, and the resolution in support of the Big Spring Housing Authority and opposing sending its vouchers to the Abilene Housing Authority, as discussed previously.

The council approved expenditure of about \$1 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to retrofit the sludge removal equipment and processes at the Water Treatment Plant. The city currently pays approximately \$200,000 per year to hire an outside company to perform sludge removal. Public Works Director Shane Bowles said the plan would save the city about \$200,000 each year over the equipment's 20-year lifespan.

The city approved executing a lease with Partee Aviation LLC. According to Airport Director Mike Feeley, Partee Aviation will build a 10,000-square-foot hangar on the north side of the Airpark. The company will lease approximately 20,000 square feet of land from the city at 19 cents per square foot yearly. The company will have the right to reassign the lease to another lessee with City Council approval should its owners decide to vacate the premises before the end of the 30-year lease. The company will also have two options to renew the lease for five years each.

The council heard a non-action proposal from Councilman Nick Ornelas (District 1) regarding allocation of money to various organizations in the city.

"During budget season last year, I asked for us to do a better process for us to do allocate those moneys to different organizations and being fair, and opening it up to different organizations and 501(c)3s. There was supposed to be a meeting, and it never happened, so I just put it on the agenda to get y'all's opinions and thoughts. I'm certainly not opposed to any of the organizations that we currently give to, but I think to be fair we need to open it up to everyone, kind of do like a lottery, have where if you're given money that year, you have to wait for two years and give everyone the opportunity."

Scott Emerson addressed the the council, saying that tax dollars should not be spent on 501(c)3s, allowing citizens to keep more of their tax dollars and personally donate to such organizations if they desire.

Moore announced that he had appointed five new members to fill the empty Big Spring Housing Authority Board of Commissioners, including John Scott, Danielle Castillo, T.J. Steward, Scott Emerson, and Abigail Chavez.

Council members also approved by acclimation the appointment of Nati Saldivar to the Zoning Board of Adjustments. Saldivar was appointed by Councilman Maury Smith (District 6).

### Coahoma's Vance Ott set to compete at US Paralympic National Track and Field Meet

Coahoma's Vance Ott is set to compete on one of the biggest stages of his young career. Ott, a two-time defending state champion in the 100m and 400m wheelchair events, will compete against some of the top paralympic athletes in the country and world at the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field National Championships. The national meet will begin on Thursday June 16 and end Saturday June 18, taking place at Ansin Complex in Miramar, FL.

Vance will be competing in the 800m, 400m, and 100m wheelchair events under the T54 classification over the course of the three days. Ott earned the opportunity to compete with some of the nation and worlds best by improving his overall times and meeting the qualifying standards in each event. To qualify paralympic athletes must meet the national qualifying time standards set forth by the World Paralympic Association.

Ott, who recently graduated from Coahoma High School last month, will get the opportunity to compete against some of best paralympic athletes in the U.S. as well as some of his future Wildcat teammates. Back in February, Ott signed his official letter of intent to continue his track and field career at the University of Arizona. Not only is he going to be competing and showing his future teammates what he's capable of, he'll also get to race one of the best paralympic athletes in the world!

23-year-old Daniel Romanchuk from Mount Airy, Md., is one of the best of the best. Romanchuk is a two-time Paralympian who has

earned both a gold and bronze medal in the 2021 Paralympics in Tokyo. Romanchuk also a world class marathon runner claiming multiple wins throughout his career. Romanchuk is also the current world record holder in the 800m.

With elite competition facing Ott, its clear to see that he will be heading into these races as the huge underdog. That won't matter to Ott. If you have ever had the great opportunity to meet and watch this young man then you know what I'm talking about. His work ethic and drive for success are unmatched and that is what makes this young man so special. In fact, most of his now former coaches and peers will be the first to tell you he's a natural born leader who won't settle for anything less than being the best. Ott, who will be the youngest athlete in his event, will be looking to medal in the three events he's racing in, but more importantly will try to earn a spot on the U.S. National team as well.

"I'm just so blessed to have been given the opportunity to go down here and race and possibly make Team USA," Ott said about heading to the U.S. National meet. When asked how he feels about competing against some of the best in the country and world, Ott added, "We will see how it goes. I'm an underdog, but with God on my side, I'm a winner already. Even if I don't win the competition, I've got the support of my parents and community back home." Congratulations to Vance Ott for qualifying to compete at the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field National Championships, and good luck in all of your races. We'll be cheering you on!!

### Tucker goes deep as Astros rally in 8th to beat Rangers 4-3

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Jose Altuve took off toward home plate hoping to get into a rundown so Houston could have runners at second and third. Things worked out even better than that in a four-run winning rally in the eighth inning.

"We're at a lull in the action ... then all of a sudden, it just happened," Astros manager Dusty Baker said. "That was quick."

Kyle Tucker extended his career-best hitting streak to 13 games with a two-run homer that capped Houston's four-run outburst over only nine pitches, and the AL West-leading Astros beat the Texas Rangers 4-3 on Tuesday night.

Altuve and Michael Brantley opened the eighth with consecutive singles before Alex Bregman hit a hard grounder at shortstop Corey Seager, who threw to the plate instead of trying to start a double play. Altuve was caught in the baseline, but scored the first run when rookie third baseman Ezequiel Duran couldn't handle catcher Sam Huff's throw.

"Probably," Texas manager Chris Woodward said, when asked if Seager should have gone for the double play instead.

"He asked me about it and admitted that he probably should have done that. Hindsight's 20/20. He's being aggressive. He's trying to make a play. So it's hard to fault him for that," Woodward said. "Unfor-

tunately it didn't work out for us, but we've still got to execute the play and get an out."

Rangers reliever John King (1-3) retired only one of the five batters he faced. That was an RBI groundout by slugger Yordan Álvarez on the pitch after the botched rundown — and a pitch before Tucker's 12th homer of the season.

"I'm glad the way we did it and happy that we won the game," Altuve said.

"That might be the victory of the year," Baker said. "I can't remember a more exciting finish than that. Boy, we needed that badly."

The Astros had lost four of their previous five games, including the series opener when Texas had a three-run eighth for a 5-3 win. The Rangers had their three-game winning streak snapped, missing a chance to match their longest this season.

"That was a frustrating one," Woodward said.

Bryan Abreu (4-0), the first of three Astros relievers, threw a scoreless seventh. Ryan Pressly worked the ninth for his 12th save in 14th chances.

The Rangers went ahead 3-0 in the fourth on a two-run homer by Nathaniel Lowe, who pulled a pitch that landed 416 feet away from the plate in the Texas bullpen in right-center in the fourth inning. It was his eighth homer overall, his seventh in his last 22 games.

Duran, who had never played above Double-A before his big league debut June 4, led off the third with an infield single and scored on Marcus

Semien's two-out single.

#### FOR STARTERS

Dane Dunning pitched six scoreless innings for the Rangers, but is still winless in his last eight starts. The right-hander struck out four and walked four while allowing only two hits, both doubles.

Astros righty José Urquidy struck out four without a walk while allowing three runs over six innings.

#### TRAINER'S ROOM

Astros: Rookie SS Jeremy Peña returned to Houston to be evaluated by team doctors a day after he got hurt falling forward onto the turf when going after a bloop hit in in the third inning Monday night. Peña stayed in that game after getting checked out and flexing his left hand.

Baker said the injury wasn't the left wrist that was repaired in surgery last year, but didn't elaborate.

He said the Astros were getting a second opinion after Peña was initially evaluated by Rangers doctors. ... Baker said RHP Lance McCullers had a "very encouraging" bullpen session that included hitting 90 mph. McCullers still hasn't thrown any breaking balls in his recovery from an arm injury in last year's American League Division Series.

Rangers: CF Eli White had surgery in which two screws were inserted into his fractured right wrist. He is not expected to resume baseball activities for 6-8 weeks.

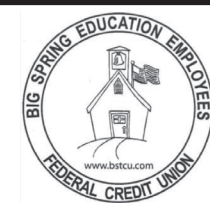

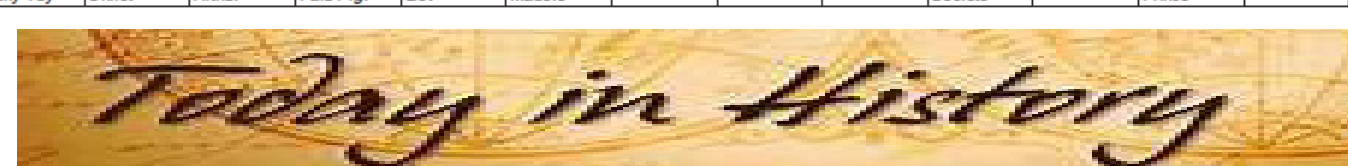

**Today's Highlight in History:**

On June 16, 1858, accepting the Illinois Republican Party's nomination for the U.S. Senate, Abraham Lincoln said the slavery issue had to be resolved, declaring, "A house divided against itself cannot stand."

**On this date:**

In 1903, Ford Motor Co. was incorporated.

In 1933, the National Industrial Recovery Act became law with President Franklin D. Roosevelt's signature. (The Act was later struck down by the U.S. Supreme Court.) The Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. was founded as President Roosevelt signed the Banking Act of 1933.

after battling cancer.

In 1977, Soviet Communist Party General Secretary Leonid Brezhnev was named president, becoming the first person to hold both posts simultaneously.

In 1978, President Jimmy Carter and Panamanian leader Omar Torrijos (toh-REE'-ohs) signed the instruments of ratification for the Panama Canal treaties during a ceremony in Panama City.

In 1999, Thabo Mbeki (TAH'-boh um-BEH'-kee) took the oath as president of South Africa, succeeding Nelson Mandela.

In 2011, U.S. Rep. Anthony Weiner, D-N.Y., announced his resignation from Congress, bowing to the furor caused by his sexually charged online dalliances with a former porn performer and other women. Osama bin Laden's longtime second-in-command, Ayman al-Zawahri (AY'-muhn ahl-ZWAH'-ree), took control of al-Qaida.

In 2015, real estate mogul Donald Trump launched his successful campaign to become president of the United States with a speech at Trump Tower in Manhattan.

In 2016, President Barack Obama traveled to Orlando, Florida, the scene of a deadly nightclub shooting that claimed 49 victims; the president embraced grieving families and cheered on Democrats' push for new gun control measures. Walt Disney Co. opened Shanghai Disneyland, its first theme park in mainland China.

In 2020, federal authorities announced murder and attempted murder charges against an Air Force sergeant, Steven Carrillo, in the fatal shooting of a federal security officer outside a U.S. courthouse in Oakland, California. (Carrillo, who had ties to the far-right, anti-government "boogaloo" movement, pleaded guilty to a federal murder charge after prosecutors agreed not to seek the death penalty.) A statue of Christopher Columbus that stood in a St. Louis park for 134 years was removed; park officials said it had symbolized a "historical disregard for indigenous peoples."

Ten years ago: Egyptians began going to the polls for a two-day runoff to choose their first freely elected president; Islamist candidate Mohammed Morsi emerged the winner. China launched its most ambitious space mission to date, carrying its first female astronaut, Liu Yang, and two male colleagues on a 13-day mission to an orbiting module that ended safely.

Five years ago: President Donald Trump acknowledged for the first time that he was under federal investigation as part of the expanding probe into Russia's election meddling as he lashed out at a top Justice Department official overseeing the inquiry. A St. Anthony, Minnesota, police officer was acquitted of manslaughter in the fatal shooting of Philando Castile, a Black motorist who had just informed the officer that he was carrying a gun. Former German Chancellor Helmut

Kohl died at his home in Ludwigshafen; he was 87. Actor Stephen Furst, who played naive fraternity pledge Flounder in the hit movie "Animal House," died in Moorpark, California, at age 63.

One year ago: After a three-hour summit in Geneva, President Joe Biden and Russia's Vladimir Putin emerged largely where they started, with deep differences on human rights, cyberattacks, election interference and more. Actor Frank Bonner, best known as salesman Herb Tarlek on the TV series "WKRP in Cincinnati," died at 79.

## Asleep at the switch

West dealer. North-South vulnerable.

The bidding:

Opening lead — nine of diamonds.

The cuebid of an opponent's suit theoretically shows either a void or the ace of that suit, but there are times when the cuebid is used to show a big hand even when the bidder does not have the suit under control. Here is an example of such a case.

North had too good a hand for a simple raise to game after South had freely bid three hearts. The outlook was certainly slamish — North had 19 high-card points — but he had no idea what his partner had in diamonds. He therefore cuebid diamonds to alert South to the possibility of a slam.

But since South had minimum values for his previous bid, he signed off with four hearts. Still not satisfied, North made another try, this time by cuebidding spades. South could now no longer ignore his partner's persistently strong bidding, so he bid four notrump (Blackwood) and continued on to six hearts after North showed three aces.

All this fine bidding came to naught, however, when South bungled the play. West led the nine of diamonds, and South followed low from dummy. This proved to be fatal when East played the deuce on the nine, an obvious request for West to shift to another suit.

Looking at seven spades in his own hand and three in dummy, West had no problem finding a spade shift, and East ruffed to put the slam down one. Had declarer covered the diamond nine with the ten, he would have made the slam.

Actually, after South bid six hearts, East should have made a Lightner double to ask for an unusual opening lead, in which case West's virtually automatic spade lead would have sealed South's fate beyond recall.
