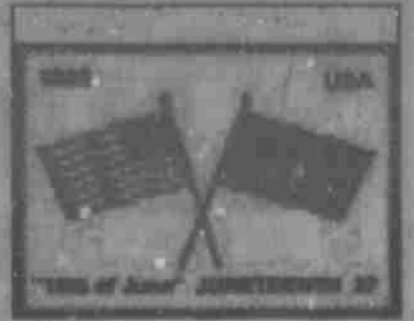


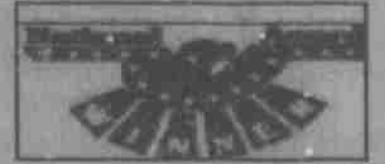

More than sixty Lubbock citizens were present last Sunday evening, February 28, 2010, at The Bridge, 1301 Redbud Avenue.

The group, which divided up in three groups, presented their suggestions as how this effort should proceed. The group agreed to have a project which all could be responsible for happening. A goal of asking all residents of the city of Lubbock to turn on their porch lights on Sunday afternoon, March 7, 2010, beginning at 5:00 p. m.

Gov. Perry Grants Posthumous Pardon for Innocence to Tim Cole

AUSTIN - Gov. Rick Perry today granted a posthumous pardon for innocence to Tim Cole after receiving a recommendation from the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles.

"I have been looking forward to the day I could tell Tim Cole's mother that her son's name has been cleared for a crime he did not commit," Gov. Perry said. "The State of Texas cannot give back the time he spent in prison away from his loved ones, but today I was finally able to tell her we have cleared his name, and hope this brings a measure of peace to his family."

Cole was serving a 25 year sentence for aggravated sexual assault of Michele Jean Murray when he died from an asthma attack in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice on Dec. 2, 1999. DNA testing later proved he was innocent. The Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles voted unanimously to recommend the posthumous pardon for innocence. Additionally, Lubbock County

Criminal District Attorney Matthew Powell and Lubbock Chief of Police Dale Holton have written letters in support of a posthumous pardon. The victim has also supported Tim Cole's family in obtaining his exoneration.

The authority for a governor to grant a posthumous pardon was uncertain until Jan. 7, 2010, when Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott issued an opinion stating that a governor may grant a posthumous pardon.

Mission to the Community (Jonah 1:1-3; 3:1-9) RUNNING AWAY

So Jonah decided to take a slow boat to China, so to speak. He booked passage on a ship headed for Tarshish to get away from God (as if that were possible). Once the mooring lines were released and the ship was underway, Jonah found a dark, quiet place below deck to sleep.

While he snoozed, the Lord sent a storm so violent the ship was in danger of breaking up and going down. The sailors tried everything they could think of to survive the storm—they

even held a prayer rally! Eventually they learned it was Jonah's sin that caused the turmoil and, at his suggestion, they threw him into the angry sea. As soon as Jonah's socks got wet, the storm dissipated.

While the sailors got religion and made sacrifices and promises to the true God, the sinking Jonah, sure of his impending death, thrashed about in the seaweed. Suddenly, he was swallowed by a fish that God had specially modified for the task. For three lonely, dark, and stinky days and nights Jonah sat in that fish's gut. He repented of his

folly, and thanked God for saving him, even if it meant being inside a fish.

At the Lord's command, the fish vomited Jonah onto the beach. Again, the word of the Lord came to Jonah: "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you" (Jonah 3:1). This time, without hesitation, the prophet headed off to Nineveh to preach his sermon of doom.

ANGRY WITH GOD

As a result, a most remarkable thing happened. Rather than the Assyrians shooting the messenger, every Ninevite repented

of his sins and sat around in sackcloth fasting and hoping God would change his mind about the city's destruction. God did.

Jonah left the city very angry with God. The concern that had compelled him to make a run for it in the beginning turned out to be justified. It was just like God to show compassion and drop his threat of destruction when the people repented. There was the rub—Jonah would rather die than see God lavish his grace on despicable Ninevites!

Perhaps hoping the people would backslide, Jonah found a

place on a nearby hill to see what would become of the city. As he sat waiting in the sun, God caused a vine to grow and provide shade for the prophet. The next day, however, God caused the demise of the vine, leaving Jonah to bake in the sun.

This provoked the prophet's anger, as God knew it would, and the Lord took the occasion to point out Jonah's misplaced priorities: "You have been concerned about this vine, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. But Nineveh has more than a hundred and twenty

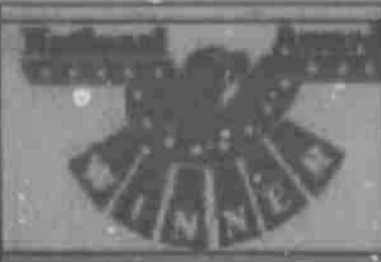

that credit card companies will not be permitted to go onto college campuses and give out freebies and take applications for credit. The law does not prohibit them from setting up shop some place nearby a campus and/or giving out freebies there. Many students got their first taste of cigarettes from those freebies. That is where vigilant parents can come in. They can take action against the pitches.

Many innocent students' credit have been permanently marred by the credit antics of card issuers because the 'only

sign here' applications that were sent to them in the mail; many of them with no idea of the consequences of non-payment for credit. Parents never knew what was taking place and many who found out, filed bankruptcy, another credit negative.

There are many loopholes in the new law. If you are more than 60 days late with a payment, look for an interest rate hike. If your credit card does not have a grace period, you may fall victim to double-cycle billing. Stay within your credit limits unless you opt-in for over

the limit fees. If you do not opt-in to over the limit fees, your credit may be denied. Stay away from those deferred interest balances or the 'No interest for six months' deals unless you are

prepared to pay in full before the expiration date. Otherwise, expect to pay interest retroactively. We must 'get in cinque' and keep a close eye on our money transactions.

February 22, 2010 marked the date that the new credit card legislation went into effect. By now, everyone who has any credit which is backed by any bank has received literature from the bank regarding the new rules. Our government bailed out the banks, but we must be careful that the banks do not bankrupt us.

The new rules were supposed to help individuals who used credit cards. It was designed to end the abusive habits of credit card issuers. It has put into effect one long overdue chapter, the one regarding issuing credit cards to college students and young adults under the age of 21 who have no visible means of paying for the credit they use. Unless a young person under 21 has a means for paying for card purchases, they MUST have a co-signer, preferably a parent who will be held liable for purchases throughout the lifetime of the youngster for all of the purchases made on the card prior to and after age 21, if the young adult keeps the card. In addition, the credit limit for those who secure a card will not be raised without the co-signer's permission.

Coach Mallory Will Be Honored During The Dunbar Reunion

(Editor's Note: When the Dunbar High School All-Class Reunion meets this summer, one of their coaches will be honored and remembered. Here is information about Coach Ernest P. Mallory.)

Mr. Ernest P. Mallory was born in Philadelphia, PA, the only son of three children born to Ike and Carrie Mallory. When Ernest was four, the Mallory family moved to San Diego, CA, where he attended school. He played football, basketball, baseball, and was a high jumper in the track team of San Diego High School. In football Coach Mallory was an offensive end for two years. On the basketball team he was a forward and was chosen all-city, all-coast, and all southern California forward. Coach also played second base and outfield for the baseball team.

Mallory spent one year at San Diego State College and left for the Army where he spent two and one-half years. He returned to San Diego. He played for the Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Corp., Lindburgh Field, and the Convair Dominators. Coach Mallory made the decision to finish his college education at Sam Houston College in Austin, Texas, and received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Mathematics. While at Sam Houston in 1944, he met and married his wife Vernice Norwood. That same year, Coach Mallory received an honorary award for

meritorious service during World War II.

Coach Mallory was a forward for Sam Houston's basketball team. He also played exhibition games and toured with the college team. The team toured during most holidays and summers, which took them through Arkansas, Kentucky, Tennessee, and California.

Coach Mallory joined Omega Psi Phi in 1947.

In 1949, Coach Mallory was offered the position of Physical Education Assistant Coach and he accepted. This was the beginning of a very successful coaching career at Dunbar High School. During his coaching career, his win-loss was 305-54. His team, the Dunbar Panthers, were Texas State Champions in 1953, 1957, 1960, and 1962. The team also earned 5 District Titles.

In 1962 Coach Mallory was named Basketball Coach of the Year. He was chosen by the Quarterback Club of Houston.

Mallory also coached Little League and was a baseball umpire. He played with the Lubbock Negro All-Stars (basketball) and the Lubbock Jets (softball). The Jets took top honors in the State TAAF Negro Softball Tournament.

Coach and Vernice were married for 56 years and had two sons, Ernest II, William Michael (who preceded him in death) and daughters Carrie and Theresa, four grandchildren, Michael, La Vern, Leila, and Ernest III, along
